Hello Supervisors,

The Board Letter mentions a funding stream, the FEMA Shelter and Services Program (SSP) grant funding, but does not mention a dollar amount or what the restrictions for its use are.

I see nothing in the agenda about prioritizing the deportation of undocumented migrants who commit crimes, such as the several murders around the country, and the rapes and child abuse which are well known. There is even a trophy tree in Jacumba decorated with the underwear of the victims. Audra Morgan and others have amply investigated this.

Apart from the unimaginable suffering these crimes perpetuate, another aspect is the extra amount of time and resources spent on gathering evidentiary material on an undocumented immigrant. We should be reimbursed for this. This should be included in your to-do list.

It is disturbing that we prioritize onward travel sending these illegals to another State without making provisions to deport or remove from society those who do commit crimes.

We, the people, should not have to put up with this.
