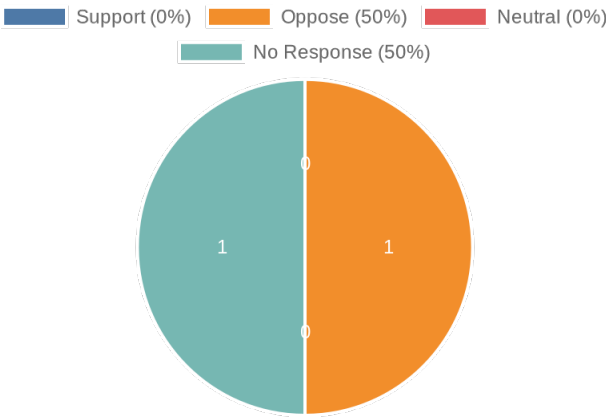

Overall Sentiment

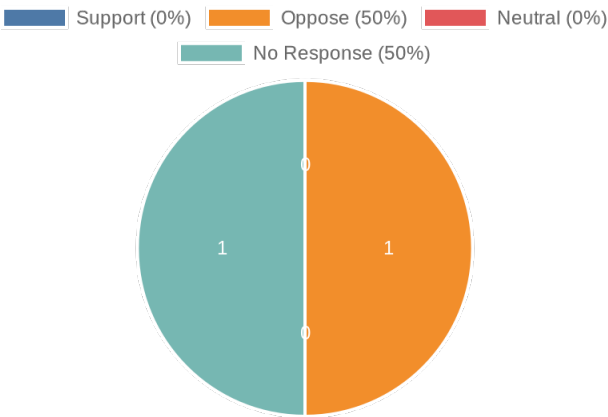

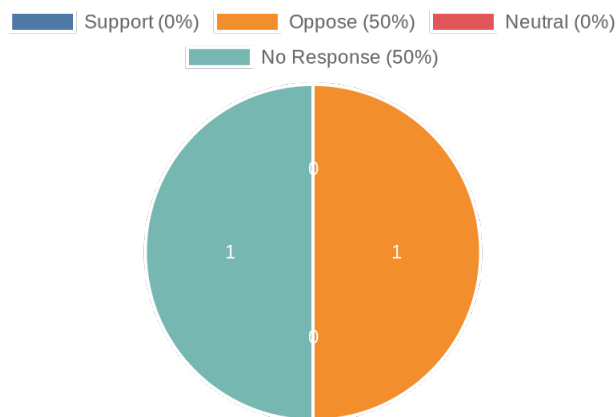

Interesting that this program "Joint Public Delegation – California & British Columbia – Sustainable Urban Development." is held in Denmark by the Danish Foreign Ministry - not the climate-change people the program alludes to.
