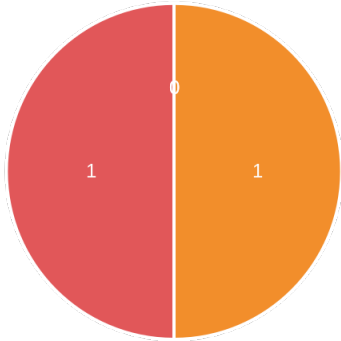
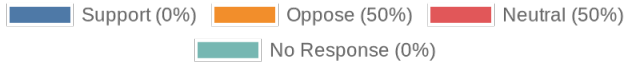

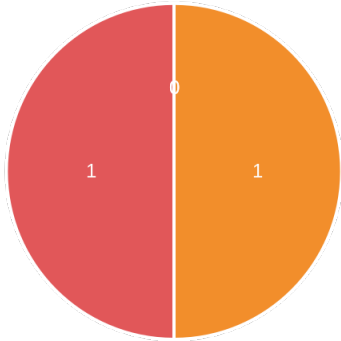

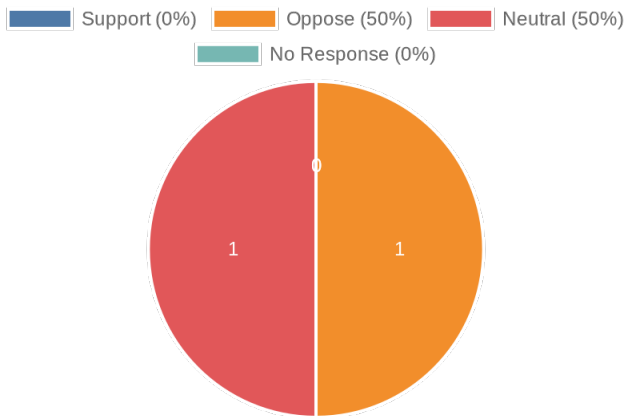

Supervisor Anderson's PRA proposal is process reform dressed as transparency reform. On the County's own numbers, 21% of 12,707 requests missed the statutory 10-day deadline — and that's before the complex, politically sensitive requests journalists keep suing to obtain. Two weeks before this item was filed, Voice of San Diego sued the County again, with its attorney stating the County "regularly engages in unlawful obstruction." The proposal's answer? Route every request through County Counsel — the same office that defends the County in PRA litigation. Asking the County's litigation shop to decide what gets released is asking the fox to audit the henhouse.

No deadlines for legal review. No public metrics. No consequences for non-compliance. No independent reviewer. The State Legislature — cited as a model — isn't even subject to the PRA.

Real reform means independence, enforceable deadlines, and a presumption of disclosure. This isn't that.
