





"Taxpayers are being asked to sustain an ever-expanding bureaucracy without clear performance metrics, accountability, or tangible results—failing both the public and those most in need of support."

Simply identifying where money has been spent will not result in meaningful change. It would be more useful to develop metrics, outcome targets, and implement a performance management system that tracks progress over time than to explore the feasibility of an audit.
