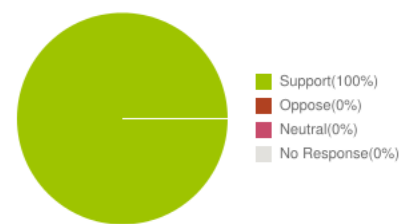

#### Overall Sentiment



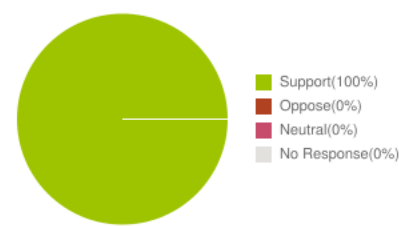

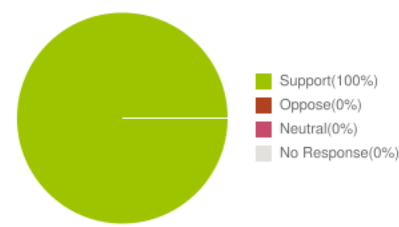
