**PAST GRAND JURORS ASSOCIATION IMPLEMENTATION REVIEW COMMITTEE  
– 2026 ANNUAL REPORT**

Attached is a copy of the Past Grand Jurors Association Implementation Review Committee's (PGJAIRC) 2026 Annual Report. The County of San Diego (County) Administrative Code, Section 82.34(f), Article III c, requires that this report be submitted to the Board of Supervisors by December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year. The PGJAIRC reviews recommendations issued in the previous year's Grand Jury reports. The 2024–25 Grand Jury issued two reports concerning the County, resulting in the PGJAIRC's review of eight recommendations. The committee found that two recommendations have been implemented and four have been partially implemented.

The PGJAIRC also reviewed one carryover item from the 2022–23 Grand Jury report, "*Sheriff's Department Incarcerated Persons' Welfare Fund*," and determined that the recommendation has been implemented.

Additionally, the committee recommends carrying over one recommendation that remains in progress from the Grand Jury report, "*Performance Indicators Displayed on a Publicly Accessible Dashboard May Be Beneficial in Lowering Death Rate in Jails*," filed August 8, 2025:

- **R3:** Develop system-wide jail metrics to be used as performance indicators for CQI purposes targeting incarcerated persons grievances.

The 2027 PGJAIRC will follow up with the Sheriff's Office to determine whether additional steps have been taken to implement this carryover recommendation and will report back on its status. The County appreciates the efforts of the members of the PGJAIRC and their commitment to effective government.

## 2022 - 23 GRAND JURY REPORT CARRYOVER RECOMMENDATIONS

### **“Sheriff’s Department Incarcerated Persons’ Welfare Fund” Filed July 27, 2023**

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

**23-75:** Expand membership of the Incarcerated Persons’ Welfare Committee (IPWC) to at least 3 qualified civilian members, especially those with academic or specific interests involving the re-entry of incarcerated individuals into society. Include formerly incarcerated individuals or those with incarcerated family members for consideration.

**Response: The recommendation has been implemented.** The Sheriff’s Department has expanded the language in the By-Laws and Operating Procedures to allow additional civilian appointees and is actively identifying additional members.

**PGJAIRC Member Comments from the Department Update on August 7, 2024. This recommendation is in the process of being implemented.** The Commander said the by-laws have been updated and the Department was in the process of vetting new members. This recommendation will be carried over in order to further review implementation as the response from the Department indicated they have not added 3 qualified civilian members.

**PGJAIRC Member Comments from the Department Update on March 5, 2025. This recommendation has not been implemented.** The Sheriff’s Office response was that three individuals were interviewed, and one was accepted. That person has not completed the background package. The Sheriff’s Office responded that Reentry Services is actively looking for additional members. However, this recommendation came out in 2023. Despite the San Diego Sheriff’s Office initial response, we are concerned that it has been 18 months, and no one has been confirmed. The Sheriff’s Office response was that they were “actively identifying additional members.

**PGJAIRC Member Comments from the Department Update on April 1, 2026. This recommendation has been implemented.** The Sheriff’s Office Incarcerated Persons’ Welfare Committee (IPWC) currently has three civilian members, including at least one individual who was previously incarcerated. The third member was onboarded on December 16, 2025.

## 2024 - 25 GRAND JURY RECOMMENDATIONS

### “Fire Country – Forging a United Defense in the Backcountry” Filed August 4, 2025

#### RECOMMENDATION

**R1:** Explore consolidation of additional willing FPDs to improve overall efficiency and community safety

**Response:** This recommendation requires further analysis. The County of San Diego cannot respond on behalf of other agencies. Consolidation could be explored if an independent fire protection district takes action to file an application for dissolution with the Local Agency Formation Commission and the San Diego County Board of Supervisors supports expanding the boundary of the San Diego County Fire Protection District.

**PGJAIRC Member Comment from the Department Update on February 4, 2026:** This recommendation will not be implemented. The San Diego County Fire Department states that “consolidation would require district-initiated LAFCO Action” which cannot be initiated by the County for other Fire Protection Districts (FPDs).

**R2:** Lead an effort with current FPDs to standardize defensible space requirements and controlled burn permitting across the unincorporated areas.

**Response:** This recommendation requires further analysis. The County of San Diego cannot respond on behalf of other agencies. Every three years the San Diego County Consolidated Fire Code is updated. To promote consistency across the unincorporated area, San Diego County Fire leads recurring meetings of fire protection district fire marshals to minimize fire code differences between agencies. In 2025, San Diego County Fire will explore this recommendation with the fire marshals, but it will be up to each independent fire protection district to take action.

**PGJAIRC Member Comment from the Department Update on February 4, 2026:** This recommendation has been partially implemented. County Fire convenes fire marshals to promote consistency, but each fire district must determine its own actions. The majority of fire districts have chosen not to consolidate.

**R3:** Increase cooperation with FPDs (and their respective fire safety councils) to maximize opportunities for homeowners and communities to meet wildfire hardening standards, receive home inspections, and enhance access to fire insurance.

**Response:** This recommendation requires further analysis. The County of San Diego cannot respond on behalf of other agencies, including the California Department

of insurance, which has jurisdiction over access to fire insurance. In 2025, San Diego County Fire will engage with independent fire protection districts on opportunities to increase home hardening standards and home inspections, but it will be up to each independent fire protection district to take action.

**PGJAIRC Member Comment from the Department Update on February 4, 2026: This recommendation has been partially implemented.** County Fire will promote free home assessments, defensible space help, through grant-funded assistance, and maintain a strong Defensible Space Inspection program. County Fire offers homeowner education aligned with State and insurance-related wildfire mitigation guidance. However, County Fire has no jurisdiction over insurance.

**“Performance Indicators Displayed on a Publicly Accessible Dashboard May Be Beneficial in Lowering Death Rate in Jails”  
Filed August 8, 2025**

**RECOMMENDATION**

**R1:** Develop system-wide jail metrics to be used as performance indicators for CQI Purposes targeting incarcerated persons requests for medical/mental health services.

**Response: The recommendation has been implemented.** The Sheriff's Office already utilizes internal metrics to monitor and assess medical and mental health service requests submitted by individuals in custody as outlined in SOSO MSD Policy MSD.S.3. In alignment with the National Commission on Correctional Health Care (NCCHC) Standard J-E-07, California Code of Regulations Title 15 § 1202, and SOSO MSO Policy MSO.S.3, these metrics are being formalized and expanded into a standardized reporting structure designed to support system-wide performance monitoring, promote public transparency, and advance continuous quality improvement efforts.

Performance indicators related to access to care and timeliness are being further refined in accordance with MSD Policy MSD.S.3 - Non-Emergent Healthcare Requests and Sick Call, which reflects NCCHC J-E-07 standards. Currently, healthcare requests are submitted by incarcerated individuals and collected daily by healthcare staff from housing units. Each request is reviewed by a Registered Nurse (RN), who assesses for acuity and prioritizes based on clinical urgency. Individuals are to receive a face-to-face clinical encounter with an RN within 24 hours of request submission. As digital tablets are deployed across all facilities over the next 12-16 months, this process will transition to a fully digital format.

SDSO's broader CQI framework is guided by Medical Services Division Policy A.6.1, which establishes an Office-wide approach to quality improvement. This includes quarterly Quality Improvement Committee (QIC) meetings, performance benchmarking, health record audits, and outcome-based evaluations. Each metric is

ties to Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) such as accessibility, timeliness, effectiveness, efficiency, and patient safety. If performance falls below established thresholds, a structured root cause analysis is conducted, followed by the development and implementation of a corrective action plan. Progress is continuously monitored until sustained improvement is achieved.

All metrics and findings are reviewed quarterly by the MSD Quality Assurance/Quality Improvement (QA/QI) Committee. This multidisciplinary committee includes correctional healthcare leadership, custody command staff, medical and mental health providers, compliance officers, and administrative personnel. The committee ensures data-informed decision-making, identifies system-level deficiencies, and supports coordinated strategies to enhance the quality of care across all SOSO detention facilities.

In support of the Grand Jury's recommendation and as part of SDSO's transparency efforts, the Sheriff's Office is developing a public-facing webpage that will highlight key indicators related to medical and mental health service delivery within our jails. This initiative will allow the public to view and understand SDSO's performance metrics and continuous improvement efforts, even as the Sheriff's Office works toward longer-term technical solutions such as an integrated dashboard display.

**PGJAIRC Member Comment from the Department Update on April 1, 2026: This recommendation has been implemented.** In September 2025, the SDSO transitioned from a Quality Assurance/Quality Improvement (QA/QI) approach to a Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) model to monitor and assure medical and mental health services. According to the SDSO, "the CQI model focuses on strengthening, reinforcing, and improving health services", and establishing thresholds to be achieved. In December 2025, a centralized cue was implemented for health service requests. SDSO expects that this system should become more robust within the next year. In addition, there are quarterly CQI meetings to review the metrics.

**R2:** Develop system-wide jail metrics to be used as performance indicators for CQI purposes targeting MAT programming.

**Response: The recommendation has been implemented.** The Sheriff's Office has already established performance metrics for the Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) program and recognizes the value of further strengthening these efforts. In alignment with the Grand Jury's recommendation, SOSO will enhance its existing Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) framework by incorporating additional best practices and performance indicators.

To support this initiative, SOSO will implement the Medication-Assisted Treatment for Opioid Use Disorder in Jails and Prisons: A Planning and Implementation Toolkit, published by the National Council for Mental Wellbeing and referenced in the Grand Jury Report. This resource includes recommended data elements, evaluation

templates, and sample formulas to assess the effectiveness of MAT programs in correctional settings.

Using the toolkit as a foundation, SOSO will refine its data collection, auditing, and reporting processes in coordination with contracted healthcare providers and IT partners. These enhanced performance indicators will be reviewed during monthly meetings and reported quarterly to the Medical Services Division (MSD) Quality Assurance/Quality Improvement (QA/QI) Committee. Full integration of these improvements is expected within six months.

**PGJAIRC Member Comment from the Department Update on April 1, 2026:** **This recommendation has been implemented.** The SDSO has reviewed and incorporated several suggested metrics from the “Medication-Assisted Treatment for Opioid Use Disorder in Jails and Prisons: Planning and Implementation Toolkit” published by the National Council for Mental Wellbeing. Further, the SDSO has plans to open MAT for incarcerated individuals with addictions at 2 facilities this year.

**R3:** Develop system-wide jail metrics to be used as performance indicators for CQI purposes targeting incarcerated persons grievances.

**Response:** **The recommendation has not yet been implemented, but will be implemented in the future, with a targeted completion date of July 2026.** The Sheriff’s Office concurs with the Grand Jury’s recommendation to establish formal performance indicators to support Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) in the management of incarcerated person grievances. Currently, processes and technology improvements are underway to create a digital tracking and CQI mechanism for grievances. These improvements are expected to be fully implemented in 2026.

Developing standardized metrics will enhance SDSO’s ability to identify trends, address systemic concerns, and ensure timely and consistent resolution of grievances.

At present, SOSO operates a paper-based grievance process governed by SOSO OSB Policy N.1, which outlines procedures for grievance submission, review, and resolution timelines. Facility staff are responsible for logging, tracking, and responding to grievances in accordance with policy requirements. Supervisors review grievance patterns through regular audits and operational oversight. While this process incorporates basic accountability measures, SOSO acknowledges the need for more comprehensive data analytics, real-time visibility, and system-wide integration.

To modernize and strengthen grievance handling, SOSO is partnering with Smart Communications to implement a digital grievance submission system via handheld tablets. These devices will allow incarcerated individuals to file grievances electronically, enabling immediate submission, real-time tracking, and automated performance monitoring. This digital platform will improve transparency, efficiency, and response oversight across all detention facilities.

Tablets have already been deployed at the East Mesa Reentry Facility, and phased implementation is currently underway at other facilities. Full deployment is contingent upon necessary infrastructure upgrades, including power access, Wi-Fi connectivity, charging stations, and integration with the Jail Information Management System (JIMS).

Full implementation of the Smart Communications tablet system, along with integration of grievance-related performance metrics into SOSO's CQI framework, is expected within the next 12 months. In the interim, SOSO remains committed to ensuring accountability and responsiveness through the continued enforcement of policy-driven procedures and supervisory oversight.

**PGJAIRC Member Comment from the Department Update on April 1, 2026:** **This recommendation has been partially implemented.** The SDSO now records grievances by type of grievance to better monitor timeliness and outcomes. They are partnering with SMART Communication to launch a digital grievance submission system using handheld tablets. This system will eventually offer multiple languages. However, paper-based grievances will be available for those individuals who need them.

**This recommendation will be carried over in order to further review implementation.**

**R4:** Develop metrics to be used as performance indicators for CQI purposes targeting safety checks and the review of all safety checks by every level of command. These metrics shall be developed using aggregate data throughout the jail system.

**Response:** The recommendation will be implemented in the future, with a targeted completion date of October 2025. The Sheriff's Office agrees with the Grand Jury's recommendation to develop performance indicators that support Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) in the conduct and oversight of safety checks. Establishing standardized, system-wide metrics will improve SDSO's ability to monitor compliance, identify trends, and address operational deficiencies in a timely and effective manner. SOSO DSB Policy 1.64 is currently under review and revision, with an anticipated completion date of October 2025.

**PGJAIRC Member Comment from the Department Update on April 1, 2026:** **This recommendation has not been implemented.** Safety checks fall under the Division of Inspectional Services and are considered custodial operations. This division has its own auditing process to evaluate compliance, trends, and deficiencies. These audits are reviewed quarterly by the command staff. The current CQI model does not measure the performance of custodial operations.

**R5:** Implement a CQI dashboard display available to the public on the SDSO website. This dashboard shall include the following four jail functions:

- Incarcerated persons request for medical/mental health services
- Medication-assisted treatment for opioid use disorder
- Incarcerated persons grievances
- Safety checks

The dashboard shall also include all jail functions that have both custodial and healthcare functions.

**Response: This recommendation requires further analysis.** The Sheriff's Office supports the Grand Jury's recommendation to improve transparency by providing the public with access to key jail performance metrics. While SOSO agrees with the intent to implement a public-facing CQI dashboard, several technical limitations currently impact our ability to consolidate real-time data across multiple systems. Performance data related to healthcare and custody functions are stored in separate platforms, which present challenges in creating an integrated, interactive dashboard in the near term.

Despite these limitations, SOSO is actively working to improve external reporting mechanisms. A comprehensive quarterly CQI report is currently in development and will be published on the SDSO public website within the next six months. This report will serve the purpose of enhancing transparency and public understanding of jail system performance as we work towards system integrations for the purpose of an interactive dashboard.

**PGJAIRC Member Comment from the Department Update on April 1, 2026:** The Jail Information Management System (JIMS) is over 25 years old and not able to accommodate all of these requests. Replacement of the system is cost-prohibitive, and there is currently no single system that can incorporate all of the listed functions. This Recommendation encompasses 4 specific areas requesting performance indicators be displayed on a publicly accessible dashboard. This recommendation has been partially implemented as follows:

1. Incarcerated persons' requests for general medical/mental health services. Beginning in January 2026, the SDSO Medical Services Division began publishing a quarterly report, available to the public at <https://www.sdsheriff.gov/home/showpublisheddocument/9822/639046014790000000>. **This recommendation has been implemented.**
2. Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for opioid use disorder. **This has been implemented.**
3. Incarcerated persons' grievances. **This has been partially implemented as explained previously herein.**
4. Safety checks and custodial functions. **This will not be implemented for reasons referenced previously.**

### **SIX MONTH UPDATE ON ECONOMIC PROSPERITY THROUGH INNOVATIVE CONTRACT EFFORTS**

On August 26, 2025 (29), the San Diego County Board of Supervisors (Board) approved comprehensive updates to the County of San Diego's (County) procurement guidelines to reduce barriers, increase access, and facilitate more effective collaboration with small-local businesses and nonprofits. This action reinforced the County's commitment to fostering a more inclusive and resilient regional economy where small businesses, nonprofits, and community-based enterprises can grow and thrive. As part of this effort, the Board established a goal for at least 25% of the County's contract spending to be directed to small-local businesses, aligning with California Assembly Bill (AB) 2019, and recognizing the critical role these enterprises play in job creation, community wealth-building, and inclusive economic development. By directing a significant share of its more than \$2 billion in annual purchasing toward small and diverse businesses, the County strives to strengthen local capacity, retain economic value within the region, and support long-term community prosperity. The updated procurement policies went into effect on September 25, 2025. Some of the changes these policies created include:

- Prioritizing local businesses.
- Expanding the definition of a small business to include nonprofits; veteran-owned and disabled veteran-owned businesses; businesses with other recognized small business certifications; and those that meet the criteria for certification, even if they are not yet certified.
- Increasing the preference in the Small-Local Business Preference Program from 5% to 15%.
- Expanding requirements for some contracts to sub-contract at least 3% of the total contract value with small-local businesses.
- Reviewing and refining requirements so that simpler, quicker procurement methods can be used more often which are often less resource intensive for small businesses.
- Increasing the limit for procurement that can be specifically set aside for small businesses and veteran owned businesses from \$100,000 to \$1,000,000 annually.
- Providing clearer guidance for the County to select products and vendors that are environmentally responsible.

## Six Month Update on Economic Prosperity Through Innovative Contract Efforts

Achieving the County's 25% spend target requires not only policy changes but also an internal culture shift, robust community engagement, programmatic support, and greater transparency and accountability. Building on the Chief Administrative Officer's directed initiative of Economic Prosperity through Innovative Contracting (EPIC), which concluded in November 2025, the County established the EPIC Integration Taskforce. This taskforce is an enterprise-wide, multidisciplinary team charged with embedding the County's vision for inclusive contracting into operational practices and organizational culture.

In the six months since the updated procurement policies went into effect, the County has undertaken many actions to drive the new inclusive contracting vision into practice. This memo provides an update on key activities, outcomes, and progress made during this period, highlighting the work underway to strengthen data systems and reporting, enhance internal communication and staff training, and deepen engagement with the small business community and stakeholders.

### *Data and Reporting Improvements*

Since the adoption of the revised procurement policies, significant effort has gone into aligning the County's multiple data systems to support accurate tracking and analysis of small-local business participation. Because the County's procurement portal contract monitoring and contract spend data are housed in separate applications, staff undertook an extensive effort to align and standardize information across systems to support implementation of the new policy framework. As part of the policy framework, the County implemented an intentional definition of a small local business to reduce barriers to entry and ensure more businesses can participate in contracting opportunities. This change, combined with improved data alignment and outreach efforts, contributes to the increase seen in current reported figures. The County is now able to generate more reliable estimates of small-local business spending.

Current calculations for FY25-26 indicate the spend is close to 25%, an increase from the previous baseline of approximately 12%. This figure has increased for a number of related reasons, including outreach efforts, the new small business definition, updated data compilation, and new procurement policies and procedures. While this percentage may shift month-to-month as new procurements occur, it remains aligned with our annual goal.

The updated demographic questions in BuyNet which were aligned with AB 2019 have been implemented, and outreach is underway to encourage existing vendors to update their profiles to strengthen the accuracy of the County's data. While the updated policies now require small-local subcontractor information to be collected for new contracts, no equivalent system existed for existing agreements. To address this gap, staff have initiated a pilot manual-data-collection process to establish a subcontractor baseline while long-term system enhancements are explored. Together, these improvements lay the foundation for a more robust data infrastructure, enabling clearer monitoring, transparent reporting, and future dashboard development to support data-informed decision-making.

### *Internal Training and Staff Capacity Building*

Over the past several months, staff have continued implementing the phased internal training and communication plan to ensure County employees are equipped to operationalize the new procurement policies. Training for Contracting Officer Representatives (CORs) has been updated to reflect revised procedures, templates, and policy requirements, and has now been integrated into the COR Academy, with

over 1,170 staff completing the new modules to date. As the individuals responsible for day-to-day contract management, CORs play a critical role in ensuring the County's inclusive contracting vision is carried out consistently and effectively. To further support staff across departments, the Department of Purchasing and Contracting (DPC) has continued hosting regular office hours that highlight key implementation topics, provide real-time guidance, and offer space to troubleshoot emerging issues. Existing resources, including manuals, handouts, and instructional material, have been updated to align with the new policy framework, and work is now underway to launch this summer a new suite of support tools, including sample language, decision matrices, and user-friendly guidance documents.

A Sustainability Hub was created to provide detailed content to support implementation of Board Policy B67: Environmentally Preferable Procurement and offers links to guidance for integrating equity, sustainability, and small local business considerations across procurement and contracting processes. These efforts reflect the County's commitment to strengthening communication, building internal capacity, and ensuring staff have clear, practical tools to successfully implement the updated procurement processes.

#### *Support for Small-Local Businesses and Engagement*

Partner engagement and external communication continue to be central to advancing the EPIC vision. On September 3, 2025, the County released the innovative Bonding and Underwriting Insurance for Local Development (BUILD) and Compliance, Operations and Readiness Education (CORE) pilot programs to address key barriers faced by small-local businesses. BUILD provides direct financial support to eligible firms that are otherwise ready to contract with the County but cannot meet the bonding or insurance financial requirements, while CORE offers expert-led administrative and bookkeeping assistance to help prevent labor violations and strengthen fair business practices across the region. Together with the enhanced Support, Training and Education for Procurement (STEP) program, which delivers hands-on technical assistance related to County procurements, these initiatives form a comprehensive support pathway for small-local businesses seeking to grow and enter the County contracting ecosystem. Since September 2025, the STEP program has hosted 11 technical assistance workshops to deepen contract readiness among small-local businesses. The BUILD and CORE pilots are anticipated to run through the end of Summer 2026, and staff expect to have initial outcome data available following the close of the pilot period. Since September 2025, the STEP program has assisted 64 small-local businesses with applying for County contracts and approximately 56 STEP participants have gone on to secure a County contract, demonstrating the tangible impact of these supports and the increasing accessibility of the procurement process.

To broaden awareness and strengthen relationships, the County has significantly expanded its presence in the business community over the past year. Staff have participated in a wide range of outreach events, hosted BuyNet Labs, and delivered presentations on the new contracting initiatives to local chambers, economic development organizations, small-business support partners, and other stakeholder groups. These activities have helped establish consistent channels for collaboration, increase visibility and understanding of the pilot programs, and reaffirm the County's commitment to building a more inclusive and accessible contracting environment for small-local businesses.

Although only a few months into implementation, the EPIC efforts are being widely recognized. In November 2025, the Sustainable Purchasing Leadership Council (SPLC) awarded the County a Leadership Award in Supplier Engagement for EPIC efforts. The SPLC is global nonprofit organization that empowers public and private organizations to develop and propel best practices in sustainable purchasing , to drive

positive social, economic, and environmental impact. The County also received an Award of Excellence in Programs and Promotions for EPIC from the California Association for Local Economic Development (CALED) in April 2025. CALED is the premier statewide professional economic development organization.

*Looking Ahead*

An internal resource hub, similar to the Sustainability Hub, is in development to provide staff with consolidated tools, sample language, and other guidance related to implementing the small-local business policies. External engagement efforts will also continue, with a focus on reaching additional small-local businesses and strengthening partnerships across the region. During this period, data collection and system refinements will remain a priority, particularly the work to expand subcontractor data reporting. While small-local subcontractor information is now collected for new contracts, the County is undertaking the largest data effort to date to capture a full baseline for existing agreements. It is anticipated that complete subcontractor data for FY 2025-26 will be gathered by the end of the summer. On August 26, 2025 (29), the Board directed the Chief Administrative Officer to report back annually in September of each year on the progress and outcomes achieved in the prior fiscal year. As subcontractor data will be a manual process occurring during the month of August, in order to allow sufficient time for data collection, cleaning, and analysis, staff will provide an update to the Board in early November 2026 with a comprehensive report detailing the first full year of implementation. **SUBJECT: THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SAN DIEGO  
AUTHORIZING SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND COMMUNITY COLLEGE  
DISTRICTS TO ISSUE AND SELL BONDS DIRECTLY, PURSUANT TO STATE  
LAW, APPROVING CERTAIN FORMS AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF  
SUCH DOCUMENTS (DISTRICTS: ALL)**

**OVERVIEW**

School Bonds (“Bonds”) are voter-approved long-term debt instruments which are secured by the legal obligation to levy and collect ad valorem property taxes sufficient to pay annual debt service on the bonds. Because these bonds are secured by the taxing power of the school or college district, they are considered to pose the lowest risk to the investor and, therefore, provide the lowest borrowing cost to the school or college district of any of the financing techniques available. Bonds have become the primary financing tool used by California school and community college districts (collectively referred to as “school districts”) to construct or improve school facilities. School districts also issue their own refunding bonds to reduce the debt service costs for previously issued general obligations or to eliminate or modify one or more restrictive provisions imposed on the school district by the refunded bonds.

In accordance with both Article 4.5 of Chapter 3 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the California Government (Government Code) and California Education Code Section 15140 (Education Code), school districts have the authority to issue bonds or refund bonds. Under the Education Code, bonds of school districts are offered for sale by the Board of Supervisors. However, the Education Code also permits the Board of Supervisors to authorize any school district within the County of San Diego which has not received a qualified or negative certification in its most recent interim report, to issue and sell bonds on its own behalf. This authority can be given on a per issuance basis or can be done on a broader basis in a single resolution for all issuances of bonds by school districts that meet the qualifications within its jurisdiction.

Today’s recommendation requests adoption of a single resolution to authorize the issuance of bonds by school districts in San Diego County that have not received a qualified or negative certification in its most recent interim report, authorize the Treasurer-Tax Collector to execute Paying Agent and Investment Management Agreements, where applicable, direct the Auditor and Controller to maintain the tax roll for these new money and refunding general obligation bonds, and authorize execution of such documents in connection with the issuance of general obligation bonds.

**EQUITY IMPACT STATEMENT**

The issuance of Bonds is a vital financing mechanism for school districts in our community. The proceeds from the voter approved bonds are used to provide much needed infrastructure and equipment to school districts that might not otherwise have the resources for the acquisition and/or construction of these public improvements. There is strong evidence that high-quality infrastructure facilitates better instruction, improves student outcomes, and reduces dropout rates, among other benefits. The proceeds of each bond issue by school and college districts with a positive certification will be used for purposes specified in the voter approved measure or proposition. To ensure bond proceeds are spent in accordance with Proposition 39, an oversight committee is established to update and advise the public on the status of the bond proceeds and the school district will conduct annual, independent performance and financial audits.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

The issuance of any new money general obligation bonds or refunding of general obligation bonds will be general obligations of that District to be paid from ad valorem property taxes levied within the boundaries of that school district, and do not constitute an obligation of the County.



**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SAN DIEGO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA,

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**RECITALS:**

WHEREAS, Sections 53506 et seq. of the Government Code of the State of California (the "Government Code"), including Section 53508.7 thereof, provide that a school district or community college district may issue and sell bonds on its own behalf at a public or private sale pursuant to Section 15140 or 15146 of the Education Code of the State of California (the "Education Code"); and

WHEREAS, Section 15146(a) of the Education Code provides that bonds of a school district or community college district shall be issued and sold pursuant to Section 15140 of the Education Code; and

WHEREAS, Section 15140(b) of the Education Code provides that, notwithstanding section 15140(a) of the Education Code requiring the Board of Supervisors of a county to sell bonds of a school district or community college district, the Board of Supervisors of a county may authorize a school district or community college district over which the County Superintendent of Schools has jurisdiction, and which has not received a qualified or negative certification in its most recent interim report, to issue and sell bonds on its own behalf without further action of the Board of Supervisors or officers of the county; and

WHEREAS, Section 15140(b) of the Education Code further provides that the county shall levy and collect taxes, pay bonds, and hold bond proceeds and tax funds for the bonds issued and sold pursuant to such provisions; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego (the "County") desires to make such procedures available to the school districts and community college districts of the County over which the superintendent of schools of the County has jurisdiction, subject to the limitations contained in said law; and

WHEREAS, to perform the responsibilities required by law, the County through the office of the Treasurer-Tax Collector of the County (the "Treasurer-Tax Collector") may serve as paying agent for the bonds, pursuant to a Paying Agent Agreement (the "Paying Agent Agreement"), by and between the school district or community college district and the County; and

WHEREAS, the County may designate such paying agent services be performed by a third-party paying agent as authorized under Education Code section 15232; and

WHEREAS, a school district or community college district may from time to time, authorize the issuance and sale of a series of general obligation refunding bonds pursuant to the provisions of Section 53550 et seq. of the Government Code of the State of California (the "Refunding Bonds") in order to refund all or a portion of bonds issued pursuant to the Education Code; and

WHEREAS, a school district or community college district may appoint the Treasurer-Tax Collector as the authenticating agent, bond registrar, transfer agent and paying agent for Refunding Bonds pursuant to the Paying Agent Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County, through the office of the Treasurer-Tax Collector, will manage the investment of proceeds of the bonds pursuant to an Investment Management Agreement (the "Investment Management Agreement"), by and between the school district or community college district and the County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SAN DIEGO AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1. Recitals.** On information and belief, all of the above recitals are true and correct.

**Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of this action is to permit any school districts and any community college districts meeting the qualifications set forth herein and in Education Code Section 15140(b) to issue and sell bonds on its own behalf pursuant to said section 15140(b), without further action by this Board of Supervisors of the County (the "Board of Supervisors") or any action of other officers of the County ; provided that such issuance and sale is coordinated with the Treasurer-Tax Collector, as set forth herein, which Treasurer-Tax Collector may act as paying agent and registrar for such bonds and shall manage the investment of proceeds of such bonds held in the County treasury.

**Section 3. Application of Education Code Section 15140(b); Requirement to Deliver Authorizing Resolution and Debt Schedules to the County.** This Board of Supervisors hereby declares that any school district or community college district under the jurisdiction of the Superintendent of Schools of the County may issue and sell bonds on its own behalf pursuant to Chapter 1 of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1 of the Education Code without further action of the Board of Supervisors or any officer of the County, subject to the following provisions:

(a) No school district or community college district that has received a qualified or negative certification in its most recent interim report (as defined in Article 3 of Chapter 6 of Part 24 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Education Code, or any successor law) shall be entitled to issue its bonds pursuant to the authority granted by this Resolution;

(b) Whenever the governing board of a school district or community college district issues bonds pursuant to the authority granted by this Resolution and by Section 15140(b) of the Education Code, or Sections 53508 and following, or refunding bonds pursuant to 53550 and following, or 53580 and following of the Government Code, the governing board of that school district or community college district shall be required to transmit a copy of the following to the Auditor and Controller's Office and the Treasurer-Tax Collector no later than one week after bonds are sold:

(i) its resolution authorizing the issuance and sale of the bonds;

(ii) the final debt service schedule for the bonds reflecting the principal amounts and interest rates of the bonds as determined in the sale of the bonds; and

(iii) where applicable, the debt service schedule for any bonds to be refunded; to the County Auditor and Controller and the Treasurer-Tax Collector, promptly after the bonds are sold and delivered, in order to permit the County to establish tax rates and necessary funds or accounts for the bonds.

**Section 4. County Responsibilities.** (a) The County, including the officers thereof and this Board of Supervisors, takes no responsibility for the proceedings for sale and issuance of the bonds of any school district or community college district authorized to issue bonds on its own behalf pursuant to Section 3 of this Resolution.

(b) The County shall levy and collect taxes, pay bonds, and hold bond proceeds and tax funds for bonds duly issued and sold by a school district or community college district pursuant to the authority granted by this Resolution, as otherwise required by law.

(c) The County, including the officers thereof and this Board of Supervisors, takes no responsibility for establishing a tax rate for any new issue of bonds of a school district or community college district, or reducing a tax rate for any outstanding issue of such bonds that may have been refunded, in any year in which the information required by Section 3(b) hereof to be delivered to the County officers is delivered later than the July 1<sup>st</sup> deadline established by such officers in order to permit compliance with Government Code Section 29100 and following.

**Section 5. Approval of Form of Paying Agent Agreement.** The bonds of a school district or community college district issued pursuant to the authority granted by this Resolution or the Refunding Bonds of a school or community college district may be issued using the form of Paying Agent Agreement, between the school district or community college district and the Treasurer-Tax Collector, as paying agent/registrar and transfer agent or such other entity specified by the Treasurer-Tax Collector, as paying agent, in substantially the form submitted to and on file with the Clerk of this Board of Supervisors, which is hereby approved. The Treasurer-Tax Collector, or a deputy or officer thereof (an "Authorized Officer"), is hereby authorized to execute and deliver an instrument or instruments in substantially said form, including supplements thereto, completed with the terms of such bonds determined upon the sale thereof, and with such other amendments which may be necessary.

**Section 6. Deposit and Investment of Proceeds and Approval of Form of Investment Management Agreement.** Except as otherwise provided by law, the proceeds of the sale of any bonds of a school district or community college district issued pursuant to the authority granted by this Resolution, exclusive of any premium and accrued interest received, shall be deposited in the County treasury to the credit of the building fund of the school district or community college district issuing such bonds and may be used for any authorized purpose, including, without limitation, the payment of issuance costs, pursuant to the terms and conditions of the authorizing resolution of the school district or community college district and of the Paying Agent Agreement in connection with the issuance and sale of such bonds. Any premium and accrued interest received by the school district or community college district on bonds that are not refunding bonds shall be deposited upon receipt in the interest and sinking fund of such school district or community college district within the County treasury.

The Treasurer-Tax Collector or any deputy thereof, or his or her designee, on behalf of the County is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Investment Management Agreement in substantially the form on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, which is hereby approved, including amendments which may be necessary.

Any bond funds invested outside the County Investment Pool (e.g., bond funds invested in an escrow account held by a third-party banking institution) are the sole responsibility of the school district or community college district, as applicable. The Treasurer-Tax Collector will take no responsibility for investments outside of the County Investment Pool, including the selection, on-going management, or accounting of such bond funds.

**Section 7. Tax Covenants.** The County acknowledges and relies upon the fact that any school district or community college district that issues bonds where the interest on which is excluded from income of a holder for federal tax purposes pursuant to the authority granted by this Resolution will represent and covenant that it shall not take any action, or fail to take any action, if such action or failure to take such action would adversely affect the exclusion from gross income of the interest payable on such bonds, and that it will comply with the requirements of the Tax Certificate relating to such bonds, and further that such representation and covenant shall survive payment in full or defeasance of such bonds. The County hereby covenants that none of the County, the Board of Supervisors, or the officers of the County shall take any action, or fail to take any action, if such action or failure to take such action would adversely affect the exclusion from gross income of the interest payable on such bonds.

**Section 8. Limited Responsibility for Official Statement.** Neither the Board nor any officer of the County will prepare or review any official statement of a school district or community college district describing bonds issued pursuant to the authority granted by this Resolution (each, an "Official Statement"), and this Board and the various officers of the County will take no responsibility for the contents or distribution thereof; provided, however, that solely with respect to a section to be contained therein describing the County's investment policy, then-current portfolio holdings, and valuation procedures, as they may relate to funds of such school district, community college district, or other investment pool participants held by the Treasurer-Tax Collector, the Treasurer-Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and review such information for inclusion in any Official Statement and in a preliminary form of any Official Statement, and to certify in writing to such school district or community college district prior to or upon the issuance of such bonds that the information contained in such section does not contain any untrue statement of a material fact or omit to state any material fact necessary in order to make the statements made therein, in the light of the circumstances under which they are made, not misleading.

**Section 9. Limited Liability.** Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, any bonds issued by a school district or community college district pursuant to the authority granted by this Resolution, or in any other document mentioned herein, neither the County nor the Board of Supervisors shall have any liability hereunder or by reason hereof or in connection with any transactions contemplated hereby and such bonds shall be payable solely from the monies available therefor, as provided by relevant provisions of the Education Code and the Government Code, and as may further be set forth in the authorizing resolution relating to such bonds.

**Section 10. Approval of Actions.** The Chair, the Clerk, the County Auditor and Controller, the County Counsel, and the Treasurer-Tax Collector, and the deputies and designees of any of them,

are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all agreements, certificates and representations, as may be acceptable to County Counsel, including signature certificates, no-litigation certificates, debt capacity certificates, and other certificates or documents proposed to be executed in connection with the issuance and sale of any bonds issued by a school district or community college district pursuant to the authority granted by this Resolution, which is necessary and desirable to accomplish or administer such transactions.

**Section 11. Delivery of Resolution.** The Clerk of this Board of Supervisors is hereby directed to deliver a copy of this Resolution to the Superintendent of Schools of the County, who is hereby requested to communicate the adoption hereof to all interested school districts and community college districts in the County.

**Section 12. Effective Date.** This resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption.

## PAYING AGENT AGREEMENT

THIS PAYING AGENT AGREEMENT (the "Agreement"), is entered into as of Month Day, Year, between the \_\_\_\_\_ School District (the "District"), and the County of San Diego acting through the Office of the Treasurer-Tax Collector, San Diego County, California (the "County"), as Paying Agent and Registrar.

### RECITALS

WHEREAS the District has duly authorized and provided for the issuance of its Bonds, entitled the "\_\_\_\_\_ School District (San Diego County, California) GO Bonds (General Obligation Bonds) Election, Series \_\_\_\_\_" (the "Bonds") in an aggregate principal amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_. The Bonds will be issued as fully registered bonds without coupons;

WHEREAS the District will ensure that all things necessary to make the Bonds the valid obligations of the District, in accordance with their terms and the requirements of State of California ("State") law, will be done upon the issuance, sale and delivery thereof;

WHEREAS the District and the County wish to provide the terms under which the County will act as Paying Agent to pay the principal, redemption premium (if any), and interest on the Bonds, in accordance with the terms thereof, and under which the County will act as Registrar for the Bonds;

WHEREAS the County has agreed to serve in such capacities for and on behalf of the District and has full power and authority to perform and serve as Paying Agent and Registrar for the Bonds;

WHEREAS the District and the County have each authorized the execution and delivery of this Agreement; and all things necessary to make this Agreement a valid agreement have been done.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed as follows:

### ARTICLE ONE

#### DEFINITIONS

##### Section 1.01. Definitions.

For all purposes of this Agreement except as otherwise expressly provided or unless the context otherwise requires:

"Bond" or "Bonds" means any one or all of the \$\_\_\_\_\_ in aggregate principal amount of bonds entitled "\_\_\_\_\_ School District (San Diego County, California) GO Bonds (General Obligation Bonds) Election, Series\_."

"Bond Register" means the book or books of registration kept by the County in which are maintained the names and addresses of, and principal amounts registered to, each Registered Owner.

**"Bond Resolution"** means the Resolution of the District pursuant to which the Bonds were issued.

**"County"** means the Office of the Treasurer–Tax Collector, County of San Diego, California.

**"District"** means \_\_\_\_\_ School District.

**"District Request"** means a written request signed in the name of the District and delivered to the County.

**"DTC" or "Depository"** means The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York, a limited purpose trust company organized under the laws of the State of New York in its capacity as securities depository for the Bonds.

**"Fiscal Year"** means the fiscal year of the District ending on June 30 of each year.

**"Investment Management Agreement"** means that certain Investment Management Agreement entered into by and between the District and the County.

**"Paying Agent"** means the County when it is performing the function of paying agent for the Bonds.

**"Person"** means any individual, corporation, partnership, joint venture, association, joint stock company, trust, unincorporated organization or government or any agency or political subdivision of a government or any entity whatsoever.

**"Registered Owner"** means a Person in whose name a Bond is registered in the Bond Register.

**"Registrar"** means the County when it is performing the function of registrar, authentication agent and/or transfer agent for the Bonds.

## ARTICLE TWO

### APPOINTMENT OF COUNTY AS PAYING AGENT AND REGISTRAR

#### Section 2.01. Appointment and Acceptance.

The District hereby appoints the County to act as Paying Agent with respect to the Bonds, to pay, or to provide for payment, to the Registered Owners in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Agreement, the Bond Resolution, and the Bonds, the principal of, redemption premium (if any), and interest on all or any of the Bonds.

The District hereby appoints the County as Registrar with respect to the Bonds. As Registrar, the County shall keep and maintain for and on behalf of the District books and records as to the ownership of the Bonds and with respect to the transfer and exchange thereof as provided herein and in the Bond Resolution.

The County hereby accepts its appointment, and agrees to act as Paying Agent and Registrar.

**Section 2.02. Compensation.**

As compensation for the County's services as Paying Agent and Registrar, the District hereby agrees to pay the County the fees and amounts set forth in Exhibit A.

In addition, the District agrees to reimburse the County, upon its request, for all reasonable and necessary out-of-pocket expenses, disbursements, and advances, including without limitation the reasonable fees, expenses, and disbursements of its agents and attorneys made or incurred by the County in connection with entering into and performing under this Agreement, and in connection with investigating and defending itself against any claim or liability in connection with its performance hereunder.

**ARTICLE THREE**

**PAYING AGENT**

**Section 3.01. Duties of Paying Agent.**

As Paying Agent, the County, provided sufficient collected funds have been provided to it for such purpose by or on behalf of the District, shall pay on behalf of the District the principal of, redemption premium (if any), and interest on each Bond in accordance with the provisions of the Bond Resolution and the Bonds.

As long as DTC is the registered owner of the Bonds and DTC's book-entry method is used for the Bonds, the Paying Agent will send any notice of redemption or other notices to owners only to DTC.

**Section 3.02. Payment Dates.**

The District hereby instructs the County to pay the principal of, redemption premium (if any), and interest on the Bonds on the dates specified in the Bonds.

**ARTICLE FOUR**

**REGISTRAR**

**Section 4.01. Initial Delivery of Bonds.**

The Bonds will be initially authenticated, registered and delivered through DTC's book-entry system to or upon the order of the purchaser designated by the District as one Bond for each maturity. If the Bonds are not to be issued through DTC' book entry system and if such purchaser delivers a written request to the County not later than five business days prior to the date of initial delivery, the County will, on the date of initial delivery, deliver Bonds of authorized denominations, registered in accordance with the instructions in such written request.

**Section 4.02. Duties of Registrar.**

The County shall provide for the proper registration of transfer, exchange and replacement of the Bonds. Every Bond surrendered for transfer or exchange shall be duly endorsed or be accompanied by a written instrument of transfer, the signature of which has been guaranteed by an eligible guarantor institution, in a form acceptable to the County, duly executed by the Registered Owner thereof or his or her attorney duly authorized in writing. The Registrar may request any supporting documentation it deems necessary or

appropriate to effect a re-registration.

Any Bond may be exchanged for Bonds of the same series of like tenor, maturity and principal amount upon presentation and surrender at the principal office of the Paying Agent together with a request for exchange signed by the owner or by a person legally empowered to do so in a form satisfactory to the Paying Agent.

**Section 4.03. Unauthenticated Bonds.**

If the Bonds are not DTC book-entry bonds, the District shall provide to the County on a continuing basis, an adequate inventory of unauthenticated Bonds to facilitate transfers. The County agrees that it will maintain such unauthenticated Bonds in safekeeping.

**Section 4.04. Form of Bond Register.**

The County as Registrar will maintain its records as Bond Registrar in accordance with the County's general practices and procedures in effect from time to time. The County as Paying Agent will keep or cause to be kept at its principal office sufficient books for the registration and transfer of the Bonds, which upon reasonable notice shall be open to inspection by the District.

**Section 4.05. Reports.**

The District may request the information in the Bond Register at any time the County is customarily open for business, provided that reasonable time is allowed for the County to provide an up-to-date listing and to convert the information into written form.

The County will not release or disclose the content of the Bond Register to any person other than to the District at its written request, except upon receipt of a subpoena or court order or as may otherwise be required by law. Upon receipt of a subpoena or court order the County will notify the District.

**Section 4.06. Cancelled Bonds.**

All Bonds surrendered for payment, redemption, transfer, exchange, or replacement, if surrendered to the County, shall be promptly cancelled by it and, if surrendered to the District, shall be delivered to the County and, if not already cancelled, shall be promptly cancelled by the County. The District may at any time deliver to the County for cancellation any Bonds previously authenticated and delivered which the District may have acquired in any manner whatsoever, and all Bonds so delivered shall be promptly cancelled by the County. All cancelled Bonds shall be held by the County for its retention period then in effect and shall thereafter be destroyed and evidence of such destruction furnished to the District upon its written request.

ARTICLE FIVE

THE COUNTY

**Section 5.01. Duties of County.**

The County undertakes to perform the duties set forth herein. No implied duties or obligations shall be read into this Agreement against the County. The County hereby agrees to use the funds deposited with it for payment of the principal of, redemption premium (if any), and interest on the Bonds to pay the same as it shall become due and further agrees to establish and maintain such accounts and funds as may be required for the County to function as Paying Agent.

**Section 5.02. Reliance on Documents, Etc.**

The County may conclusively rely, as to the truth of the statements and correctness of the opinions expressed therein, on certificates or opinions furnished to the County by the District.

No provision of this Agreement shall require the County to expend or risk its own funds or otherwise incur any financial liability for performance of any of its duties hereunder, or in the exercise of any of its rights or powers.

The County may rely, or be protected in acting or refraining from acting, upon any resolution, certificate, statement, instrument, opinion, report, notice, request, direction, consent, order, bond, note, security or other paper or document believed by it to be genuine and to have been signed or presented by the proper party or parties. The County need not examine the ownership of any Bond, but shall be protected in acting upon receipt of Bonds containing an endorsement or instruction of transfer or power of transfer which appears on its face to be signed by the Registered Owner or agent of the Registered Owner.

The County has no responsibility or liability for any aspects of the records relating to or payments made on account of beneficial ownership, or for maintaining, supervising or reviewing any records relating to beneficial ownership or interest on the Bonds.

The County may consult with counsel, and the written advice or opinion of counsel shall be full authorization and protection with respect to any action taken, suffered or omitted by it hereunder in good faith and reliance thereon.

The County may exercise any of the powers hereunder and perform any duties hereunder either directly or by or through agents or attorneys and shall not be liable for the actions of such agent or attorney if appointed by it with reasonable care.

**Section 5.03. Recitals of District.**

The recitals contained in the Bond Resolution and the Bonds shall be taken as the statements of the District, and the County assumes no responsibility for their correctness.

**Section 5.04. May Own Bonds.**

The County, in its individual or any other capacity, may become the owner or pledgee of Bonds with the same rights it would have if it were not the Paying Agent and Registrar for the Bonds.

**Section 5.05. Money Held by County.**

Money held by the County hereunder need not be segregated from other funds. Money held hereunder will be deposited in the District's interest and \_\_\_\_\_ funds and invested in the County investment pool and invested by the County Treasurer pursuant to its duties as Treasurer and pursuant to the Investment Management Agreement, as applicable, prior to the principal and interest payment dates of the Bonds and the District is entitled to receive interest earnings on such funds.

Any money deposited with or otherwise held by the County for the payment of the principal of, redemption premium (if any), or interest on any Bond and remaining unclaimed for one year after such deposit will be paid by the County to the District, and the District and the County agree that the Registered Owner of such Bond shall thereafter look only to the District for payment thereof, and that all liability of the County with respect to such moneys shall thereupon cease.

**Section 5.06. Other Transactions.**

The County may engage in or be interested in any financial or other transaction with the District.

**Section 5.07. Interpleader.**

The District and the County agree that the County may seek adjudication of any adverse claim, demand, or controversy over its person as well as funds on deposit, in a court of competent jurisdiction. The District and the County further agree that the County has the right to file an action in interpleader in any court of competent jurisdiction to determine the rights of any person claiming any interest herein.

**Section 5.08. Indemnification.**

The District shall indemnify the County, its officers, directors, employees and agents ("Indemnified Parties") for, and hold them harmless against any loss, cost, claim, liability or expense arising out of or in connection with the County's acceptance or administration of the County's duties hereunder or under the Bond Resolution (except any loss, liability or expense as may be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be attributable to the County's negligence or willful misconduct), including the cost and expense (including its counsel fees) of defending itself against any claim or liability in connection with the exercise or performance of any of its powers or duties under this Agreement. Such indemnity shall survive the termination or discharge of this Agreement or discharge of the Bonds.

ARTICLE SIX

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 6.01. Amendment.

This Agreement may be amended only by an agreement in writing signed by both of the parties hereto.

Section 6.02. Assignment.

This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the prior written consent of the other party.

Section 6.03. Notices.

Any request, demand, authorization, direction, notice, consent, waiver or other document provided or permitted hereby to be given or furnished to the District or the County shall be mailed or delivered to the District or the County, respectively, at the address shown herein, or such other address as may have been given by one party to the other by fifteen (15) days written notice.

Section 6.04. Effect of Headings.

The Article and Section headings herein are for convenience of reference only and shall not affect the construction hereof.

Section 6.05. Successors and Assigns.

All covenants and agreements herein by the District and the County shall bind their successors and assigns, whether so expressed or not.

Section 6.06. Severability.

If any provision of this Agreement shall be determined to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions hereof shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.

Section 6.07. Benefits of Agreement.

Nothing herein, express or implied, shall give to any Person, other than the parties hereto and their successors hereunder, any benefit or any legal or equitable right, remedy or claim hereunder.

Section 6.08. Entire Agreement.

This Agreement and the terms of the Bonds set forth in the Bonds and the Bond Resolution constitute

the entire agreement between the parties hereto relative to the County acting as Paying Agent and Registrar.

**Section 6.09. Counterparts.**

This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which shall constitute one and the same Agreement.

**Section 6.10. Term and Termination.**

This Agreement shall be effective from and until the final payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds or until the County resigns; whichever occurs first. The County may resign at any time and be discharged of its duties and obligations by giving written notice thereof to the District. If the County resigns, prior to the effective date of the resignation, the County shall appoint a successor Paying Agent and Registrar. A successor Paying Agent shall be appointed by the County Treasurer. In the event of resignation of the County as Paying Agent and Registrar, upon receipt of moneys representing the principal and interest on the Bonds, the successor Paying Agent shall be responsible for the actual payment to the bondholders and cancellation of any bonds or coupons. The provisions of Section 5.08 hereof shall survive and remain in full force and effect following the termination of this Agreement.

**Section 6.11. Governing Law.**

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with and shall be governed by the laws of the State of California.

**Section 6.12. Documents to be Filed with County.**

At the time of the County's appointment as Paying Agent and Registrar, the District shall file with the County the following documents: (a) certified copies of the Bond Resolution and specimen Bonds; (b) a copy of the opinion of bond counsel provided to the District in connection with the issuance of the Bonds; (c) a District Request containing written instructions to the County with respect to the issuance and delivery of the Bonds, including the name of the Registered Owners and the denominations of the Bonds; (d) a Closing Memorandum Addendum, to be reviewed by Bond Counsel, providing instructions to the County for the deposit of all bond proceeds; and (e) within 90 days of the date hereof, a transcript of proceedings prepared for the Bonds.

**INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT  
PROVIDING FOR INVESTMENT OF BOND PROCEEDS  
IN THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY TREASURER'S POOLED INVESTMENT FUND**

THIS INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT ("Agreement") IS ENTERED INTO AS OF \_\_\_\_\_, 201\_\_, BY AND BETWEEN \_\_\_\_\_, ("Agency") AND THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY TREASURER-TAX COLLECTOR ("Treasurer").

### RECITALS

- A. Agency is a local public agency within the County of San Diego that is authorized by law to deposit funds to be managed and invested by the Treasurer.
- B. The Agency is authorized to deposit and Treasurer has agreed to accept a deposit of Agency's Bond Proceeds in the San Diego County Treasurer's Pooled Investment Fund, ("the Pool"), which contains County funds and money deposited by other local public agencies.
- C. The Pool is a permitted investment in the Agency's bond documents.
- D. The Agency has been provided with a copy of the Treasurer's Investment Policy for the Pool ("Policy") adopted pursuant to Government Code section 27133, and Agency has reviewed the policy prior to entering into this Agreement. The Policy is subject to annual revision.

### IN VIEW OF THE ABOVE RECITALS, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. **Deposit of Funds.** Except as provided by law, the Agency shall deposit the proceeds of any bond transaction with Treasurer to be managed and invested as part of the Pool. The Agency will provide the Treasurer with written documentation of its governing body's approval of the deposits. Any initial deposit and subsequent addition of bond proceeds shall be referred to as "Bond Proceeds."
2. **Investment of Funds.** Treasurer will manage and invest deposited Bond Proceeds in accordance with the Policy including any amendments or revisions to the Policy. Any funds invested outside the County Investment Pool are the sole responsibility of the Agency. The Treasurer-Tax Collector takes no responsibility for investments outside of the County Investment Pool, including the selection, on-going management, and accounting of such funds.
3. **Annual Review of Policy.** Agency acknowledges that the Treasurer reviews the Policy and submits the Policy to the County Oversight Committee and the Board of Supervisors for

their reviews and approvals annually. The current Policy is posted at <http://www.sdttc.com/content/dam/ttc/docs/investmentpolicy.pdf>

4. **Non-Liability for Investment Results.** Agency understands and agrees that as long as Treasurer invests, in good faith, the Bond Proceeds in accordance with the current Policy, neither Treasurer nor the County of San Diego shall be responsible or liable for any investment losses suffered by Agency or for any underperformance of the funds deposited.

5. **Term of Agreement.** The term of this Agreement commences on the date set forth above and terminates when Agency has withdrawn all Bond Proceeds from the Pool.

6. **Reports.** Agency shall provide Treasurer with cash flow reports on a quarterly basis indicating projected contributions to and withdrawals from the Pool. Treasurer shall provide Agency with monthly reports covering the performance of the pool -which will be found at <http://www.sdttc.com/content/ttc/en/treasury/financial-reports.html>

7. **Disputes.** The Parties agree to attempt to resolve any disputes under this Agreement by informal means and, if necessary, by mediation. Should mediation fail to resolve the dispute, either party may pursue its legal remedies.

8. **Contacts for Responsibility.** This Agreement shall be administered on behalf of the Treasurer by Lauren Warrem, Chief Deputy Treasurer, and on behalf of Agency by \_\_\_\_\_. Either party, by written notice to the other, may change the person responsible for administering this Agreement.

9. **Notices.** Any notices provided for in this Agreement shall deliver personally or by United States mail, as follows:



**BIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION:** Pamuela Halliwell

Pamuela Halliwell is a community leader, author, Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist, a researcher, and Director of Behavioral Health Services at The San Diego LGBT Community Center, committed to advancing health equity for transgender, non-binary, and Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) communities. With a strong behavioral health and community advocacy background, Pamuela combines her lived experience with professional expertise in HIV prevention, care, and policy.

Her motivation for joining the HPG comes from witnessing the ongoing impact of stigma, inequity, and political challenges faced by people living with HIV with emphasis on folks living with intersectional identities. She underscores the need for and importance of diverse representation in decision making. Pamuela's approach to community engagement focuses on collaboration. She promotes thorough needs assessments, partnerships with trusted community organizations, and practical support such as transportation, meals, and incentives to enhance engagement. She highlights the need for transparency, flexibility in meeting accessibility requirements, and culturally relevant outreach through various media and social platforms. Pamuela distinguishes between "engagement" and "outreach," emphasizing reciprocal knowledge sharing rather than one-way information delivery.

In her role at The Center and as former President of the San Diego Black LGBT Coalition, Pamuela has established strong partnerships with organizations such as Family Health Centers of San Diego, Christie's Place, Stepping Stone of San Diego, UC San Diego's Owen Clinic, AIDS Healthcare Foundation (AHF), and others. Her programs provide mental health counseling, harm reduction services, PrEP access, crisis support, and links to care. She serves as a Co-Principal Investigator on UC San Diego's studies addressing intimate partner violence and HIV among transgender and non-binary populations as well as their cisgender heterosexual partners.

Sergio's introduction to the HPG came through their work at VCC and participation in Project Pearl, which deepened their understanding of HPG's policies, procedures, and committee processes. Sergio has collaborated with multiple Ryan White-funded agencies, including San Ysidro Health, UC San Diego, and Christie's Place, and is well-versed in the local network of HIV services.

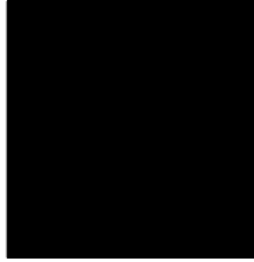

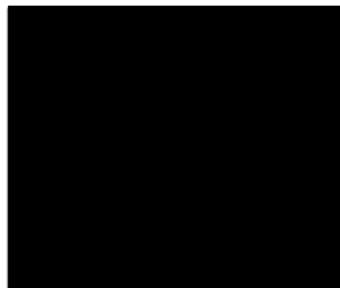
