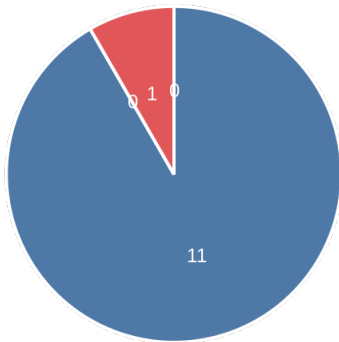

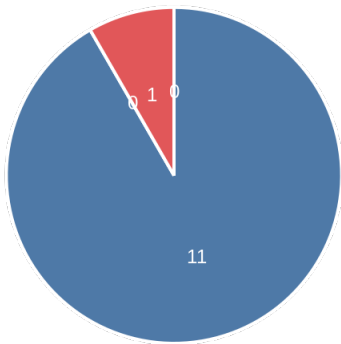

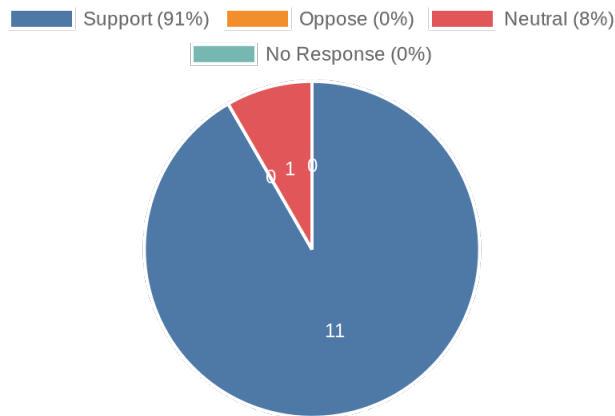
### Overall Sentiment

So, we're going back to 2023 for our statistics, as the Board Letter proclaims? The violent crime rate of 4.4 per thousand residents in 2023 is comparable to rates in the 1970s & early 2000s, not today. According to the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS,) there were 39 homicides in 2025, The overall rate is declining, and San Diego is one of the safest cities in the country,

With that said, a 1/9 memo from the City's Budget Analyst says 'No Shots Fired... consistently meets annual performance metrics within the first three to four months of the fiscal year' and "The S.D.P.D's 2025 Crime Report shows crimes committed by gang members dropped by 11% in 2024 and the number of documented gang members decreased by 31%. Shaphat sounds like a good program.

San Diego, with 3.3 mil people, spent \$750 thou on this program in 2026, about 23 cents/person. Spring Valley has 33 thou people, so \$250 thou would be about 7-1/2 cents/person.

Let's see if we can take this county-wide.
