





The Tijuana River Valley and surrounding communities like Imperial Beach and San Ysidro are among the most impacted in our county by pollution, flooding, and lack of access to green space. By removing dilapidated structures and restoring 19 acres of native habitat, this project will improve air quality, reduce urban heat island effects, enhance stormwater infiltration, and support biodiversity under the Multiple Species Conservation Program.

These are nature based solutions that restore, protect, manage, and restore ecosystems to address pollution challenges that the Tijuana River Valley has faced for decades.

The San Diego Bird Alliance (SDBA) supports the acceptance of funding and all associated actions required to enable the Department of Parks and Recreation to restore degraded land in the Tijuana River Valley Regional Park. This action will directly benefit local Environmental Justice communities near the border that are adversely impacted by the Tijuana River pollution. The funds coming from the United States Navy, Naval Base Coronado Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) Program will be essential in removing dilapidated buildings and restoring native habitat.
