





You should shut the Polinsky Center down and return the gifts. Keeping it open is costing you, us, and the inmates.

State social workers say the Polinsky Children's Center violated state licensing guidelines and there's a pattern of non-compliance. But it's not just the state calling out a problem with the facility. The County has reported hundreds of children are placed at Polinsky each year, many of whom are under the age of six years old, with an average stay that exceeds the maximum allowable length of stay of ten days for a temporary shelter care facility. And people who work at the Polinsky Center say things need to change.

Workers say the county allowed teenage boys and girls to live in the same housing unit, that there are drugs and alcohol on campus and an increasing number of kids who go "AWOL." over 2000 calls to police over 3 years, from disturbing the peace, to threats with weapons and runaway juveniles.

The abuse continues. It is a blot on us all.
