





I urge Supervisors to get an independent study before approving a new jail in Vista as discussed during the December 9, 2025 Board meeting. Any report commissioned by the Sheriff is, of course, going to recommend a new facility to address the issue of detention infrastructure - SDSO is a carceral hammer and their solution is always going to be an expensive new jail nail. But before taxpayers commit to a \$1 billion price tag - or even to the annualized amount that this Board laughingly minimized - a neutral process that takes into account the real cost/benefit to our community should happen. This is one of the areas where an Inspector General would be helpful - providing outside feedback as to whether constructing a new jail is the best choice for the people of San Diego - and in the absence of that oversight, I recommend you at least consider independent analysis of the issue. Thank you.
