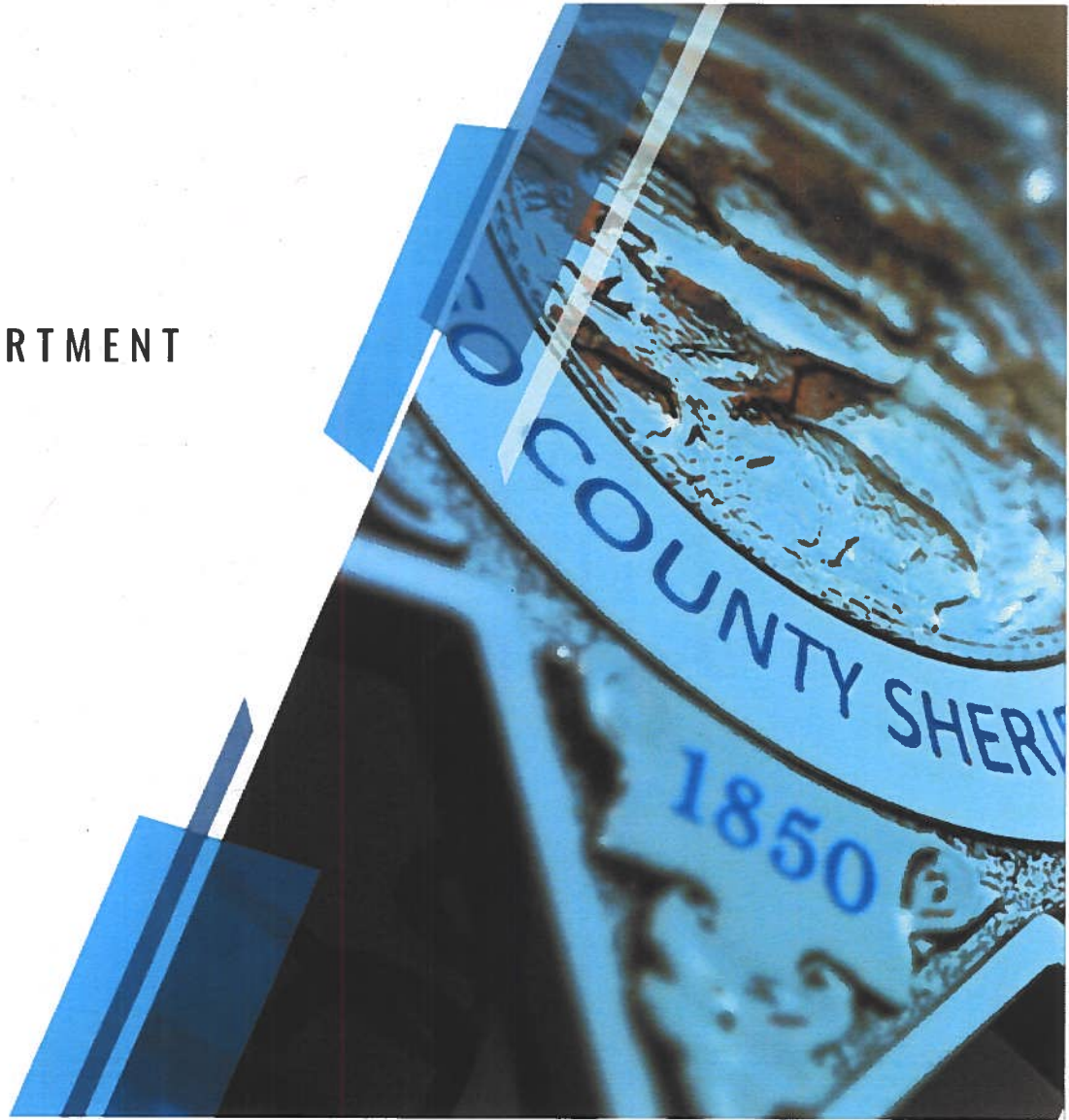

CHALLENGES WITH DETENTION FACILITIES

- Staffing (Sworn and Medical Staff)
- Aging infrastructure, stress on existing systems and failing facilities
- Dated Technology
- Longer sentences and a need for facilities more conducive to programs
- Facility design and space is incompatible with medical health assessments and mental health care needs
- Larger number of individuals with more acute needs
- Contraband and drugs in the jails

DETENTIONS STAFFING UPDATE

POSITION	NUMBER OF VACANCIES
Dets/Cts Deputy Sheriff	274 → 202 candidates in the background process
Registered Nurse	61 → 9 candidates in hiring process
Licensed Vocational Nurse	56 → 1 candidate in background process
Mental Health Clinician	56 → 4 candidates in background process

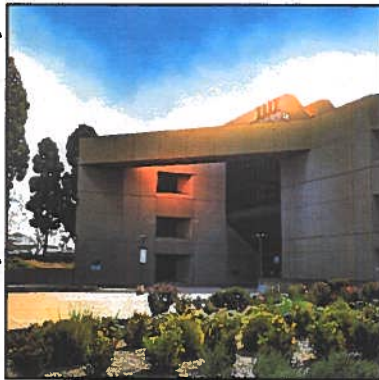

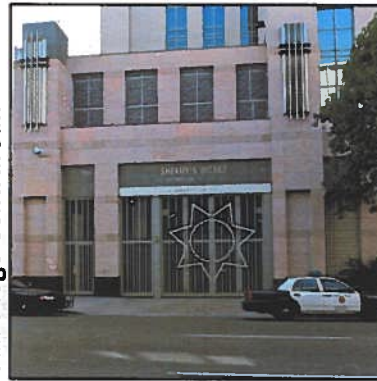

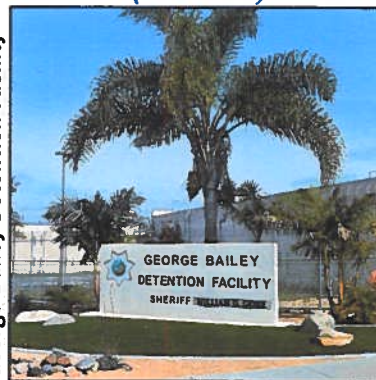

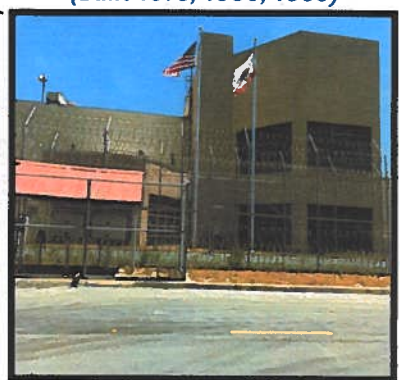

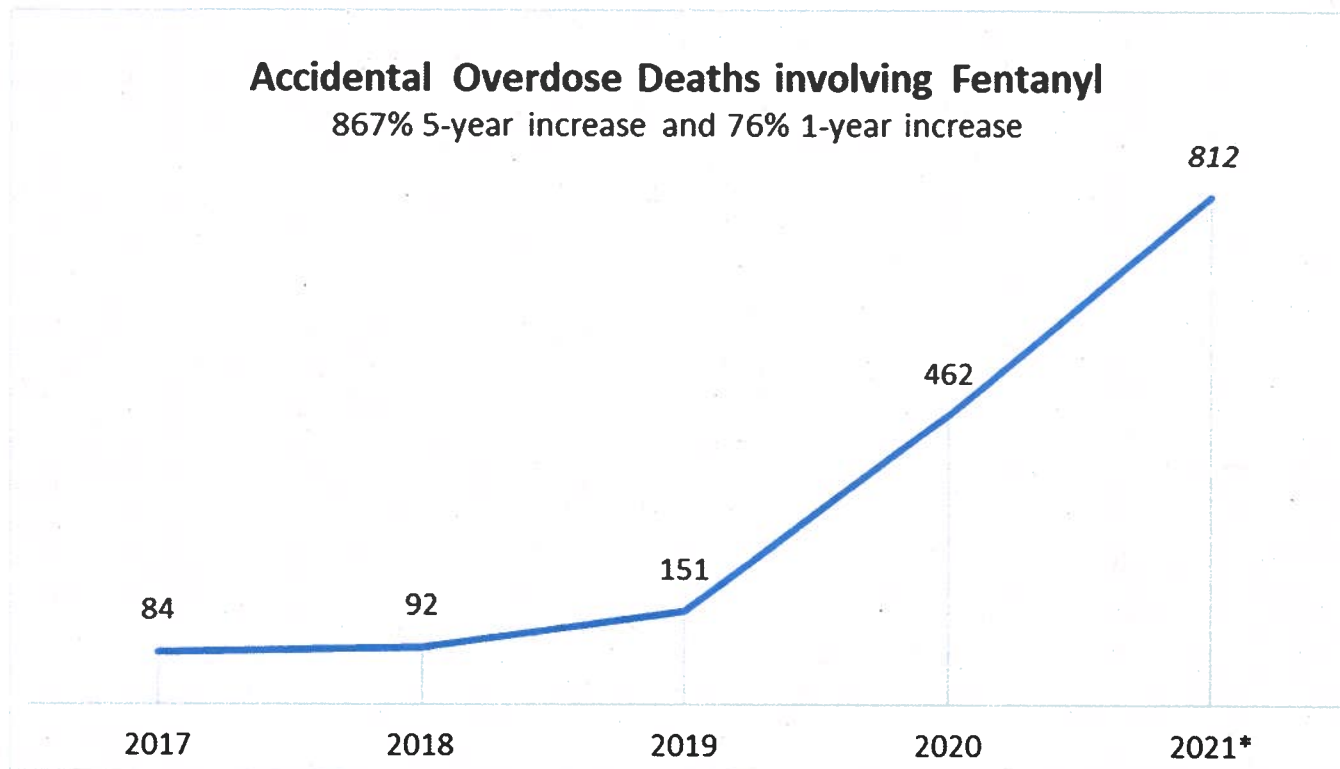
PARADIGM SHIFT

- Fentanyl overdose accidents replaced suicides as leading manner of in-custody deaths in the past two years
- Body carrying and mail are the top two methods of smuggling into jail facilities
- Smuggling is often coordinated with or through outside entities for money and status in jail
- We have several means to interdict fentanyl, identify traffickers/users, and respond to overdoses



Accidental Overdose Deaths involving Fentanyl

867% 5-year increase and 76% 1-year increase

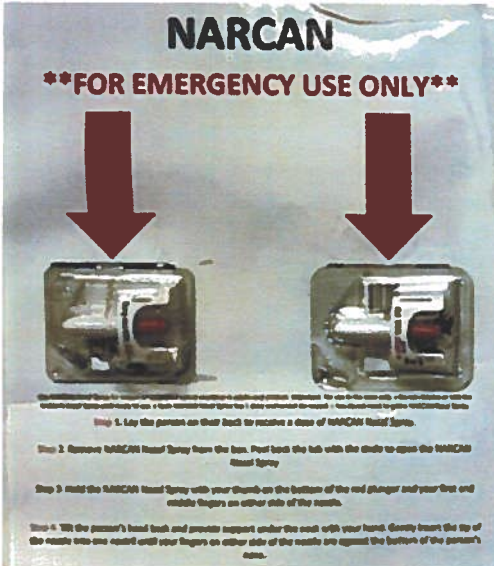


*2021 counts are preliminary and include cases that are presumptive positive for fentanyl but pending final review/investigation



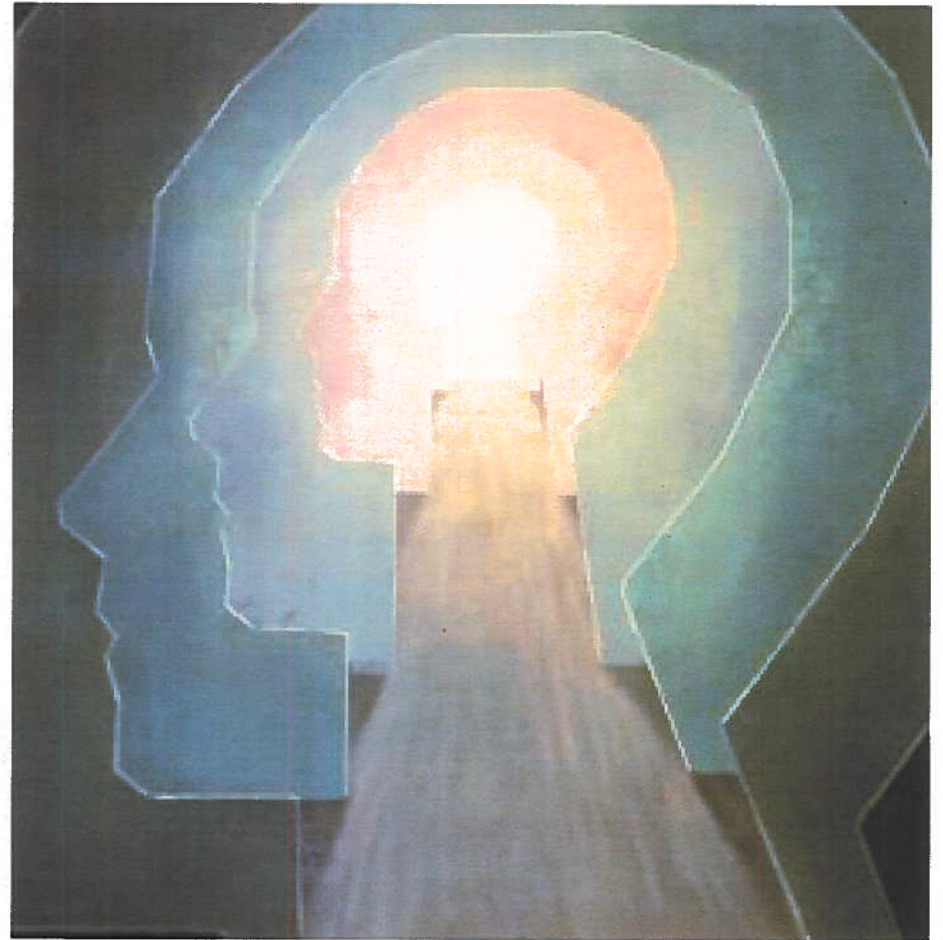
NALOXONE BOXES IN DETENTION FACILITIES

- Carried and administered by deputies and medical staff since February 2021
- Now available to incarcerated persons in housing areas
- Alarmed boxes allow for immediate medical aid
- Two documented incidents where incarcerated persons rendered aid using Narcan we provided



WELLNESS CHECKS

- Implemented in June 2022
- Supplemental care and engagement with particularly vulnerable incarcerated populations
- Focus on individuals who are diagnosed with mental illness, behavioral issues or have demonstrated that they are unable to follow general population norms of behavior
- These are in addition to mandated security checks



MEDICATION ASSISTED TREATMENT (MAT)

Broadened the MAT program within detention facilities.

Started Clinical Institute Withdrawal Assessment for alcohol withdrawal and Clinical Opiate Withdrawal Scale for individualized plan



Started voluntary urine screenings in June



Between 7/1/22 to 9/26/22 there were 13,364 bookings → 2,998 individuals tested



2,356 (78.6%) individuals tested positive for at least one illegal substance

- 81% identified as male
- 76.2% identified as female

BODY SCANNERS



Increasing and enhancing body scanners in facilities with better technology:

- Purchased a new body scanner which is at the San Diego Central Jail
- Planned future investment and ordering more scanners now
- Placement of new scanners at the jails and more scanners at the courts, to capture individuals who may have obtained narcotics during court visits
