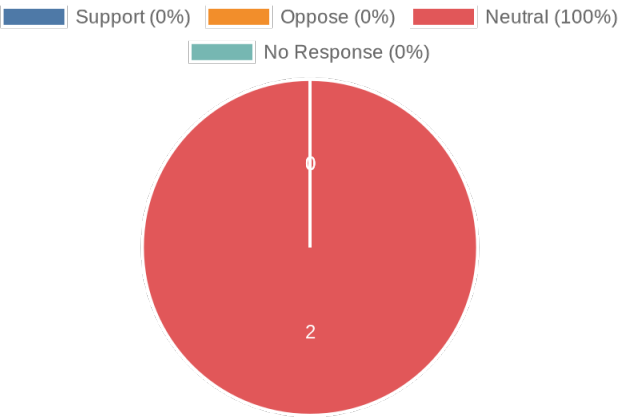

Overall Sentiment



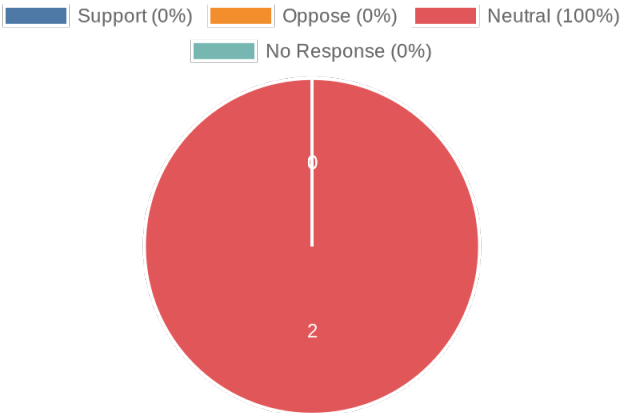

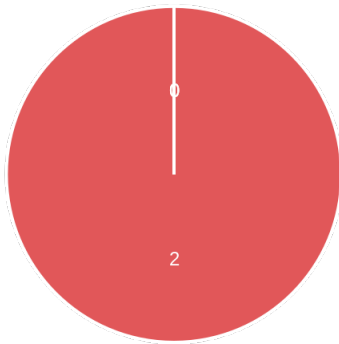

After regular annual increases, this report shows new CLERB cases in 2025 dropped to the lowest number in four years. Meanwhile, daily jail populations have spiked due to Prop 36 and the State of California is investigating both county juvenile detention facilities for abuse. Given this context, why aren't there *more* complaints being filed with CLERB? There are several possibilities, including court-mandated changes to Sheriff policies and procedures, but anecdotal evidence suggests fear of retaliation and the belief that CLERB can't or won't hold law enforcement to account are driving down filed complaints. I'm asking the Board of Supervisors to request additional information pinpointing why new CLERB cases have dropped so precipitously, despite a number of relevant indicators implying we should be seeing continued increases. If there are reprisal or trust issues that need to be addressed, the people of San Diego deserve to know.

The results are a bit disappointing. I expect there are several cases of excessive force. Remember to look at the training manuals. The laws are usually too vague in these cases. It is also disappointing, but not surprising given the County's record, that CLERB is not allowed to investigate juvenile cases. Not sure why there were more closed case than opened cases in 2025. It would be nice to have notes explaining these items.

While CLERB has issues, I am surprised that the Sheriff still has not responded to the 5 2025 recommendations. It also looks like the Sheriff needs to pay closer attention to things like CLERB writing a letter of concern about body worn cam violations. That's because the rate of violations did not slow much during the 8 months since a letter was sent out.

New procedure manuals, not much change, although the new investigators and Board members should result in

positive change.
