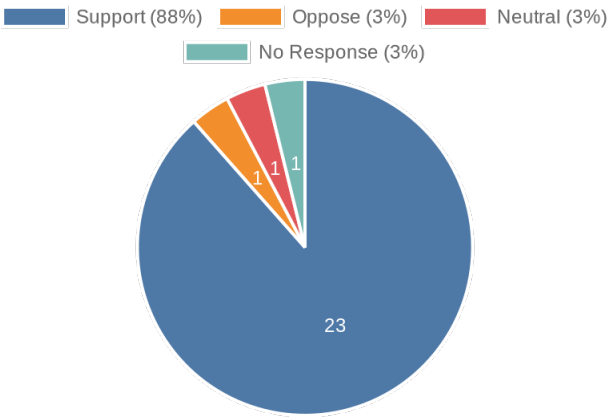

Overall Sentiment

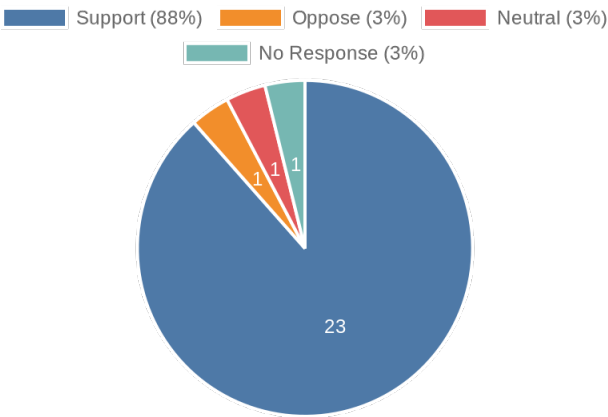

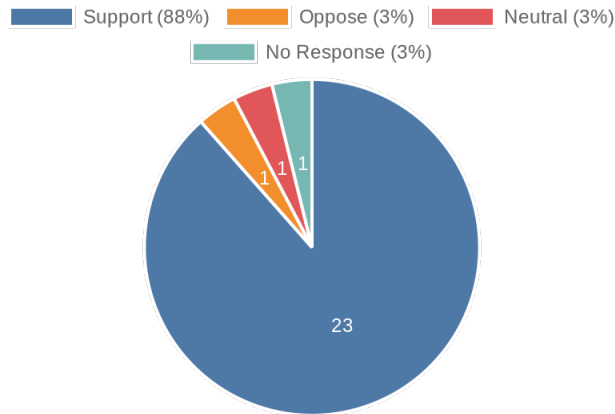
