UPDATE TO POTENTIAL FEDERAL FUNDING IMPACT TO COUNTY PROGRAMS

With the arrival of a new Presidential Administration and a new majority in Congress, a period of transition and change is occurring. In anticipation of these changes, staff from each County of San Diego (County) Business Group have come together under an Incident Command Structure (ICS) to closely monitor federal actions that may impact federally funded County programs. The February 10, 2025, memorandum to the San Diego County Board of Supervisors (Board) was the first correspondence regarding the state of federal policy changes and identified County programs and revenue sources that could be at risk. Since then, there have been numerous federal actions and information from the Administration is continually changing. While this memorandum captures what we know now, changes to programs, grants and impacts are still possible in response to new information. This is an update to the prior memorandum with the most recent federal actions and resulting potential impacts to County funding and programs that are known at this time. The attached document summarizes federal policy changes and the County programs that could be affected, estimated federal revenue at risk, and identified mitigation efforts. County staff under ICS will continue monitoring changes daily and providing updates to the Board to ensure the County is adaptable and responsive to the needs of our communities across the San Diego region.

Federal Funding Impacts April 2025

Potential Federal Funding Impacts

The County's FY 2024-25 Adopted Budget includes \$1.33 billion in federal funding with \$124 million that comes directly from federal agencies, and the remainder is routed through State and local agencies. The proposed FY 2025-26 budget, which will be released on May 1, 2025, does not assume impacts from federal funding or State funding changes as it is too early to know the full scope of changes. With more than 600 active or pending contracts that rely on federal funding and more than 90% of the County's federal funding flowing through the Health and Human Services Agency, any significant impacts to accessing these federal funds may require collective effort across the enterprise to remediate.

Recognizing that some federal actions are active and others are held up in litigation, anticipating risks is both complicated and challenging as information is rapidly changing. The information contained in this document focuses on updates since the last memorandum on February 10, 2025. It also highlights potential programs at risk and major fiscal impacts to County programs that are known today. Notably, approximately \$55 million of federal funding expected for Health and Human Services Agency programs is at risk based on actions taken to date. An additional \$3.5 million is at risk for the Land Use and Environment Group, and \$2 million in unclaimed federal funds for the Finance and General Government Group. Future impacts from tariffs are also anticipated, although the magnitude is unknown at this time. The County is identifying mitigation strategies for these and other potential risks through frequent monitoring and advocacy, and anticipates that adjustments to expenditures, staffing, and operations may be necessary as impacts become clearer.

Enterprise-wide Impacts

1. On April 10, 2025, the Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) announced that federal matching funds for certain designated State Medicaid programs will not be renewed, which could impact local government programming and budgets.

Impact Assessment

- The following County programs are potentially at risk: BH-CONNECT 1115 Waiver, Providing Access and Transforming Health (PATH) Initiative, Justice-Involved Reentry Initiative, DMC-ODS, and CalAIM Community Supports and Enhanced Care Management.
- However, per guidance from the State, there are no direct County impacts anticipated at this time. Mitigation
- County staff are continuing to closely monitor any new interpretations of the policy or impacts.
- 2. On April 10, 2025, the U.S. House of Representatives passed a budget plan that would significantly cut funding for health care programs that impact nearly a million people in San Diego County who receive Medicaid, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) benefits.

Impact Assessment

• If the proposed cuts become law, the County risks losing millions in revenue and safety net services will likely need to be reduced. Depending on what becomes law, the County may have potential risk for supplementing the cost of care for millions of residents including services for Medi-Cal eligible individuals including children, people with serious mental illness and substance use disorders, and individuals that are incarcerated and could also be required to verify income of all Medicaid beneficiaries.

Proposed cuts to SNAP, also known as CalFresh in California and TANF, also known as CalWORKs
in California, would have significant impacts to our clients who rely on nutrition assistance and child
care services.

Mitigation Efforts

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- County staff are continuing to monitor any new interpretations of the budget plan and impacts to the County and residents who receive Medicaid, SNAP, and TANF benefits. The County is also advocating to the Region's Congressional Delegation.
- 3. On March 4, 2025, the Administration placed a 25% tariff on most goods from Canada and China that are anticipated to have increased procurement costs that are currently undetermined.

Impact Assessment

• The stock and bond markets have already reflected the impact of tariffs since their announcement. Although it is difficult to determine the direct effects on the County at this time, market volatility has raised concern among County contractors, particularly due to increased procurement costs for items such as technology, construction, vehicles, books and printed materials. These increases are driven by taxes, disrupted supply chains, and specific industry job requirements.

Mitigation Efforts

- If bids for projects increase as a result of tariffs, the scope will be revised to stay within budgeted amounts and contingencies will be added to address cost impacts, or scope changes.
- County Staff will not accept vehicles that are priced above purchasing agreements as a result of tariffs.
- County Staff are continuously monitoring and preparing for any realized impacts on programs and projects or other unanticipated consequences as a result of the tariffs.
- 4. On March 18, President Trump signed an Executive Order aimed at aligning federal preparedness and response doctrines, while examining state and local preparedness capabilities. In addition, on April 4, FEMA announced that it was halting funding for the Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) grant program. The Executive Order and halt in funding is part of a broader evaluation of FEMA grant programs and priorities, which includes a shift in focus toward state and local responsibility for disaster preparedness.

Impact Assessment

• Without funding or a reduction from FEMA for emergency response, the safety of the County's hazardous incident response team would be impacted, including their ability to identify hazards.

Mitigation Efforts

- County Staff are closely monitoring any changes to grant programs funded through FEMA.
- Staff plan to apply for the FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant to cover 75 percent of the costs to implement County's Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation plan to minimize disaster damage.

Health and Human Services Agency

1. On March 28, 2025, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) terminated multiple grant funding streams putting approximately \$33 million at risk, most notably in Public Health Services.

Impact Assessment

- In response to the grant termination, 23 states including California filed suit and a Temporary Restraining Order (TRO) was issued. The TRO was extended on April 17, 2025, and the Court may issue an order after April 29, 2025.
- There is still approximately \$33 million (out of a \$174 million grant award) that the County may be unable to claim out of the Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity (ELC) and Health Disparities grant awards.

• Funding at risk was intended to support the County Public Health Laboratory, disease prevention, administration of vaccines, purchase of an Electronic Health Record and other critical public health functions including staff.

Mitigation Efforts

- Staff quickly worked to submit more than \$6.5 million in eligible invoices prior to the deadline issued by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), and identified options to mitigate impacts, and communicate with impacted staff.
- Mitigations have included one contract termination, three paused contracts, and three paused procurements. Two contracts and four lab equipment purchases have been shifted to other funding streams. Planning is underway to identify alternate grant funding to help fund staff positions in FY 2025-26, in the event the Court ruling confirms termination of the funding.
- Staff are awaiting additional direction from the court and will continue to identify mitigations.
- 2. On April 1, 2025, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) terminated a \$19.6 million Shelters and Services Program (SSP) grant that was intended to provide services to migrants after their release from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) custody.

Impact Assessment

- The funds would have been disbursed to the County on a reimbursement basis and based on current information, the funds will not be available for future use.
- No costs were incurred related to the grant because the procurement did not result in a contract, so there is no fiscal impact to the County.

Mitigation Efforts

- There are no recently reported migrants being released from DHS in San Diego County due to a change in federal policy.
- 3. In March 2025, the United States Department of Health and Human Services terminated a previously approved California Work and Family Well-Being Federal Pilot ("FRA Pilot") program that was intended to enhance efforts to secure employment for CalWORKs participants.

Impact Assessment

- The pilot, which had not yet started, would have allowed California to be measured on metrics other than the Work Participation Rate.
- The County had been engaged in planning efforts to expand CalWORKs program eligibility flexibilities and enrollment.
- There is no financial impact associated with the termination of this pilot program.
- 4. On April 23, 2025, the United States Housing and Urban Development (HUD) confirmed that there will be no additional Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV) allocations for public housing agencies after CY2026 and that \$2 million will be withheld from the Housing Authority of the County of San Diego (HACSD) CY2025 allocation.

Impact Assessment

HACSD has received approximately \$5 million annually from HUD since 2021 to provide EHV rental
assistance to more than 200 households. As a national American Rescue Plan Act program, EHV was
initially designed by HUD to end by 2030 and not as an ongoing program.

Mitigation Efforts

HACSD will continue to assess the potential impacts of the funding coming to an end. Staff will notify
and work with impacted households in advance of the program ending to potentially transition to other
types of assistance as available, subject to HUD and other funding availability.

Finance and General Government Group

- On March 25, 2025, federal changes to preserve and protect elections may risk the remaining \$1.9 million of funding through the Help America Vote Act (HAVA). Impact Assessment
 - The County has a remaining balance of \$1.9 million HAVA funding for federal elections that will occur in 2026. The funding is used for voting technology improvements and equipment, reuseable ballot drop boxes, and other one-time needs.
 - Legal challenges are expected in advance of the elections nationwide.

Mitigation Efforts

• There is no immediate action for local election officials to take in California as this is under review by the Secretary of State, who will provide local election officials with guidance.

Land Use and Environment Group

- On April 1, 2025, the federal Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) terminated the FY 2024-25 federal grant awarded to the California State Library under the Library Services and Technology Act. Impact Assessment
 - Libraries in the County and in the region will lose federal funding in FY 2025-26 used for customer and staff resources, software and equipment, equating to \$40k annually.

Mitigation Efforts

• Continue library programs by supplementing the costs through other funding sources.

Public Safety Group

- 1. Potential interruptions to State and Local Overtime (SLOT) puts certain County overtime duties at risk. <u>Impact Assessment</u>
 - Since the change in federal administration, there was a temporary interruption to SLOT federal funding. If similar future interruptions occur, the Sheriff's Department may be unable to perform certain overtime tasks if an alternate funding source is not identified.

Mitigation Efforts

• The Sheriff's Office does not project a significant operational impact from the recent temporary interruption of this relatively small funding source, and will rely on other funding sources to ensure that overtime costs are adequately covered if this becomes a recurring funding risk.

In closing, through monitoring the ever-changing political environment, this memo provides an update on the programs that are at risk, and potential impacts to the County with data available as of April 25, 2025. Additionally, there are a number of pending grant applications that are awaiting notice of award. County departments continue to comply with federal funding guidance, acting in accordance with the latest guidance provided by the appropriate federal authority. The County ICS team meets twice a week to prepare mitigation strategies to anticipated impacts through ongoing evaluation and next steps, working to make adjustments to expenditures, staffing, and operations will occur as needed.

- 7. Serves as a liaison with other County, Regional, State, and Federal criminal justice agencies concerning crime analysis techniques, technology, investigative techniques, data research, and coordinates efforts.
- 8. Leads, develops, and mentors staff within the Crime and Intelligence Analysis Unit, overseeing analytical tradecraft, identifying training needs, and implementing professional development strategies to advance analytical capabilities and support evolving law enforcement priorities.
- 9. Represents the San Diego Sheriff's Office on committees and task forces.
- 10. Provides adaptive analytical support and responses for the Sheriff's Office, including real-time intelligence during critical incidents, emergent investigations, and high-priority operational requests.
- 11. Researches and provides crime data metrics for newly implemented laws or changes to law enforcement practices.
- 12. Retains a knowledge of trends related to local, state, federal, international, and border related crimes.
- 13. Performs other duties as assigned.

CLASS PURPOSE AND DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS

To plan, organize, and direct the re-entry activities of the Sheriff's Office, Detention Services Bureau. This class reports to an Assistant Sheriff.

The Sheriff's Re-entry Services Administrator is an unclassified management level classification allocated only to the Sheriff's Office, Detention Services Bureau. Under the direction of an Assistant Sheriff, this position is responsible for coordinating all aspects of Detention Services Bureau's re-entry efforts, provide community and public relations; and direct the administrative activities related to the Sheriff's re-entry efforts. COMMUNITY RESPONSE AND RECOVERY: STRENGTHENING OUR REGIONAL CAPABILITIES IN THE FOUR PHASES OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT REPORT BACK

On January 30, 2024 (1), the Board of Supervisors (Board) took a series of actions in response to the historic rainfall that left communities in the region with significant, long-lasting damage. These actions included directing the Interim Chief Administrative Officer to assess what more could be done to strengthen the regional capabilities in the four phases of emergency management and report back with the findings. Subsequently, staff provided a memorandum to the Board on June 13, 2024, which provided 70 recommendations related to actions the County of San Diego (County) could take to address the Board's direction. In order to implement these actions, staff conducted an analysis of the resources and staffing required to implement the recommendations within the proposed timeframes.

This analysis was provided to the Board via memorandum on September 26, 2024. Then, on October 22, 2024 (22), the Board provided input and direction on the implementation of recommendations from the June 13, 2024 memorandum that required additional Board direction or resources. Additionally, on November 8, 2024, the County of San Diego Severe Storm and Flooding (DR-4758-CA) After Action Report and Improvement Plan (AAR IP) was released, presenting key recommendations to enhance disaster response and recovery efforts.

This update outlines staff's progress in implementing the October 22, 2024 (22) Board actions and details plans to address the AAR IP recommendations in coordination with the remaining action items from the June 13, 2024, memorandum.

UPDATE ON THE OCTOBER 22, 2024 (22) BOARD ACTION

Enhancing Community Partnerships for Emergency Management and Recovery

The Board directed the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO), through the Office of Emergency Services (OES), to gather feedback on the June 13, 2024, Board memorandum and engage key stakeholders to strengthen emergency management efforts. Direction included: (a) collaborating with community-based organizations (CBOs), philanthropies, and local stakeholders to support the various phases of emergency response and recovery and (b) consulting with individuals and organizations that can enhance public awareness, media outreach, cultural and language accessibility, psychosocial support, financial assistance, and community recovery infrastructure, ensuring a more inclusive and effective emergency response.

Expanding Collaboration and Community Engagement to Strengthen Emergency Response

To strengthen cross-agency partnerships and integrate community expertise into all phases of emergency management, OES is developing a Community Outreach and Engagement Strategy (Strategy), detailing the vision, mission, project scope, and SMART goals for FY 2025-26. The draft Strategy will be completed in June 2025. OES will then re-engage community organizations to gather feedback and refine the document. The final Strategy will be published in July 2025. The Strategy focuses on leveraging the knowledge and capabilities of CBOs, local philanthropies, and stakeholders while prioritizing partnerships that enhance public awareness, culturally responsive communication, and community resilience.

Key elements of the Strategy include establishing structured communication channels, expanding disaster training for CBOs, strengthening translation and cultural outreach efforts, and developing a formalized network of vetted organizations to support resilience at every stage of a disaster. Additionally, the Strategy involves increasing community awareness of opportunities for hands-on emergency response and volunteer training, such as Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) programs and American Red Cross initiatives, empowering residents with the skills needed to support their families and communities during disasters.

Since August 2024, OES engaged with over 40 partner networks to assist in developing the Strategy, including San Diego Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (SDVOAD), Spring Valley Community Alliance, Jireh Providers/Crisis Counseling Program, I Love to Glean & Promise Zone, Alliance San Diego, NCCC AmeriCorps, Council of Equity & Advocacy San Diego, Urban Sustainability Coalition, San Diego Parks Foundation, San Diego Partner Relay Network, 211 San Diego, and the region's 25+ CERTs. These discussions have played a key role in aligning a shared vision for enhanced disaster preparedness, response, and recovery, shaping the foundation of the final Strategy.

County OES will continue to work together with key community stakeholders, like the Southeast Disaster Response Team, to identify and invite CBOs to participate in the long-term flood recovery network. This effort will prioritize a strategic, inclusive, and culturally competent approach to CBO engagement that reflects the communities being served. SDVOAD will continue to partner in facilitating discussions and hosting strategic engagement workshops with OES and participating CBOs.

One component of the Strategy is the CBO Four Phases Training Plan, which will provide community

partners with essential emergency management tools and resources. In March 2025, OES began presenting a draft of this training to key organizations, gathering feedback to ensure an engaging, effective, and collaborative learning experience. The training, launching in September 2025, will cover topics such as the National Incident Management System (NIMS), Incident Command Structure (ICS), and whole-community emergency management. The CBO training program will complement and align with CERT programs, integrating their efforts to strengthen emergency preparedness. While CERT training focuses on individual response skills, the CBO training will enhance community-wide coordination, bridge gaps in local networks, improve resource management, and foster greater resilience.

Asset Mapping for Targeted Support

To identify key organizations contributing to each of the four phases of emergency management, OES is leading an asset mapping initiative in collaboration with Live Well San Diego and the Partner Relay Network. GIS visualization will provide a countywide map of partners and resources, capturing their mission, services, capacity, and language access. Data collection is expected to conclude by June 2025, followed by targeted stakeholder outreach in July. Once finalized, OES will establish Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) with CBOs and service providers for pre-arranged emergency services, such as food distribution. Additionally, contracts with micro-local businesses will be explored to create resource hubs, ensuring faster and more localized disaster response.

Enhancing Emergency Communication

OES is working to integrate existing Parter Relay and Live Well San Diego partner networks – including CBOs, faith-based groups, and non-governmental organizations – into a single, consolidated contact list. This unified list will be uploaded into the County's emergency mass notification system – Genasys Emergency Management (GEM) – and used to distribute emergency messages, which partners can then amplify to the communities they serve using culturally and linguistically appropriate communication channels. OES will complete the reconciliation of partner lists and will integrate it into GEM by June 2025.

Streamlining Grant Access and Regional Partnerships for Hazard Mitigation

The Board directed various actions to include proactive steps to enhance the County's ability to secure and manage funding for hazard mitigation and climate resilience.

Streamlining Grant Access

The Board authorized County departments to apply for and accept funding through FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Assistance (HMA) Program until October 22, 2029. This includes grants such as Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP), Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC), Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM), and Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA), which require a 25% local match and support projects aimed at reducing long-term disaster risks.

To maximize these opportunities, OES has notified Local Mitigation Planning Team members and continues working with the County's Office of Economic Development and Government Affairs (EDGA) to align grant monitoring and distribution with County mitigation priorities. OES and EDGA will continue researching, tracking, and supporting regional grant proposals that align with the Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan (MJHMP).

In partnership with Cal OES, OES hosted an in-person hazard mitigation training and project scoping session on March 26-27, 2025, at the Emergency Operations Center. This HMGP funding is allocated to California as a result of FEMA Disaster Declaration DR-4856-CA which pertains to the California Wildfires that occurred in January 2025. This session, extended to all regional Hazard Mitigation Planning participants, provided an overview of the funding process, best practices for mitigation projects, and grant development guidance.

To address the Board's direction that focused on the use and approval of HMA funds while also identifying funding for the 25% local match requirement, OES collaborated with the Finance & General Government Group Executive Office, the Public Safety Group Executive Office and EDGA to formulate a concept proposal to use a portion of the "2024 Flood Reimbursement Fund" to cover future grant matches.

A February 27, 2024 (11) Board action established Trust Fund 61011 to deposit reimbursements from the 2024 floods, allocating up to \$10 million for disaster prevention and preparedness. FEMA studies indicate that every dollar invested in mitigation saves an average of \$6 in future recovery costs. Leveraging this trust fund would increase the County's ability to secure mitigation grants and reduce the financial burden on local communities. OES will continue to develop this proposal and collaborate with the Office of Financial Planning to create policy options for Board consideration that further streamline grant application requirements.

Regional Partnerships for Hazard Mitigation

The Board directed the CAO to identify regional resiliency funding opportunities for climate risk hazard mitigation, including grants, in collaboration with community partners and government agencies.

OES maintains the Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan (MJHMP) with nearly 30 regional planning entities, updating it annually to track progress, adjust strategies, and enhance regional resilience. On September 10, 2024 (01), the Board approved the acceptance of \$319,971 in HMGP funds to support consultant services for the MJHMP update. The process will begin in May 2025 and conclude by May 2027, ensuring the updated plan is adopted before the current plan expires in March 2028. This update will expand climate change considerations, incorporate public feedback, and refine hazard mitigation priorities. OES will use FEMA's Whole Community Approach, engaging emergency managers, community leaders, tribal partners, and government officials to enhance resilience and equity across all communities in the region.

Looking Ahead for the MJHMP

To ensure a comprehensive and community-driven hazard mitigation planning process and sustain an ongoing collaborative hazard mitigation program, OES will carry out the following actions:

MJHMP Update Process:

- Summer 2025 Kickoff:
 - Launch online surveys to gather public and community organization feedback on hazard risks, past mitigation efforts, and future strategies.
- Fall & Winter 2025/26:
 - Collaborate with the HMPG to update the MJHMP, incorporating recent changes in both the hazards facing San Diego County and the programs designed to reduce or eliminate those

risks. This effort also includes evaluating regional resiliency funding opportunities to support climate-related hazard mitigation.

- Incorporate public input into the updated MJHMP document.
- Spring/Summer 2026:
 - Circulate the final draft, collaboratively developed by the HMPG, for additional community feedback.
 - Publish the draft online, including on the County's Engage Portal, to ensure broad public access and participation.
 - Host a public forum to gather diverse perspectives and strengthen community engagement.

Ongoing Hazard Mitigation Program Activities:

- Public Engagement: Continuously encourage community members and organizations to participate in hazard mitigation planning by providing input via oeshmp@sdcounty.ca.gov.
- Grant Collaboration: Continue to collaborate with EDGA to share grant opportunities and foster collaboration on mitigation strategies.

Enhancing Disaster Recovery Support for Individuals and Community Organizations

The Board directed the CAO to establish an agreement with a fiduciary agency to ensure donated funds are efficiently distributed to disaster victims.

The San Diego (SD) Foundation has historically collected monetary donations during disasters, including the January 2024 floods. Building on this, OES is working closely with the SD Foundation to update the agreement that would formalize its role as the County's fiscal agent during large-scale disasters. Under the agreement, the SD Foundation would manage a centralized donations hub — collecting monetary contributions and distributing them to CBOs supporting disaster-impacted individuals. The agreement would also include provisions for distributing direct financial assistance to affected residents.

At the same time, OES has released a Request for Information (RFI) to Buynet to explore additional organizations that may be equipped to serve in the fiscal agent role. The RFI was developed in partnership with the Department of Purchasing and Contracting and will be accompanied by an in-person Industry Day at the County's Emergency Operations Center on May 14, 2025.

The Board also directed legislative advocacy efforts to secure financial assistance for individuals and community-based organizations for disaster recovery. In response, OES collaborated with EDGA to integrate the following policy guideline into the 2025 Legislative Program: "Support legislation that would provide financial assistance to individuals and community-based organizations for disaster recovery." The 2025 Legislative Program was approved by the Board on December 10, 2024 (37), ensuring the County's ongoing advocacy for disaster recovery funding at the state and federal levels.

Exploring the Establishment of Recovery and Community Units within OES

The Board directed staff to explore establishing a Recovery Unit, modeled after federal and state approaches to enhance disaster recovery efforts, and a Community Unit staffed with bilingual, culturally responsive personnel to leverage existing County networks and improve coordination with volunteers and community-based organizations throughout all phases of emergency management. Both recommendations

will be included in the CAO Recommended Fiscal Year 2025-27 Operational Plan.

Efforts are already underway to strengthen recovery operations and community engagement using existing County personnel and resources. OES Emergency Services Coordinators (ESCs) play a critical role in these functions, while the County's Advanced Recovery Initiative (ARI) Ready Disaster Service Worker (DSW) Program provides specialized, position-specific DSW training to County employees. This program ensures a prepared and resilient workforce capable of supporting response and recovery efforts beyond OES' standard capacity during an activation.

Expanding Disaster Service Worker (DSW) Training and Roles

Traditionally, County staff have been trained for roles such as Shelter Workers and Local Assistance Center Workers. OES has expanded these offerings by introducing a new, enhanced Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Responder role with corresponding training and a new Translation Services position to be included in the County's DSW roles.

The new EOC Responder training enhances operational capacity within the Emergency Operations Center, ensuring a well-trained team is in place to support activations. The Translation Services position improves multilingual communication to better serve diverse communities. This role is filled strategically by staff pre-approved by the County's Language Services Manager to assist in obtaining interpretation and translation services in the County's eight-threshold languages.

To improve accessibility and engagement, all DSW training modules have transitioned from traditional PowerPoint presentations to an interactive e-learning format. OES has partnered with the Department of Human Resources to integrate these courses into the County Learning Management System (LMS), assigning them to employees based on their designated ARI codes. The new LMS trainings are expected to go live by July 2025.

In October 2024, OES revised the EOC staffing plan and section lead rosters and the next update is scheduled for July 2025, coinciding with the launch of the new LMS trainings. Additionally, OES is now conducting quarterly EOC Responder audits to ensure ARI codes remain accurately reflected in the alerting system.

Looking ahead, the OES Ready DSW Program Coordinator is actively working to expand the program by identifying new positions that can enhance response efforts during activations. Potential future roles include:

- Call Center Operators
- Self-Sufficiency Specialists
- Clinical/Public Health Nurses
- Family Assistance Center Staff
- Functional Assessment Service Teams (FAST) for individuals with access and functional needs (AFN)
- Canvassing Teams
- Information Technology Support

EOC Readiness

OES has secured a \$150,000 Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) grant from FEMA to fund an EOC assessment, scheduled to begin in June 2025 and conclude by January 2026. This initiative aims to strengthen EOC readiness and operational effectiveness through key improvements, including:

- Development of EOC starter guides, role-specific checklists, and task books aligned with FEMA's National Qualification System (NQS).
- A structured training and tracking system to ensure EOC personnel meet FEMA compliance requirements.

Strengthening Recovery and Community Coordination

Beyond general EOC readiness, OES has improved disaster recovery coordination by implementing a public damage assessment survey through Crisis Track. This software allows for rapid damage reporting, real-time impact visualization, and the generation of standardized reports required for state and federal disaster aid. During the widespread flooding in January 2024, Crisis Track proved essential in streamlining damage assessments and expediting inspections by Cal OES and FEMA. As a result of severe storm impacts, the County secured federal Major Disaster Declarations in both 2023 and 2024, with cost recovery efforts currently ongoing.

While progress has been made, the County does not have a dedicated disaster recovery position. Expanding full-time staffing, as will be proposed in the CAO Recommended Operational Plan, would allow OES to establish a Recovery and Community Engagement Unit that includes Public Assistance and Individual Assistance, improving training, planning, and operational efficiency for disaster recovery.

Efforts are also underway to formalize a Community Engagement position within the EOC for Level 1 and 2 activations, the highest levels of emergency response. The Community Engagement position will be designed to connect the County with local nonprofits, faith-based groups, and community-based organizations to coordinate critical resources such as food, shelter, and outreach. Leveraging these trusted partners during emergencies will help ensure timely support for vulnerable populations, enhance situational awareness from the ground, and strengthen the overall effectiveness of the County's response. OES has engaged with Live Well Leadership to review past activations – such as COVID-19 – and identify best practices for integrating CBOs into disaster operations.

Additionally, OES is coordinating with the San Francisco Department of Emergency Management, which has successfully implemented a Community Branch within its EOC, to learn from their activation process. In the meantime, a designated seat for CBO representatives actively engaged in an emergency response has been added to the EOC Liaison Branch, ensuring direct two-way communication between community partners and EOC leadership.

Looking Ahead

OES will continue refining the Community Engagement EOC position and integrate it into the County's Operational Area Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) as part of the upcoming update cycle. This process commenced April 2025, with the finalized plan expected to be presented to the Board for adoption in September 2026. As the FY 2025-27 Operational Plan process progresses, OES will formally establish

Recovery and Community units.

PLAN FOR THE NOVEMBER 8, 2024 AFTER ACTION REPORT AND IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Following a significant EOC activation – such as the January 2024 Severe Storm and Flooding event which took place from January 22, 2024 to June 21, 2024 – it is standard practice to produce an AAR after the incident to document the response, assess effectiveness, and identify lessons learned for future improvements. This process is a key component of the continuous improvement cycle in emergency management, aligning with best practices and often required by federal and state guidelines.

The County of San Diego Severe Storm and Flooding (DR-4758-CA) After Action Report and Improvement Plan was developed based on feedback from County personnel and external stakeholders involved in response and recovery efforts. The AAR, published on November 8, 2024, four months after full EOC demobilization, was prepared by Hagerty Consulting. The report outlines 44 recommendations across six key focus areas to strengthen future disaster response and resilience:

- Operational Area (OA) EOC
- OA Coordination
- Community Engagement
- Emergency Temporary Lodging
- Public Information Management
- Data Management and Reporting

In February 2025, OES brought in a temporary Group Program Manager from another County department to oversee the implementation of the AAR and Improvement Plan (IP). To date, OES has assembled a Working Group consisting of 15 County departments that will implement the report's recommendations.

Many of the AAR recommendations align with those outlined in the June 13, 2024, memorandum to the Board. To streamline efforts, OES will integrate the AAR Working Group's implementation process with the remaining recommendations from the June 2024 report, ensuring a coordinated and efficient approach to strengthening the County's disaster response and recovery capabilities.

Several follow-up actions are already completed or underway. Examples include:

- The new Emergency Management Section within the County Fire Chiefs Association has started discussions on developing a regional emergency management mutual aid agreement. This agreement would help strengthen support across jurisdictions during large-scale emergencies or disasters. It would establish how resources, personnel, and assistance are shared ahead of time, allowing for quicker, more organized responses when incidents occur. Key details like cost reimbursement and liability would also be outlined in advance, helping ensure aid is delivered efficiently and effectively when it's needed most.
- OES is working with other jurisdictions to develop a Multi-Year Integrated Preparedness Plan (MYIPP) which will be a comprehensive training and exercise document. This plan will show what trainings are happening, when they'll take place, and when exercises will be held to test the plans, procedures, and operations covered in those trainings. The expected completion date of the MYIPP

is December 2025.

- OES worked with FEMA to run a countywide earthquake drill based on a 6.9-magnitude quake along the Rose Canyon fault on December 5, 2024. The 2024 Rose Canyon Fault Tabletop Exercise (TTX) brought together key partners throughout San Diego County to test how well the region could respond to a major disaster. The exercise looked at how agencies would coordinate, share public information, and stabilize critical infrastructure. By walking through a detailed scenario together, participants improved their ability to work as a team and manage resources during a crisis. The exercise included over 20 cities and special districts, three state and two federal agencies, one tribal nation, seven private companies, and one university.
- OES has rolled out a data sharing strategy that uses pre-approved templates developed with County Counsel. This setup allows for quick and efficient sharing of information with different stakeholders, including community organizations, during emergencies. A key part of the strategy is being a responsible steward of data, which helps build trust with the community. Data sharing guidelines may differ depending on the organization involved.

For the remaining recommendations, the AAR IP Working Group will develop an Action Plan, targeting a 90-day (July 1, 2025) timeline for implementing short-term goals, while more complex improvements will be carried out over six to twelve months, depending on resource availability and the nature of the changes. The Working Group kickoff meeting occurred on April 9, 2025.
