





The solution is to retain the existing established ballfields and find a different location for affordable housing. The existing ballfields are at a downtown walkable location with lighting, surrounded by three youth facilities, fire department, and sheriff station. Their loss will disproportionately impact low income and people of color that currently have easy access to the ballfields.
