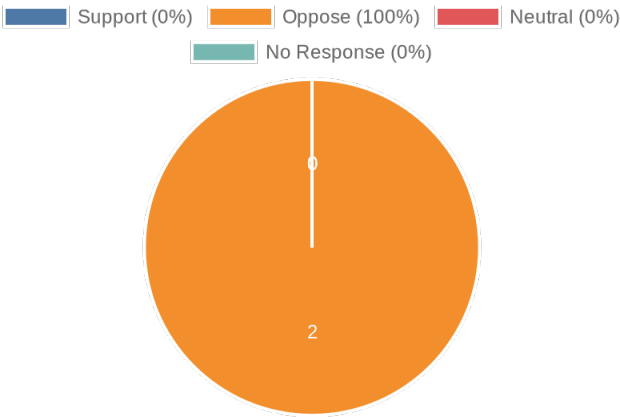

Overall Sentiment

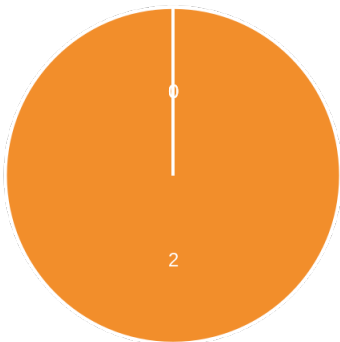
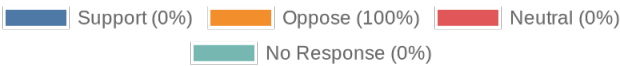

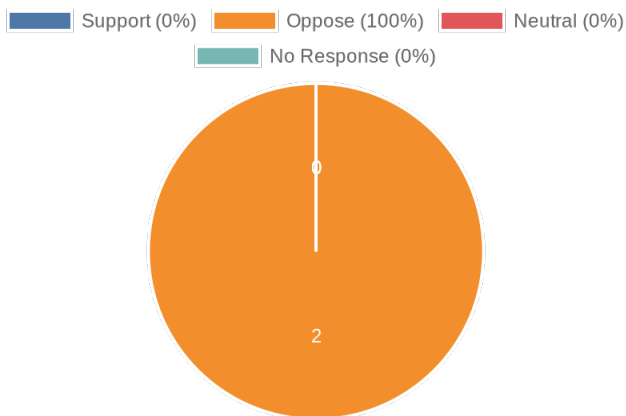
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Overall Sentiment

Per KPBS Published May 1, 2026 at 5:59 PM PDT: On Jan. 29, staff and volunteers recorded 9,803 people experiencing homelessness throughout the county. That's down by 102 people compared with last year. Nothing is working. But is that the plan?

If anything, this idea is premature. The Board letter says 'Today's action directs the Chief Administrative Officer to expand the CalAIM pilot across the full OHS Regional Homeless Services team.' The pilot is designed to help counties build the billing infrastructure, data systems, and staff training. So it seems that it does not ramp up the actual homeless services.

The letter continues: ' Every dollar the healthcare system contributes to this work is a dollar the County can direct toward other services. This is not correct since the program requires a 50% match. In essence, the grant would offset a portion of the money the County would pay for this. So the grant in question would be for \$1.7 mil and the county would contribute \$1.8 mil according to the letter so that the County would essentially be paying \$1 mil.

The Board letter does not mention how successful (or not) the CalAIM pilot is. We should know this before you

approve this grant.
