The project consists of the construction, installation and equipping of a new 60-unit senior housing facility located at 3459 Manchester Avenue, Cardiff-by-the-Sea, California 92007.

ATTACHMENT B: DESCRIPTION OF APPLICANT

Please provide a brief history of the development of the business; and current and future business activities.

In 1979 Saints Constantine and Helen Greek Orthodox Church (the "Church") held church services and Sunday school, weddings and baptisms, in the cafeteria of a local junior high school until the Church purchased and developed a five acre parcel of land on which the existing apartments and Senior Center were built under the auspices of Cardiff Orthodox Housing Foundation (the "Borrower"). The Senior Center was used for all religious services until the present church was built in 1986. The senior housing was managed by Cardiff Orthodox Housing Foundation until recently when RA Snyder Management Company was hired to manage the apartments. The Borrower will operate the new senior housing for the Church, which will be occupied by residents of the San Diego area.

ATTACHMENT C: SUMMARY OF PROJECT PUBLIC BENEFITS

The project will provide significant benefit through the much needed low-income housing to be provided to the local community. In addition, the Church has a long and rich tradition of providing meaningful contributions to the local community and beyond.

Philoptochos, one of the largest women's charitable organizations in the U.S., is the heart of the Greek Orthodox Church and has a major impact within the Church, the local community, the country and the world. Philoptochos is philanthropy, fellowship and faith put into action. The Parish community strives to live the message of Saint James that faith, without good works, is dead.

The local chapter of Saint Helen Philoptochosm was established in 1979 and consists of women in the Parish whose main objectives are of a charitable and philanthropic nature. Men participate as associate members. The Parish's mission is to help the poor, the destitute, the hungry, the aged, the sick, the unemployed, the orphaned, the imprisoned, the widowed, the handicapped, the victims of disasters, and to undertake the burial of impoverished persons, and to offer assistance to anyone who may need the help of the Church through fund raising efforts.

The Church is striving to increase its involvement in social/moral issues such as human trafficking, child abuse, domestic violence, homelessness, pornography, substance abuse, and the needs of aged. Some of the causes and organizations that the Church has supported in the past include:
