### Good morning,

I'd like to provide my comments on some items specified in the budget summary (<u>https://www.sandiegocounty.gov/content/sdc/openbudget/en/budget-summary.html</u>).

1. "\$3 million to improve a temporary space during the construction of a new Sheriff's substation in Ramona."

Three million dollars for a *temporary* space seems excessive. It's not even to build a new temporary space, but to improve a single temporary space. It'd be good to review whether this improvement is really necessary and if so, whether the cost of \$3 million is reasonable.

Also, since there's a housing shortage, if the improvement to the temporary space were to go through, it should be done in a way that it can house homeless after the "temporary" period is over.

2. "Rebuilding of the Mira Mesa Epicentre into a County-operated community center scheduled to open in fall 2026."

I'm not familiar with the financing of the Mira Mesa community center construction. I've always assumed it was fully funded by the San Diego City and the County was not involved. But based on the summary it seems County would be financially responsible for operating the community center. Building a new community center is not necessary. Currently there's a community center building with indoor gym, restrooms, as well as 2 separate playgroung areas with swings/slides and multiple baseball fields all in the same area. I've seen drawings of the new community center and only thing I see that'll be new is a pool and a large public art sculpture. There are atleast 3 other parks within 5 minutes drive from this location. Building a new community center is a huge waste of money because it doesn't increase the amenities available in a significant way given the cost of construction. I don't know how much it'd cost the County to operate the new community center, but it should look for a way to cancel the construction while it is still in the early stages.

A better use of the space would be to leave the current playgrounds/baseball fields in place and build dense affordable housing in the space of community center. The mira mesa library is literally a 2 minute walk from the current community center and the library can function as a community center.

3. "\$1 million to operate Safe Destination Nights, an after-school program serving 8,000 youths"

I have seen some of the expenses associated with this program. It appears that serving pizza is a component of this program, as well as having games with prizes given out to winners. One of the aims of this program should be to use this opportunity to develop skills that will allow them to be self sufficient adults, such as learning to cook and developing specific skills to aid in getting job later. Instead of game activities, the money would be better spent providing training on developing self sufficiency skills.

## Re: County Budget and Climate Action Plan 20% Equity Benchmark Funding

Dear County Board of Supervisors,

**Our request:** Please track Climate Action Plan (CAP) implementation dollars in the budget specifically for the County's designated Environmental Justice (EJ) communities—North El Cajon, North Lemon Grove, Spring Valley, and Sweetwater. This is essential to accurately assess whether the County is on track to meet the Board's directive to allocate a minimum of 20% of CAP investments to underserved communities.

When the CAP was adopted in September 2024, the Board of Supervisors made a motion directing staff to "establish a benchmark of at least 20% of CAP investments in underserved communities through the County budget process." This 20% threshold is a minimum standard intended to ensure that environmental justice communities are prioritized in the County's climate efforts. Ideally, the County would exceed this minimum to truly advance equity.

However, the current proposed budget does not track CAP implementation dollars allocated to these identified EJ communities. Without this transparency, it is not possible to determine whether the County is on track to meet the 20% benchmark.

The County's 2021 General Plan Environmental Justice Element provides a valuable starting point for this tracking. It identifies 17 census tracts facing compounded vulnerabilities, which together form four distinct EJ communities: North El Cajon, North Lemon Grove, Spring Valley, and Sweetwater. These communities should be prioritized for CAP implementation dollars.

Looking ahead, the County should also consider developing a **Unified Climate Equity Index** to guide equitable distribution of climate investments across the region. The City of San Diego's Climate Equity Index is a strong example, using existing data to identify Communities of Concern. A similar tool that assesses the entire County would help ensure CAP funds are distributed in a way that advances environmental justice across all communities.

Thank you for your continued leadership on climate and equity. We urge you to take this important step toward ensuring accountability and fairness in implementing the CAP.

Thanks to your leadership, this board approved the creation of the San Diego County Arts and Culture Commission two years ago. However, the County's proposed budget for FY26 fails to include the Commission's budget as recommended by the Commission's own adopted resolution. We urge you to reconsider, allocating adequate resources to support the modern arts and culture agency that you envisioned and set in motion.

With a Commission created, operating with a full slate of commissioner representatives from all districts appointed and dully conducting business, we respectfully ask the Board of Supervisors to:

- Approve The Commission's <u>budgetary recommendation</u> for administrative expenses and capacity building in FY26 at ~\$350,000, as adopted by the appointed Commissioners.
- Instruct The Commission to <u>develop structured funding programs incentivized by the</u> <u>County's Strategic Plan</u> (from RFQ's to Final reporting protocols) for artists and non profit arts and culture organizations to be completed during FY26 for implementation in FY27.

Your vision and leadership has created the appropriate conditions to INVEST in Reimagining Vibrant Communities through Arts and Culture, just as the office of the CAO asserted in its 2021 Report on Arts and Culture. Failure to take action leaves resources on the table and results in the loss of an opportunity for communities to thrive at a time of uncertainty.

The 55% reported that marijuana was the first drug that they tried. 97% had marijuana in their possession in the last 30 days, and homelessness was attributed to24%. Arrestees said that there was drug use that contributed to their homelessness. So, while the County is trying to prevent homelessness, it is not addressing the factors that are contributing to it, and I wish that the County would start doing its job with providing the public health information on the harms of marijuana use instead of instead of promoting the opposite of that. It is going to be problematic for many of its residents. <b>[Q27 Verbal Comment]</b> The reason I was asking about ¡Más Fresco! plus is because I'm a recipient of that program, and they have, besides helping local farmers and low-income families, they have reversed my health issues. I was up in the hospital with life threatening issues every three months, because of poor diet caused my low income and through my nutritionist in most fresco plus I've lowered my cholesterol, my triglycerides, I balanced out my thyroid, and I've gotten my life back, and they've made it possible to have healthy fruits and vegetables on the table, which are too expensive for us, for people, and so for a relatively small amount compared to the rest of your budget, they could continue operating for another six months or a year, and it would really help the people who depend on it. Hi there. Jerry Hall here. Thank you for the opportunity to give feedback here. I've been familiar with the budgeting process for over a decade, so I understand the fundamentals, I believe. But some process concerns or recommendations are what I was hoping to share. One is, when we get the recommended budget from the CAO's office, it largely includes, from my perspective of BHS, that the budget that gets submitted is what ends up getting approved. And there may be a \$20,000, \$50,000 sway, but largely the plan is set, and the budget is approved. The public comments are heard and appreciated, and we move on. My concern is that we are involved in the planning process, not the planning approval process. And by that, I mean, reviewing the outcomes, and helping decide what strategies to take when we attack which problems the community prioritizes. And the second thing is that, we need to be involved much sooner. Also, we need line-item detail in plans. So, when we get the recommended budget, it basically shows that the amount spent, but there's not really operational plans that are published from the different departments that I can find online anyway. So, that's only going to happen if the County is more transparent and engages the community earlier in the process, in the actual planning cycle, rather than just at the end. Thank you very much. Those living in nursing facilities who have dementia or cognitive impairments are often unable to advocate for themselves and rely heavily on safety nets such as Ombudsman intervention to ensure they are being treated with dignity and care. The quality of care offered through San Diego County nursing homes has not improved following the pandemic and continues to be of great concern to those who work with older adults.
