




Overall Sentiment

These would not only be cheaper but also keep up with the market for new homes better instead of houses that might not be built for years and then it would be less likely to end up with an oversupply of homes.

There also needs to be more than 5 or 10 percent of truly low income housing (30% AMI per HUD.) And this is what needs to be guaranteed, not below 50% or up, where the developer can pick and choose whom to let in. Hasn't happened yet.
