





### SDG&E

- Weather Network
  - San Diego County is the most weather monitored county in the US – 223 weather stations and growing
  - All data is shared in real-time with fire agencies, first responders and academics
- Fire Potential Index
  - Continuously enhanced, integrating leading fire science
  - Shared with thousands across our region daily, increasing community preparedness







### SDG&E

- Firefighting Helicopters
  - Two Blackhawk (H-60) helicopters ready for dispatch at Gillespie Field year around

  - Ongoing work to reduce and mitigate the impacts PSPS is having on our community








## **Sustainable Insurance Strategy**

- Insurance at a Crossroads in California
  - Growing climate change threats
  - Historic inflation
  - Several insurers stopped writing and nonrenewing policyholders despite approval of multiple rate increases
  - Accelerated FAIR Plan growth
  - Fewer options and higher costs
  - Outdated decades-old regulations





### **Sustainable Insurance Strategy**

- Streamline and improve Department's rate application approval process
- Introduce new risk management tools in ratemaking
- Insurer commitments to write more policies in wildfire distressed areas and reduce FAIR Plan policies
- Strengthen and Modernize FAIR Plan





## **Water Supply Investments Protect Region**

- Investments in the regional water storage and delivery system support emergency response
- Past emergencies have prepared the region for future challenges
- No capacity challenges threaten the delivery of wholesale water for fire suppression at the regional level
  - Every local water delivery system is unique



## Water Agencies Coordinate Fire Preparedness

- Retail Water Agencies
  - Responsible for connections delivering water directly to homes and businesses
  - Typically use smaller diameter pipelines
  - Provide water to hydrants
  - Deploy emergency resources





## Water Agencies Coordinate Fire Preparedness

- Wholesale SDCWA
  - Ensure water delivery to retain agencies
  - Regional communication
  - Water liaison to County EOC
  - Collaborate with regional fire chiefs and water agency general managers
  - Coordinate regional training, exercises, and mutual aid
  - Manage Water Agency Emergency Collaborative

#### What Can be Improved?

Backup power for flow-control facilities and a pump station so they operate during PSPS events. Funding request made through Prop. 4.

Cost: \$9.7 million



### Recommendations

 Receive a presentation on wildfire preparedness, response and resiliency, water supply and infrastructure, and residential insurance availability in San Diego County.

Investing in hemp batteries with plastic recycling byproducts is the smarter choice for San Diego, assuming equal development to lithium-ion. Hemp's renewability, paired with low-grade carbon from plastic waste, maximizes sustainability and economic benefits while minimizing wildfire risks. Lithium-ion's non-renewable materials, fire hazards, and limited use of plastic byproducts make it less suitable. By leveraging local hemp and recycling infrastructure, San Diego can lead in safe, green energy storage, aligning with its environmental and safety goals.
