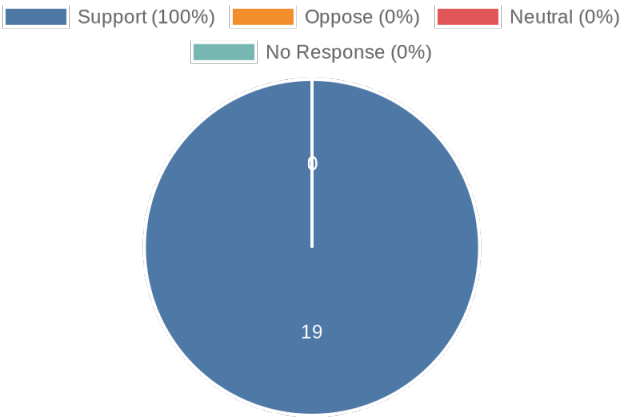

Overall Sentiment

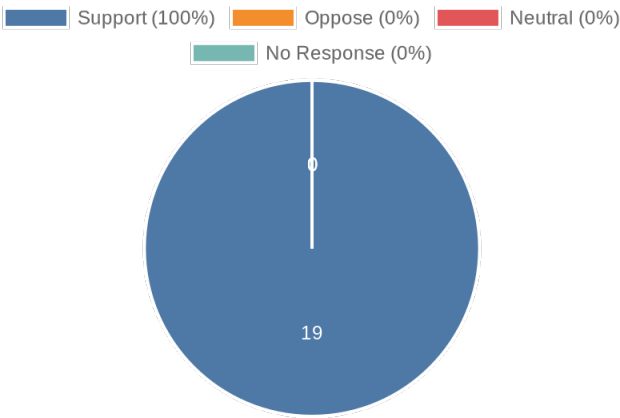

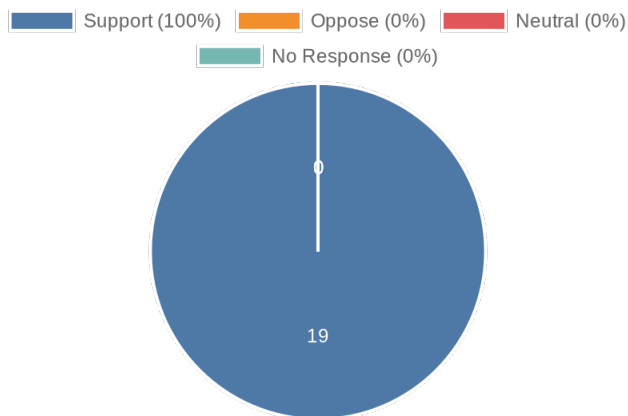
