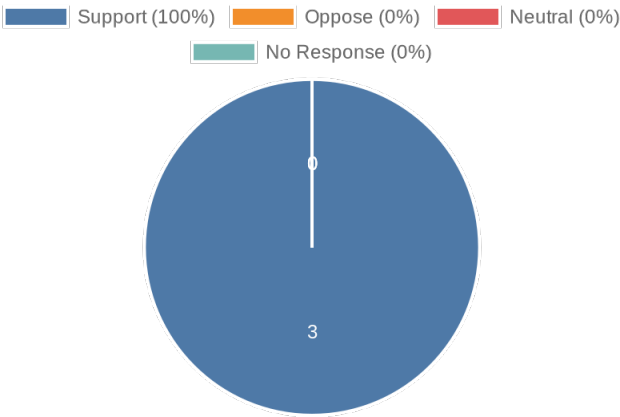

#### Overall Sentiment

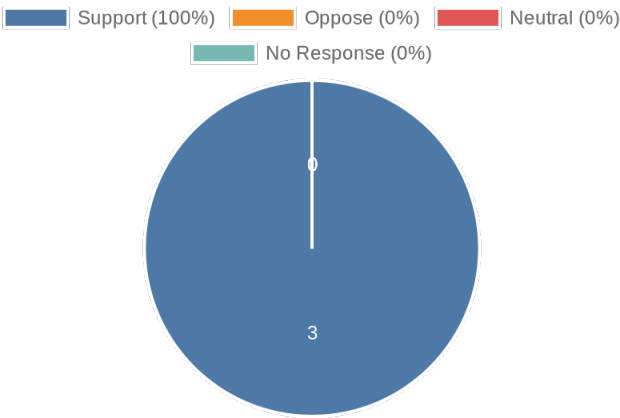

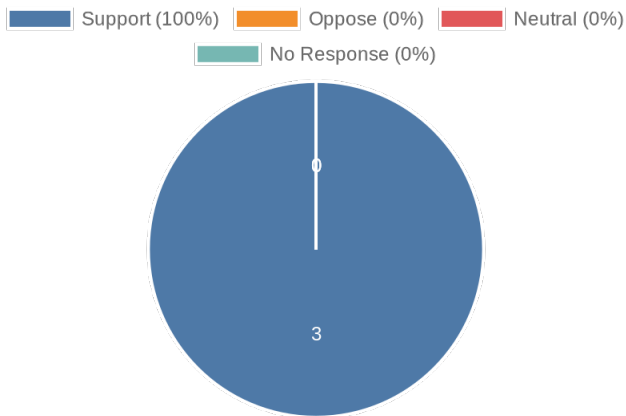

While this does not actually provide the AED automated external defibrillators (say it fast 3 times,) it is a good thing to explore this, not only because it would enhance safety, but also because California State Assembly Bill 1467 passed in 2023 (the “Nevaeh Youth Sports Safety Act” ) will require most youth sports organizations to have access to an AED during any official practice or match, beginning January 1, 2027.
