





#18 – The proposed pipeline in the Tijuana River Valley would be expensive to maintain. I think that an above ground concrete or hard plastic lining would be better. We do not need more health studies. And we should be exploring options better than air purifiers, like handheld pollution monitors to zero in and find out where the crap is coming from? Let's get this solved.

#19 – I'm sure we can do mapping of the unincorporated area's most vulnerable infrastructure for less than \$2.5 million.

#20 – I think that reserves, unlocked or not, should be used on an ad hoc basis, preferably left for emergencies, and not parceled out in advance when the funds might better be used elsewhere.

So please implement recommendations 1 to 17 only.
