MOTIVATED YOUTH ACADEMY

CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

(Amended: February 13, 2025)

I. ADOPTION

In compliance with the Political Reform Act of 1974, California Government Code Section 87100, et seq., the Motivated Youth Academy hereby adopts this Conflict of Interest Code ("Code"), which shall apply to all governing board members and all other designated employees of Motivated Youth Academy ("MYA" or the "Charter School"), as specifically required by California Government Code Section 87300.

II. DEFINITION OF TERMS

As applicable to a California public charter school, the definitions contained in the Political Reform Act of 1974, the regulations of the Fair Political Practices Commission, specifically California Code of Regulations Section 18730, and any amendments or modifications to the Act and regulations are incorporated by reference to this Code.

III. DESIGNATED EMPLOYEES

Employees of the Charter School, including governing board members, who hold positions that involve the making or participation in the making, of decisions that may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest, shall be "designated employees." The designated positions are listed in "Exhibit A" attached to this policy and incorporated by reference herein.

IV. STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC INTERESTS: FILING

Each designated employee, including governing board members, shall file a Statement of Economic Interest ("Statement") at the time and manner prescribed by California Code of Regulations, title 2, section 18730, disclosing reportable investments, interests in real property, business positions, and income required to be reported under the category or categories to which the employee's position is assigned in "Exhibit A."

An investment, interest in real property or income shall be reportable, if the business entity in which the investment is held, the interest in real property, the business position, or source of income may foreseeably be affected materially by a decision made or participated in by the designated employee by virtue of his or her position. The specific disclosure responsibilities assigned to each position are set forth in "Exhibit B."

Statements Filed With the Charter School. All Statements shall be supplied by the Charter School. All Statements shall be filed with the Charter School. The Charter School's filing official shall make and retain a copy of the Statement and forward the original to the County Board of Supervisors.

V. DISQUALIFICATION

No designated employee shall make, participate in making, or try to use his/her official position to influence any Charter School decision which he/she knows or has reason to know will have a reasonably foreseeable material financial effect, distinguishable from its effect on the public generally, on the official or a member of his or her immediate family.

VI. MANNER OF DISQUALIFICATION

A. Non-Governing Board Member Designated Employees

When a non-Governing Board member designated employee determines that he/she should not make a decision because of a disqualifying interest, he/she should submit a written disclosure of the disqualifying interest to his/her immediate supervisor. The supervisor shall immediately reassign the matter to another employee and shall forward the disclosure notice to the Chief Executive Officer, who shall record the employee's disqualification. In the case of a designated employee who is head of an agency, this determination and disclosure shall be made in writing to his/her appointing authority.

B. Governing Board Member Designated Employees

The Corporation shall not enter into a contract or transaction in which a director directly or indirectly has a material financial interest (nor shall the Corporation enter into any contract or transaction with any other corporation, firm, association, or other entity in which one or more of the Corporation's directors are directors and have a material financial interest).

*Consultants/New Positions shall be included in the list of designated positions and shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in the code, subject to the following limitation:

The Chief Executive Officer may determine in writing that a particular consultant or new position, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with the disclosure requirements in this section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's or new position's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Chief Executive Officer determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict of interest code (Government Code § 81008).

EXHIBIT B

Disclosure Categories

Category 1

Designated positions assigned to this category must report:

- a) Interests in real property that are located in whole or in part within a two-mile radius:
 - of any school district that has authorized a MYA charter school, or
 - of any facility utilized by MYA charter schools, or
 - of a proposed site for a MYA facility.
- b) Investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income (including gifts, loans, and travel payments) of the type that engage in the purchase or sale of real property or are engaged in building construction or design.

Category 2

Designated positions assigned to this category must report:

- a. Investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans, and travel payments) that are contractors engaged in the performance of work or services, or sources that manufacture, sell, repair, rent or distribute school supplies, books, materials, school furnishings or equipment of the type to be utilized by MYA.

Category 3

Designated positions assigned to this category must report:

- a. Investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans, and travel payments) that are contractors engaged in the performance of work or services, or sources that manufacture, sell, repair, rent or distribute school supplies, books, materials, school furnishings or equipment of the type to be utilized by the designated position's department.

It has been determined that the positions listed below are officials who manage public investments. (Note: Individuals holding one of the below-listed positions may contact the FPPC for assistance or written advice regarding their filing obligations if they believe that their position has been categorized incorrectly. The FPPC makes the final determination whether a position is covered by 87200):

Disclosure Requirements

- A. Public Officials and employees holding positions designated in this Conflict of Interest Code are required to file the initial, annual, and leaving office Statement of Economic Interest for the types of interests in the categories set forth in the applicable Disclosure Categories. It has been determined that these persons make or participate in making decisions, which foreseeably may have a material effect on such financial interests.
- B. Where the Disclosure Category requires disclosure of interests in real property, the designated employee is only required to disclose real property which is located in whole or in part within or not more than two (2) miles outside the boundaries of the jurisdiction or within two (2) miles of any land owned or used by the District.
- C. Where the Disclosure Category requires disclosure of investments or sources of income, the designated employee is only required to disclose investments in business entities and sources of income that do business in the jurisdiction, plan to do business in the jurisdiction, or have done business in the jurisdiction within the past two (2) years. In addition to other activities, a business entity is doing business within the jurisdiction if it owns real property within the jurisdiction.
- D. Where the Disclosure Category requires disclosure of business positions, the designated employee is only required to disclose positions of director, officer, partner, employee, or any position of management in organizations or enterprises operated for profit.

Consultants and New Positions

Individuals providing services as a Consultant defined in Regulation 18700.3, or in a new position created since this Code was last approved that makes or participates in making decisions shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in this Code subject to the following limitation:

The Chief Executive Officer may determine that due to the range of duties or contractual obligations, it is more appropriate to assign a limited disclosure requirement. A clear explanation of the duties and a statement of the extent of the disclosure requirements must be in a written document. (Gov. Code §82019; Regulations 18219 and 18734). The Chief Executive Officer's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this Conflict of Interest Code. (Gov. Code §81008.)

Disclosure Categories

The disclosure categories listed below identify the types of economic interests that the Designated Position must disclose for each disclosure category to which he or she is assigned. (Note: This Conflict of Interest Code does not require the reporting of gifts from outside the District's jurisdiction if the source does not have some connection with or bearing upon the functions or duties of the position. (Reg. 18730.1.)

Board Policy No. 8 – Conflict of Interest Code

Category 1: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that are located in, do business in, or own real property within the jurisdiction of the District.

Category 2: All interests in real property which is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two (2) miles outside the jurisdiction of the District.

Category 3: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that are engaged in land development, construction or the acquisition or sale of real property within the jurisdiction of the District.

Category 4: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, products, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the District.

Category 5: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, products, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the Designated Position's department, unit or division.

Category 6: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, subject to the regulatory, permit, or licensing authority of the Designated Position's department, unit or division.

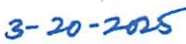

(Amended April 2, 2025)**

The Political Reform Act of 1974 (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate a conflict of interest code. The Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. Sec. 18730), which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. After public notice and hearing, the regulation may be amended by the FPPC to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act.

Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the FPPC are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendix designating officials and employees and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Vista Irrigation District.

All officials required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the Secretary of the Vista Irrigation District as the District's Filing Officer. The Filing Officer shall make and retain a copy of all statements filed by members of the Board of Directors, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer and the General Manager and forward the originals of these statements to the Clerk of the San Diego County Board of Supervisors. The Vista Irrigation District shall retain statements for all other designated employees. The Filing Officer will make all retained statements available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008).

DESIGNATED POSITIONS
GOVERNED BY THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

The Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and all District officials who manage the investment of public funds are included in and governed by this Conflict of Interest Code only with respect to its disqualification provisions. For purposes of disclosure, the Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and all District officials who manage the investment of public funds are governed by the statutory conflict of interest provisions of Article 2 of Chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act of 1974 (Government Code Section 87200, et seq.)

The persons holding positions listed below are "designated employees" who are subject to the provisions of this Code. Each such designated employee is required to disclose interests only in those categories set forth, which are identified by the numbers following his or her title.

Disclosure Categories

The disclosure categories listed below identify the types of investments, business entities, sources of income, or real property that the designated employee must disclose for each disclosure category to which he or she is assigned.

Category 1: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, all business entities that do business or own real property within the jurisdiction of the District, plan to do business or own real property within the jurisdiction of the District within the next year or have done business or owned real property within the jurisdiction of the District within the past two years.

Category 2: All interest in real property which is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two (2) miles outside, the jurisdiction of the District.

Category 3: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities subject to the regulatory, permit or licensing authority of the Designated Employee's Department, will be subject to such authority within the next year or have been subject to such authority within the past two years.

Category 4: All investments in, and sources of income from, business entities that are engaged in land development, construction or the acquisition or sale of real property within the jurisdiction of the District, plan to engage in such activities within the jurisdiction of the District within the next year or have engaged in such activities within the jurisdiction of the District within the past two years.

Category 5: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that are banking, savings and loan or other financial institutions.

Category 6: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment of a type purchased, leased, used, or administered by the Designated Employee's Department or by the District.

Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant’s duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The General Manager’s determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this Conflict of Interest Code.
