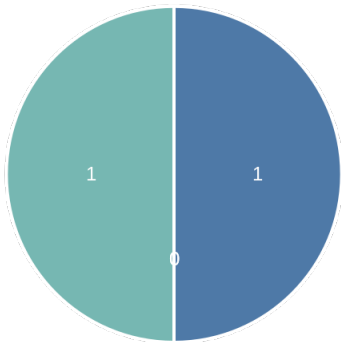

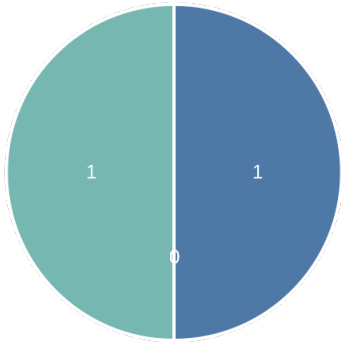

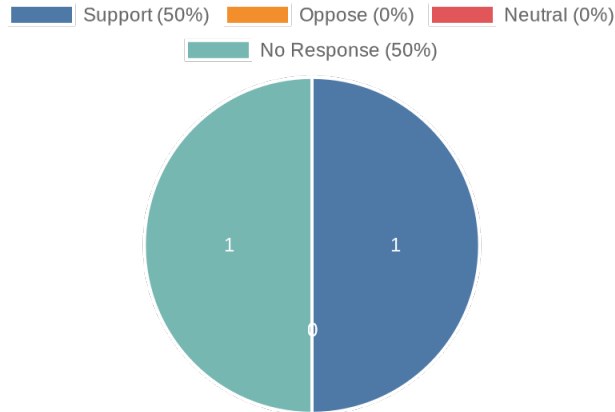

Per this item letter: Fiscal Year 2024-25, the County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA), Public Health Services and Public Health Nurses provided case management services, aimed at removing potential sources of lead exposure to 111 children with elevated blood lead levels. Were these services successful?
