Category 7. Less Inclusive Reportable Investments, Unincorporated Area

Investments in any business entity with interests in real property located in the unincorporated area of the County, or not more than two miles outside the boundaries of the unincorporated area.

Category 8. Less-Inclusive Reportable Income, Unincorporated Area

Income from a source which resides in the unincorporated area of the County, or not more than two miles outside the boundaries of the unincorporated area.

The Political Reform Act, Government Code Section 81000 et seq, requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission ("FPPC") has adopted a regulation, California Code of Regulations, Title 2, division 6, Section 18730 (hereinafter "CCR 18730"), which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. It can be incorporated by reference and may be amended by the FPPC after public notice and hearings to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. CATEGORIES OF REPORTABLE ECONOMIC INTERESTS

Category 1. All-Inclusive Reportable Investments
(Government Code Section 82034)

A designated employee in this category shall disclose all reportable investments (fair market value equal or exceeds \$2,000):

- a. Owned by the designated employee, his or her spouse or dependent child;
- b. Owned by an agent on behalf of the designated employee;
- c. Owned by any business entity controlled by the designated employee (i.e., any business entity in which the designated employee, his or her agents, spouse and dependent children hold more than a 50% ownership interest);
- d. Owned by a trust in which the designated employee has a substantial interest (i.e., a trust in which the designated employee, his or her spouse and dependent children have a present or future interest worth more than \$2,000);
- e. Representing the pro rata share (worth more than \$2,000) of the designated employee, his or her spouse and dependent children, of investments of any business entity or trust in which the designated employee, his or her spouse and dependent children own, directly or indirectly or beneficially, a 10% interest or greater.

Category 2. All-Inclusive Reportable Interest in Real Property
(Government Code – Sections 82033, 82035)

A designated employee in this category shall disclose all interests (worth more than \$2,000) in real property located within the jurisdiction if the interests are:

- a. Held or owned by the designated employee, his or her spouse and dependent child, or
- b. The pro rata share (worth more than \$2,000) of interests in real property of any business entity or trust in which the designated employee or spouse owns, directly, indirectly or beneficially, a 10% interest or greater.

Category 3. All-Inclusive Reportable Income
(Government Code Section – Sections 82030)

A designated employee in this category shall disclose all income of the designated employee from any District-related source aggregating \$500 or more (or \$50 or more in

the case of gifts) during the reporting period. This gift limit is adjusted for inflation every odd-numbered year.

Category 4. Less-Inclusive Reportable Investments
(Government Code Section – Sections 82034)

A designated employee in this category shall disclose only investments (worth more than \$2,000) in any business entity, which within the last two years has contracted with or in the future foreseeably may contact with the District or with any local government agency for which the Board of Directors is the governing body to provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment:

- a. To the District .
- b. Of the type utilized by the District and associated with the job assignment of the designated employee.

Category 5. Less-Inclusive Reportable Interests in Real Property
(Government Code Section – Sections 82033, 82035)

A designated employee in this category shall disclose all reportable interests in real property (worth more than \$2,000) located in the District, or not more than 2 miles outside the boundaries of the District, or within 2 miles of any land owned or used by the District.

Category 6. Less-Inclusive Reportable Income
(Government Code Section – Sections 82030)

A designated employee in this category shall disclose only that reportable income (\$500 or more during reporting period; \$50 or more in the case of gifts) which is derived from a source which within the last two years has contracted with the District or in the future foreseeably may contract with the District or with any local government agency for which the Board of Directors is the governing body to provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment:

- a. To the District.
- b. Of the type utilized by the District and associated with the job assignment of the designated employee.

Category 7. Investments Relating to Unincorporated Area.
(Government Code Section – Sections 82034)

A designated employee in this category shall disclose all reportable investments in those District-related business entities which:

- a. Have an interest in real property within the District or not more than two miles outside the boundaries of the District;

- b. Does business within the area described in (a) above; or

A designated employee in this category shall disclose all reportable income of the designated employee from those District-related sources which:

- a. Reside within the District or not more than two miles outside the boundaries of the District;
- b. Have an interest in real property within the area described in (a) above;
- c. Does business within the area described in (a) above; or
- d. Did business or plans to do business within the area described in (a) above at any time commencing two years before and ending one year after the time of filing Statement of Economic Interests.

Conflict of Interest Code

The Political Reform Act, Government Code Sections 81000, et seq., requires SANDAG to adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest Code. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard model Conflict of Interest Code, which can be incorporated by reference, and which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearings. Therefore, the terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission along with the attached Appendices in which officials, consultants and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth, are hereby incorporated by reference and constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of SANDAG.

The persons holding positions listed in the Appendix are designated employees, consultants, or officials. It has been determined that these persons make or participate in the making of decisions that may foreseeably have a material effect on financial interests. Designated persons shall file statements of economic interests with SANDAG when assuming or leaving their position and annually while holding the position. SANDAG will make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008). Statements for all designated employees will be retained by SANDAG and provided to the Code Reviewing Body, the County of San Diego.

1. Standard Code of FPPC

The Political Reform Act of 1974 (Government Code § 81000 *et seq.*) requires each state and local government agency to adopt and promulgate a conflict of interest code. As a local government agency, Steele Canyon High School is therefore required to adopt such a code. The Fair Political Practices Commission ("FPPC") has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. § 18730) which contains the terms of a model conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference as an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, the regulation may be amended by the FPPC to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act.

2. Adoption of Standard Code of FPPC

The terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regs. § 8730 and any future amendments to it duly adopted by the FPPC are hereby adopted and incorporated herein by reference. This regulation and the Appendix attached hereto designating officials and employees and establishing disclosure categories shall constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of Steele Canyon High School. This code shall take effect when approved by the Board of Supervisors for the County of San Diego, and shall thereupon supersede any and all prior codes adopted by Steele Canyon High School.

3. Filing of Statements of Economic Interests

Designated employees shall file Statements of Economic Interests with the agency, which will make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008).

Upon receipt of Statements from the Directors/Agency Head/Board Members listed below, the agency shall make and retain a copy and forward the original of this/these statement(s) to the County of San Diego Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

- CEO/Principal, Steele Canyon High School
- Members of the Board of Directors

The original statements for all other designated employees will be retained by the agency.

**APPENDIX TO

Preamble

Any person designated in Section I of this Appendix who is unsure of any right or obligation arising under this Code may request a formal opinion or letter of advice from the FPPC or an opinion from Steele Canyon High School' General Counsel. (Gov. Code § 83114; 2 Cal. Code of Regs. § 18730(b)(11).) A person who acts in good faith in reliance on an opinion issued to him or her by the FPPC shall not be subject to criminal or civil penalties for so acting, provided that all material facts are stated in the opinion request. (Gov. Code § 83114(a).)

Opinions rendered by General Counsel do not provide any statutory defense to an alleged violation of conflict of interest statutes or regulations. The prosecuting agency may, but is not required to, consider a requesting party's reliance on General Counsel's opinion as evidence of good faith. In addition, Steele Canyon High School may consider whether such reliance should constitute a mitigating factor to any disciplinary action that Steele Canyon High School may bring against the requesting party under Gov. Code § 91003.5.

Category 2. Reportable Interests in Real Property

A designated employee in this category shall disclose all interests in real property, as defined in Gov. Code §§ 82033 and 82035, that is

(a) within or not more than two (2) miles outside the boundaries of San Diego County that has situated on it any business entity named in category no. 1 above; or

(b) within two (2) miles of any facility or real property owned or used by Steele Canyon Charter High School.

Category 3. Reportable Income

A designated employee in this category shall disclose all income as defined in Government Code § 82030 of the designated employee from the below-listed sources located in, doing business in, planning to do business in, or having done business in the previous two (2) years in San Diego County during the reporting period.

(a) to Steele Canyon Charter High School, of the type utilized by Steele Canyon Charter High School which is located in or doing business in San Diego County, and associated with the job assignment or position of the designated employee; or

(b) to any entity which has contracted with Steele Canyon Charter High School within the last two years or which in the future foreseeably may contract with Steele Canyon Charter High School to provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment associated with the job assignment or position of the designated employee.

Category 5. Less-Inclusive Reportable Income

A designated employee in this category shall disclose only that reportable income as defined in Gov. Code § 82030 which is derived from a source which within the last two years has contracted with Steele Canyon Charter High School or in the future foreseeably may contract with Steele Canyon Charter High School to provide personnel, services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment:

(a) to Steele Canyon Charter High School, of the type utilized by Steele Canyon Charter High School which is located in or doing business in San Diego County, and associated with the job assignment or position of the designated employee; or

(b) to any entity which has contracted with the Steele Canyon Charter High School within the last two years or which in the future foreseeably may contract with Steele Canyon Charter High School to provide personnel, services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment associated with the job assignment or position of the designated employee.

Category 6. Business Positions

A designated employee in this category shall disclose by completing Form 700, Schedule "C." A designated employee shall list:

- (a) the name and address of each business entity in which he or she is a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or in which he or she holds any position of management;
- (b) a description of the business activity in which the business entity is engaged; and
- (c) the designated employee's position with the business entity.
