BACKGROUND: KEY IMMIGRATION-RELATED LEGISLATION

TRUST ACT (AB 4)

- Prohibits a law enforcement official, from detaining an individual on the basis of an ICE hold after that individual becomes eligible for release from custody, unless that individual has been convicted of or charged with specified crimes

TRUTH ACT (AB 2792)

- Requires local law enforcement agencies, prior to an interview between ICE and an individual in custody, to provide the individual a written consent form, among other provisions.
- Requires the local governing body to hold a public community forum during the following year, as specified, to provide information to the public about ICE's access to individuals

VALUES ACT (SB 54)

- Prohibits state and local law enforcement from holding individuals on the basis of federal immigration detainers, or transferring them into federal custody, unless they've been convicted in the last 15 years for one of a list of 31 crimes, or are a registered sex offender: if not, they may only be held with a warrant from a federal judge
- Prohibits state and local law enforcement from asking anyone about their immigration status
- Prevents agencies from using their resources to investigate, interrogate, detain, detect, or arrest people for immigration enforcement purposes

JAIL PROTOCOLS AS IT RELATES TO U.S. IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS ENFORCEMENT (ICE)

▶ Outside law enforcement agencies, including Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agents, do not have free access to any Sheriff's facilities or jails.

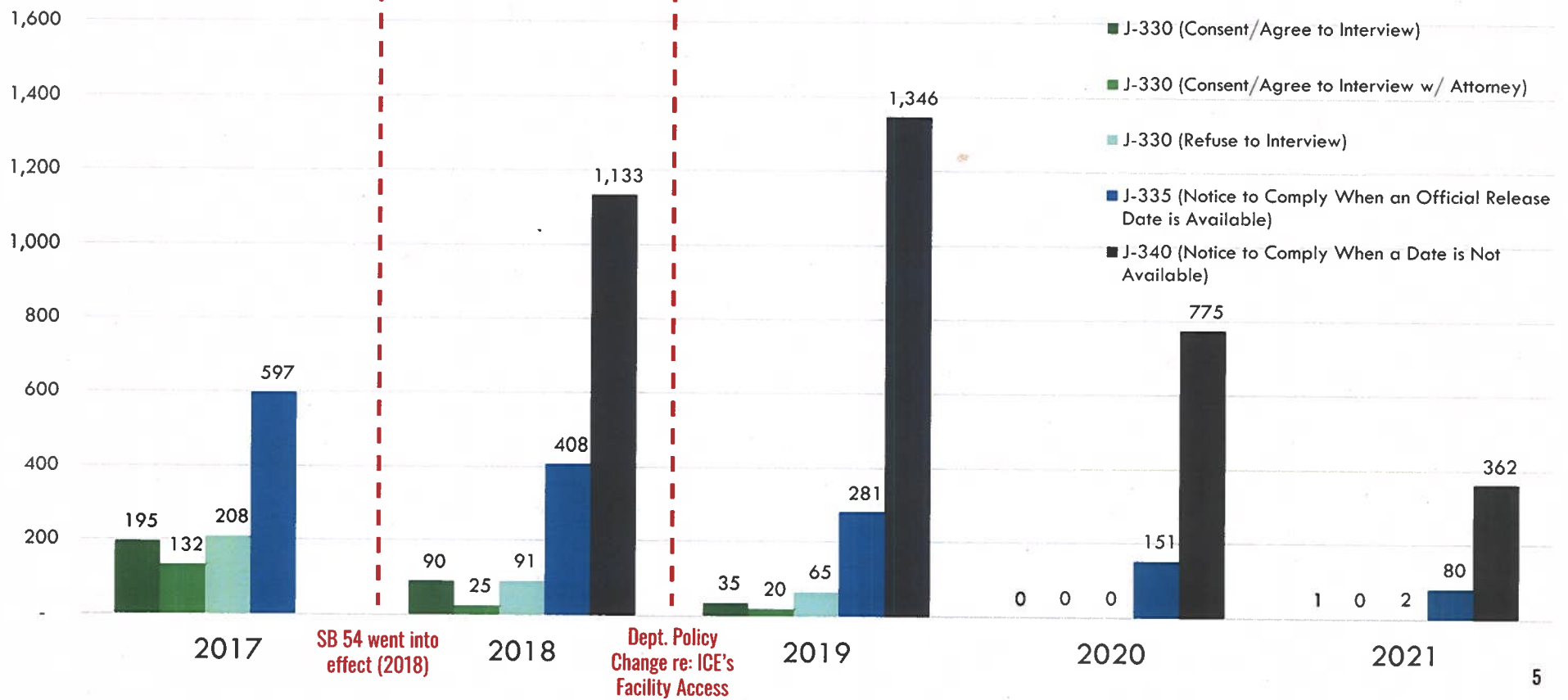
- ICE is required to check in via the primary entrance point and follow professional visitor guidelines

▶ The Sheriff's Department will not transfer an individual to immigration authorities unless authorized by a judicial warrant or based upon a qualifying conviction as per state law.

▶ ICE is required to complete the following form(s) depending on its interest in release information or interview requests:

- J-330: Incarcerated Person receives form to consent/agree to an ICE interview alone, with an attorney, or refusal
- J-335: Notice of Intent to comply with ICE request and provide release date
- J-340: Notice to Incarcerated Person of ICE Request and Intent to Notify

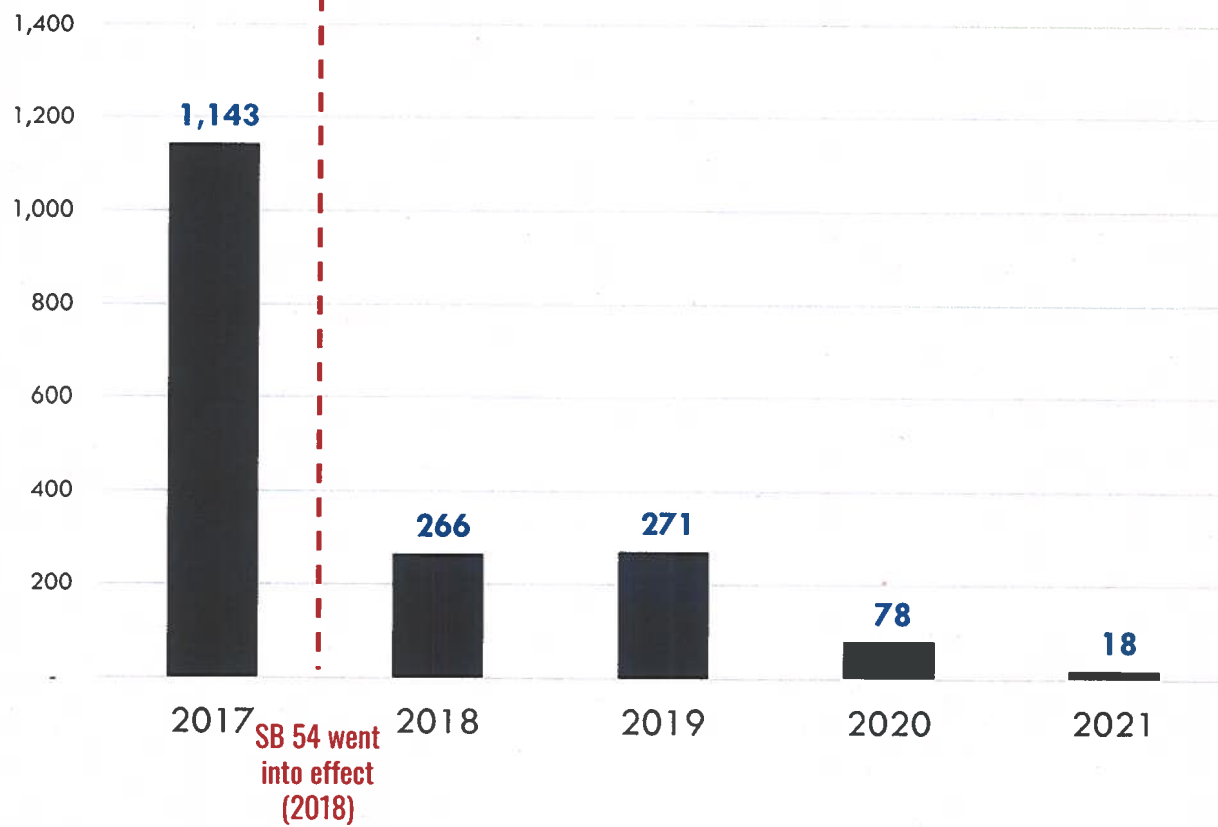

- ▶ Updated department protocols, policies & procedures based on dialogue from the community
 - Removed the daily public posting report of release dates from website
 - Limited ICE's access to facilities
- ▶ Updated ICE Interview Consent Forms in added threshold languages
- ▶ Received 100% compliance rate from the San Diego Immigrant Rights Consortium based on their report *"SB 54 Implementation: Three Years Later"*
- ▶ Transparent data portal for immigration-related reports, jail transfers, and ICE interview requests
 - Continued data sharing to the public and SDIRC to increase transparency and trust that individuals were transferred to ICE based on SB 54's time limitations and statues.
- ▶ Detentions Processing Division implemented electronic tracking and audit systems to uphold accountability

ANTECEDENTES: LEGISLACIÓN CLAVE RELACIONADA CON LA INMIGRACIÓN

LEY TRUTH (AB 4)

- Prohíbe a un miembro de las fuerzas de seguridad, detener a un individuo sobre la base de una retención del ICE después de que ese individuo sea elegible para ser liberado de la custodia, a menos que ese individuo haya sido condenado o acusado de delitos específicos.

LEY TRUTH (AB 2792)

- Requiere que las agencias locales de cumplimiento de la ley, antes de una entrevista entre el ICE y un individuo bajo custodia, proporcionen al individuo un formulario de consentimiento por escrito, entre otras disposiciones.
- Requiere que el cuerpo gobernante local celebre un foro comunitario público durante el año siguiente, según se especifique, para proporcionar información al público sobre el acceso del ICE a las personas.

LEY DE VALORES (SB 54)

- Prohíbe a las fuerzas del orden público estatales y locales retener a individuos sobre la base de órdenes de detención federales de inmigración, o transferirlos a custodia federal, a menos que hayan sido condenados en los últimos 15 años por uno de una lista de 31 delitos, o sean delincuentes sexuales registrados: de lo contrario, solo pueden ser detenidos con una orden de un juez federal.
- Prohíbe a las autoridades estatales y locales preguntar a alguien sobre su estatus migratorio.
- Previene que los organismos utilicen sus recursos para investigar, interrogar, detener, detectar o arrestar a personas con fines de control de la inmigración.

PROTOCOLOS CARCELARIOS EN RELACIÓN CON EL SERVICIO DE INMIGRACIÓN Y CONTROL DE ADUANAS (ICE) DE LOS EE. UU.

Las agencias de aplicación de la ley externas, incluidos los agentes de Inmigración y Control de Aduanas (Immigration and Customs Enforcement, ICE), no tienen acceso libre a las instalaciones o cárceles del alguacil.

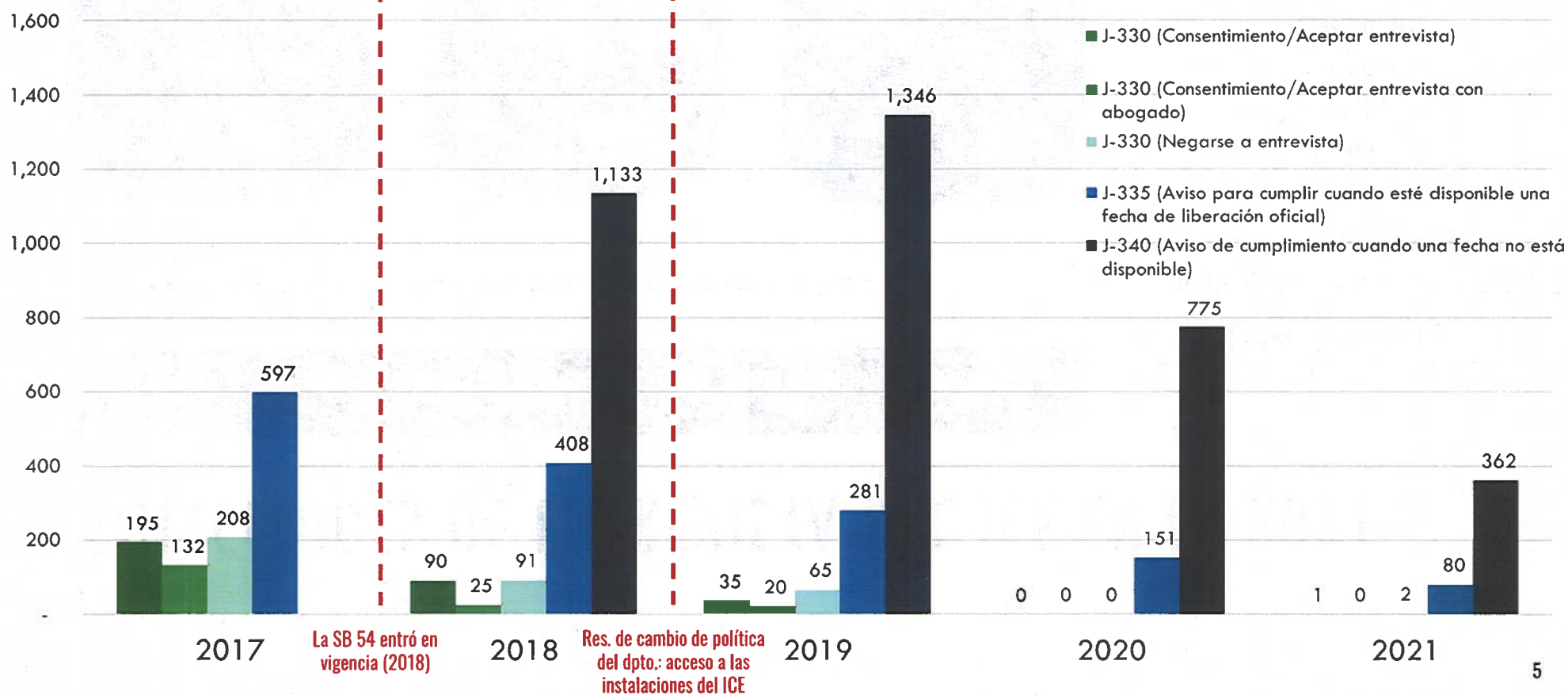
- Deberán registrarse en el punto de entrada principal del inmueble y seguir protocolos profesionales para visitantes.

El Departamento del Alguacil no transferirá a un individuo a las autoridades de inmigración a menos que lo autorice una orden judicial, o en una condena calificada según la ley estatal.

Se requiere que el ICE complete los siguientes formularios dependiendo de su interés en la información de divulgación o solicitudes de entrevista:

- J-330: La persona encarcelada recibe formulario para dar su consentimiento/aceptación de una entrevista del ICE solo, con un abogado o bien, negarse a ello.
- J-335: Aviso de intención de cumplir con la solicitud del ICE y proporcionar fecha de liberación
- J-340: Aviso a la persona reclusa, de la solicitud del ICE y la intención de notificar

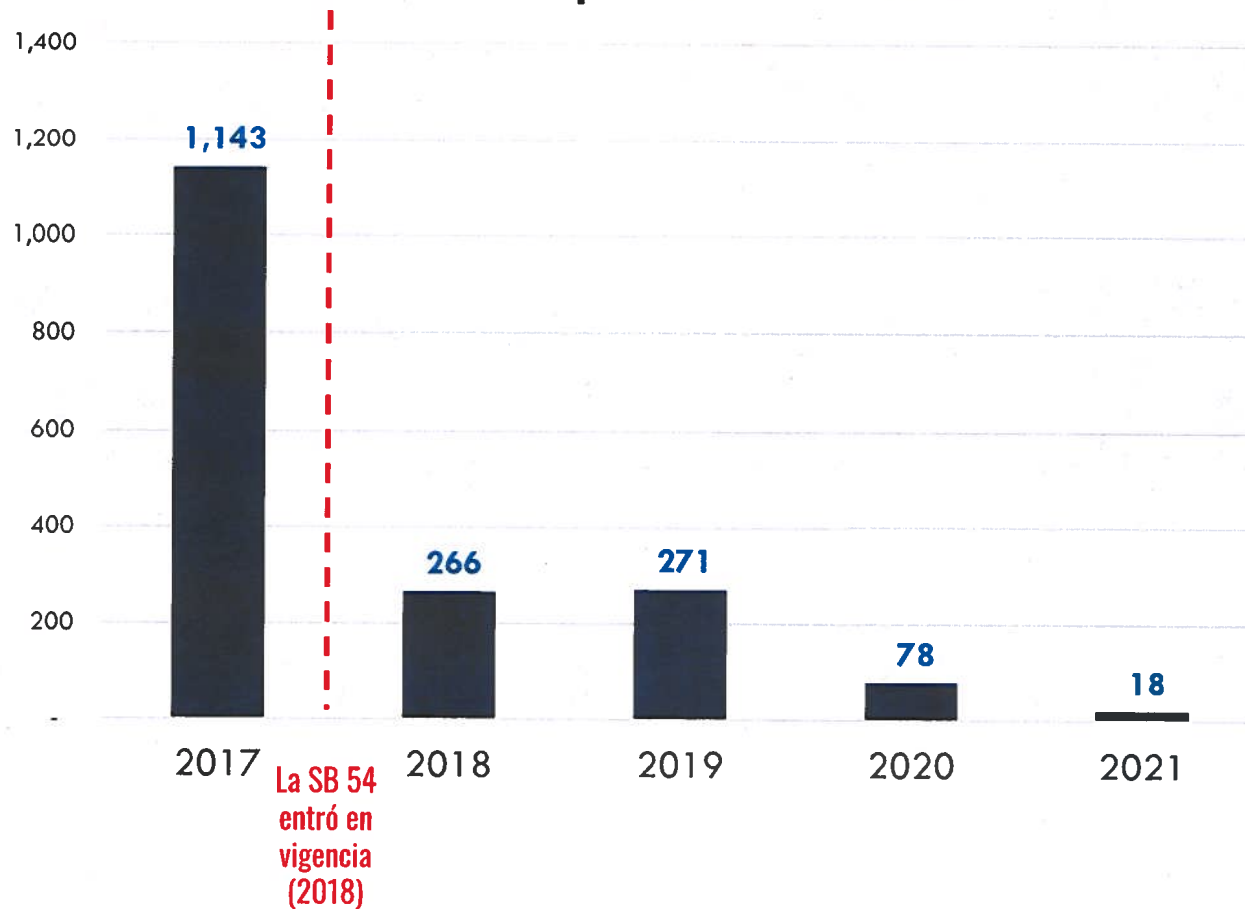

Dear Chair Fletcher and Supervisors Vargas, Anderson, Lawson-Remer, and Desmond:

The League of Women Voters is a strong proponent of government transparency and we commend the Board of Supervisors for holding a TRUTH Act Forum to provide the public with information about San Diego Sheriff Department's (SDSD) interactions with ICE.

The League of Women Voters believes that immigration policies should promote reunification of immediate families. We urge SDSD to stop separating families through ICE transfers and notifications and access to county property, including parking lots.

In addition, the League of Women Voters encourages cities and counties to enact privacy and technology-use ordinances that protect privacy and other civil liberties. San Diego County currently uses Automated License Plate Readers. SDSD shares this information with 4 other agencies and the LEARN database with little oversight as to what information ICE or other immigration agencies receive. We recommend that SDSD limit data sharing to the San Diego County shared database, ARJIS.

The League of Women Voters also supports law enforcement policies that build public trust and positive community relationships between police and community members. Community members are less likely to call local law enforcement if they believe a loved one might end up in ICE or Border Patrol Custody.

San Diego County Sheriff: STOP deporting our neighbors and separating families.

The San Diego Sheriff Department (SDSD) is colluding with DHS/ICE by transferring individuals to ICE, notifying ICE when individuals are released from jail, allowing DHS/ICE access to county property and to individuals in their custody, participating on joint task forces with DHS/ICE, and sharing information, data and resources with DHS/ICE.

This collusion with DHS/ICE has resulted in the deportation and detention of 98 community members this year alone, and the separation of families in our region. This harms our communities, and runs counter to the County's commitments to racial equity and inclusion. SDSD collusion with DHS/ICE must stop immediately.

Seven other counties in California (Contra Costa, Humboldt, Los Angeles, San Francisco, San Joaquin, San Mateo and Santa Clara) have already recognized the harm that collusion with DHS/ICE causes, and have chosen to stop ICE transfers and notifications. It is time for San Diego to join them.

We call upon Interim Sheriff Anthony Ray, Undersheriff Kelly Martinez and the Board of Supervisors to take the following immediate steps towards stopping collusion with DHS/ICE TODAY:

1. STOP transferring individuals to ICE and notifying ICE when individuals are released from jail (ICE transfers and notifications).
2. STOP allowing DHS/ICE access to county property, including parking lots.
