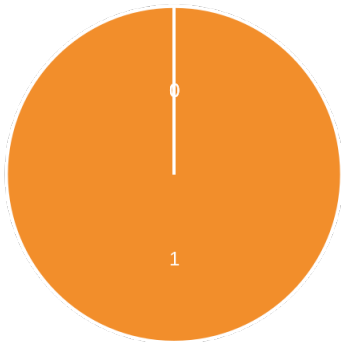

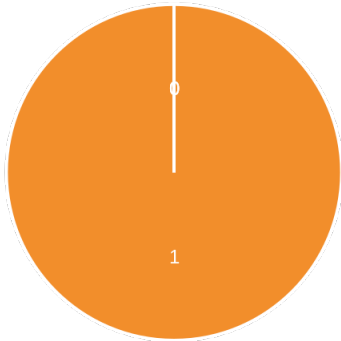

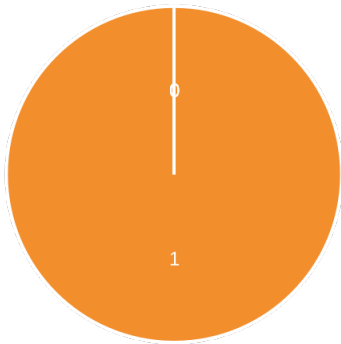
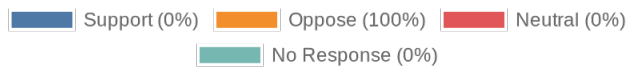
Overall Sentiment
