




Overall Sentiment

State legislators are considering raising the tax (DTT) to transfer a home by a huge amount, which would be a disaster.

Proposals to raise the statewide default rate from \$0.55 to \$30.55 would result in a 5,455% increase of the DTT. The \$1,100 one would pay on a \$1 million home would suddenly become \$61,100. It would dramatically increase the price of not just single-family homes, but office space, commercial space, and multifamily housing, which could have unintended consequences on our local economy.

I also think that payroll taxes should be set by the State and should not vary from County to County. That would be one more source of confusion for a business which wants to move or expand within the State, like a small business wanting to open up a shop in Orange County.

So while these proposals have not resulted in legislation yet, it would not be bad to include them in your legislative program and be more prepared if they do.
