### ATTACHMENT A: DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT

Refinance the cost of the acquisition, construction, installation, equipping and furnishing of the educational facilities located at 6269 El Fuerte Street, Carlsbad, California 92009, including, but not limited to, two new buildings containing approximately 45,000 square feet of space to house a new middle school, arts program, classrooms, administration offices, a gymnasium and other related school facilities and to pay the costs of issuance in connection with the financing.

#### **ATTACHMENT B: DESCRIPTION OF APPLICANT**

Pacific Ridge School (the "School") opened in 2007 after many years of planning by local parents who felt there were limited options for excellent college preparatory education in San Diego North County. Their goal was to offer the community an education that focuses on mind and heart and that combines academic excellence with ethics, civic responsibility and global engagement.

The trustees of the School wanted to create a dynamic school environment with powerful teacherstudent relationships and a sense of ethical values necessary to become global citizens.

The commitment of founding families and early board members was instrumental for the success and growth of the School.

The School offers middle school which includes grades 6-8, and an upper college preparatory school for grades 9 through 12. The upper school curriculum offers the best of both traditional and innovative educational practices.

A key initiative for the School is the 5-year Strategic Plan introduced in the fall of 2019 to "Cultivate a diverse, empathetic, and inclusive community of learners by fostering a safe environment where all voices feel a sense of value and belonging."

Through a combination of interactive coursework, educational travel, service projects, and student-led activities, students are empowered to experiment with new ideas and interests, pursue their passions, and develop their voice. An encouraging community behind them connects support with motivation, giving students the opportunity to test and refine their skills through collaboration and dialogue. Whether it's navigating the bustling streets of an international city or developing a service project for their home community, the School's students are able to lead their path to learning, confident in the resources and inspiration they are offered along the way.

#### ATTACHMENT C: SUMMARY OF PROJECT PUBLIC BENEFITS

Public benefits may include: job creation; job retention; provide innovative education for future citizen leaders.

Over a third of the School's students identify as people of color as defined by the National Association of Independent schools, and diversity is represented on our campus in many other ways. The School provides a supportive environment in which students can explore their own understanding of gender, ability, race, religion, ethnicity and sexual orientation, as well as notions of equity and justice.

To promote access for qualified students who may not be able to consider the School for financial reasons, the School provides tuition assistance. The School has a generous assistance budget and allocates approximately \$4.0 million dollars annually. Approximately 31% of the enrolled students are receiving an average award of over 50%. The School also has a program that supports 10 prospective first generation college students to receive full assistance during their tenure at the school. As a result, a Pacific Ridge education is possible for families of varying financial resources, and the School's financial aid recipients represent a wide range of income levels.

The School currently employees 142 local staff and faculty plus over 20 seasonal faculty members throughout the year. The refinancing will help the School retain and expand the number of current and future local teachers.
