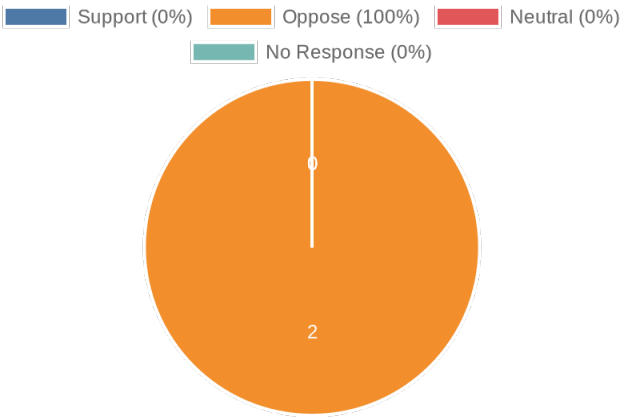

Overall Sentiment

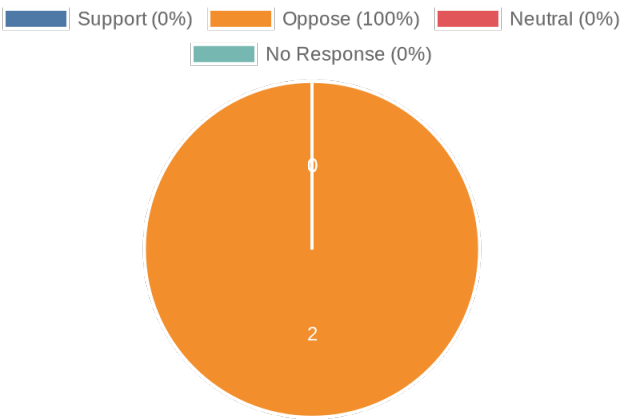

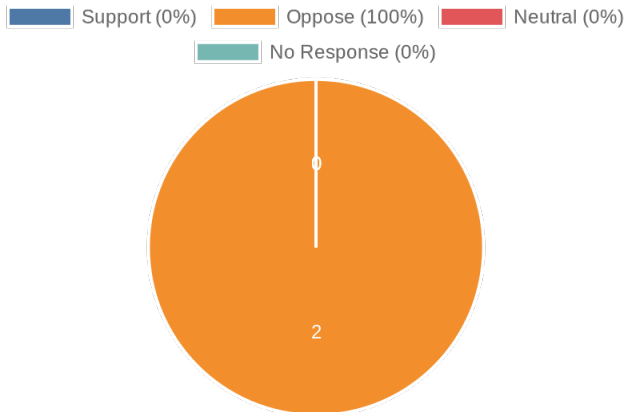

Parents please know Governor Newsome signed into law:

10/2023- AB665 A minor who is 12 years of age or older may consent to mental health treatment or counseling on an outpatient basis, or to residential shelter services, if the minor, in the opinion of the attending professional person, is mature enough to participate intelligently in the outpatient services or residential shelter services. Without parent knowledge or consent. Or no accusation of the parent, conviction of the parent or trauma to the child by the parent.

There is no exit point for a minor child to decide he/she wishes to leave the shelter.

So this would be built for \$210 mil on Rosecrans St. next to the Psychiatric Hospital. The State money is \$99.5 mil. The County's share would be \$21 mil. So not sure where the other \$89.5 mil would come from.

But there are several other things I don't like about this: the Wellness Campus is in the Midway District, not at all central to the County, while the mental cases and druggies are all over the County; and it is a bit jarring that the County is financing their 10% matching share of this with County land, since we could use it to build things on like homeless housing or low-income housing, which we don't have nearly enough of.

There needs to be a better, more equitable, County-wide plan.
