Overall Sentiment

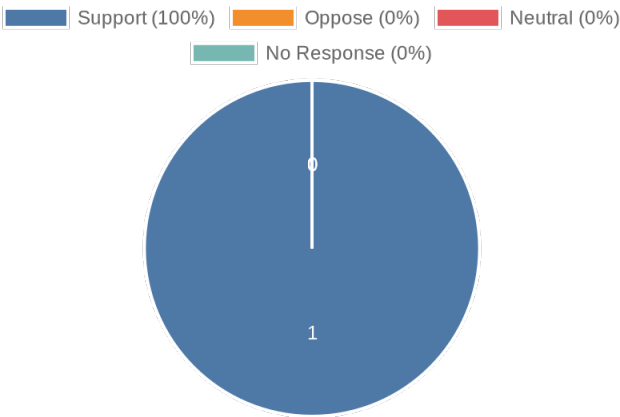

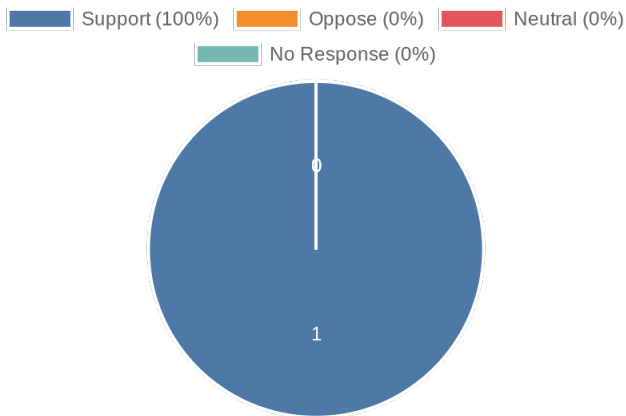

Construction manager at risk (CMAR) involves separate design and construction contracts, but the construction manager pins down exactly what you want in your project and fits it to your budget. Progressive Design-Build (PDB) uses a single contract, bringing the designer/builder together early to manage risk and accelerate schedules, transferring more risk to the design-builder for better cost control and innovation.

So if the design is done, why would you want CMAR? There should be no choice.
