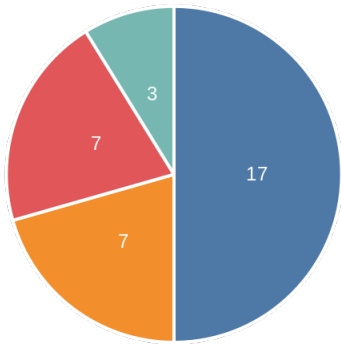

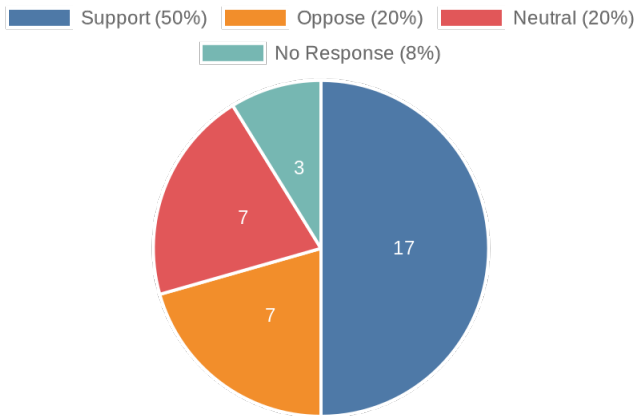

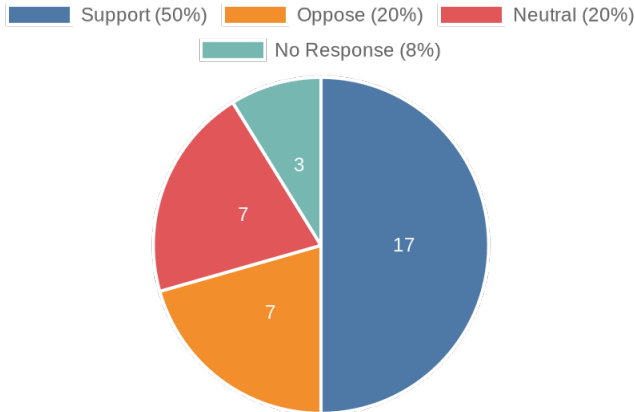

ARJIS, the Automated Regional Justice Information System, is part of SANDAG, the County transportation agency. Strict limits need to be put on data sharing and AI operations at ARJIS.

ARJIS records go to 65 local, State, and Federal Agencies – 5,000 users including the National Incident Based Reporting System. And we know that some ICE officers who might access the system have poor training.

It wants to send your data to The Cloud which has been hacked so often, data there is not safer. There may be less incidents, but who knows where your data might end up. IBM sells large ground-based data storage systems which are safer.

“Enhancing interoperability” as the report says means tinkering with the data in many cases. Making spying even better and easier. And does standardized mean things are omitted or minimized?

Unsaid is whether it uses Artificial Intelligence like ICE which employed up to 10,000 new recruits who were trained improperly due to an AI glitch.
