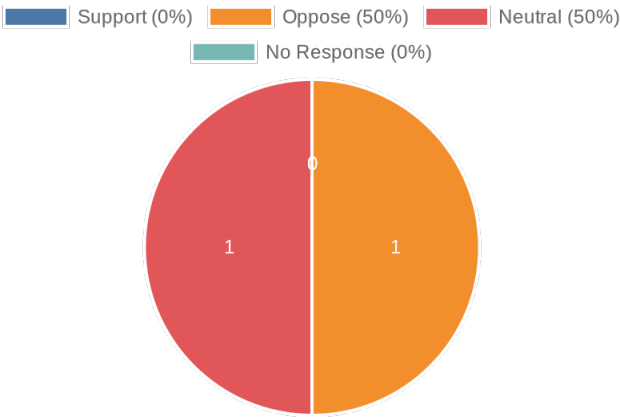

Overall Sentiment

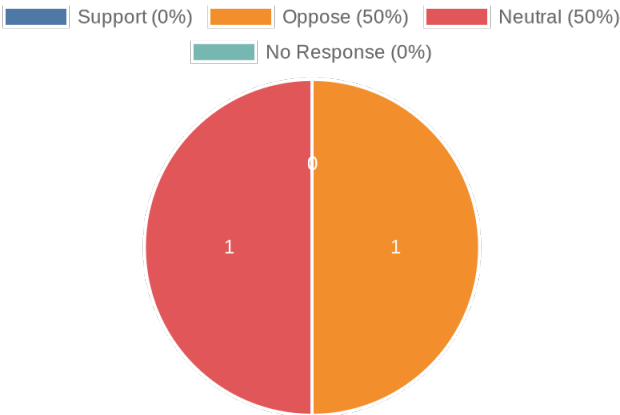

Sentiments for All Agenda Items

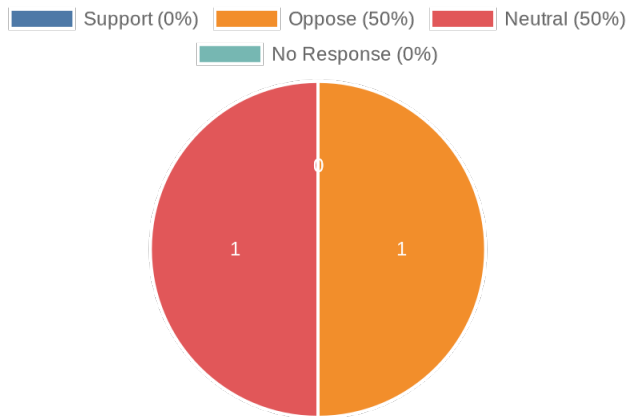
