Dear Supervisor Anderson and Members of the Board,

I am a San Diego County resident in 92071, and I am writing to oppose the proposed charter change that would extend County Supervisor term limits from two four-year terms to three four-year terms.

San Diego County voters already made their position clear when they approved two-term limits for supervisors. I do not believe the Board should use a charter reform package to extend its own eligibility for office.

I support transparency, accountability, ethics oversight, and good-government reforms, but extending supervisor term limits should not be bundled into those reforms. If the County wants to improve oversight, budgeting, ethics, or auditing, those items should move forward separately without weakening the term limits voters approved.

Please vote no on any proposal that increases County Supervisor term limits from eight years to twelve years. At minimum, please separate the term-limit extension from the rest of the charter reform package so voters are not forced to accept longer terms in order to support unrelated reforms.
