





You know all about trafficking, dontcha? In fact, the County already has a multi-agency San Diego Human Trafficking Task Force (SD HTTF) that combats both sex and labor trafficking, with a strong focus on child exploitation and supporting victims. It is a collaborative effort involving federal, state, and local law enforcement, including the FBI, HSI (data shared with ICE,) and the District Attorney's Office.

A major objection is that the amendment has only 2 street people, victims, and no children. 2 out of 20. I would expect lots of business/political argument about the abuse, not much from the people who live it.

Kind of the same round-and-round that's contributed, you might say fostered, the current state of trafficking and exploitation.

Also, there is no provision in the ordinance for a sunset review, per policy A-74.
