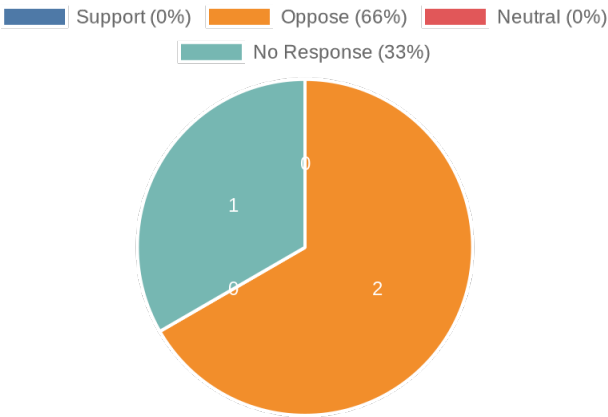

Overall Sentiment

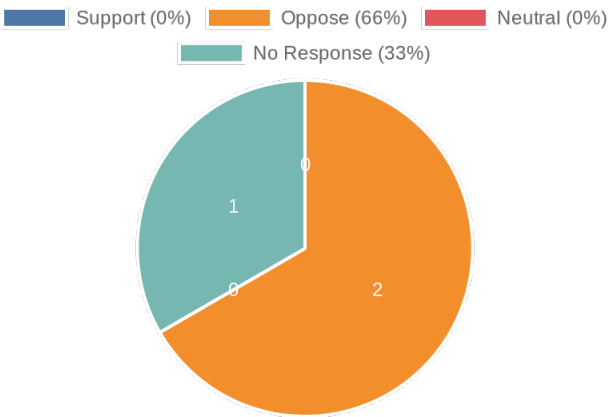

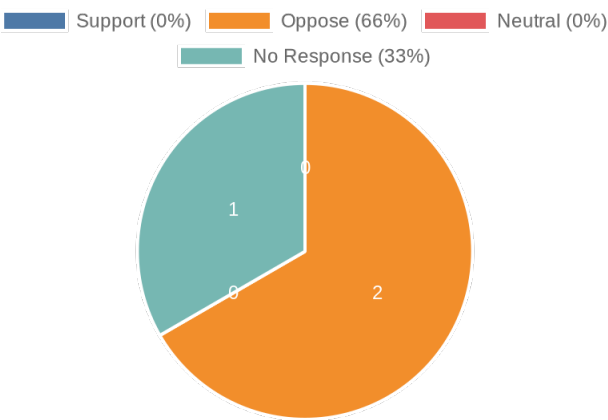
