

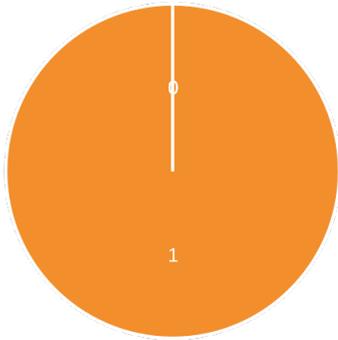


Overall Sentiment

Single source on a service contract is not good. Americhoice is a branch of United Health Care (UHC,) a big organization which tends not to prioritize individual needs. In particular, UHC, the largest health insurance provider in the US, is using an AI algorithm called nH Predict whose wildly inaccurate predictions are being used to deny health coverage to severely ill patients by cutting the time they can spend in extended care, a new lawsuit alleges, resulting in at least 2 deaths.

UHC patient reviews are predominantly negative across consumer rating platforms like ConsumerAffairs and Trustpilot (both rate it 1.3 out of 5.) Users report many claim denials, long waits for customer service, and difficulty navigating coverage, notes ConsumerAffairs. Yelp rates UHC 1.5 out of 5.

UHC may have been good 30 years ago, but it's now big pharma. Looking at the jail & Foster Care patients in the County, one wonders how many deaths could have been avoided. No to UHC under any other name.
