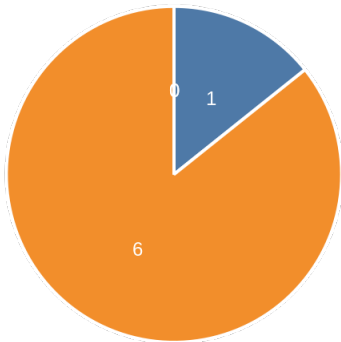

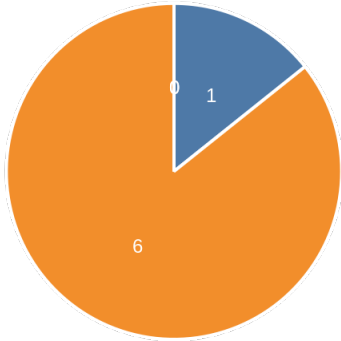

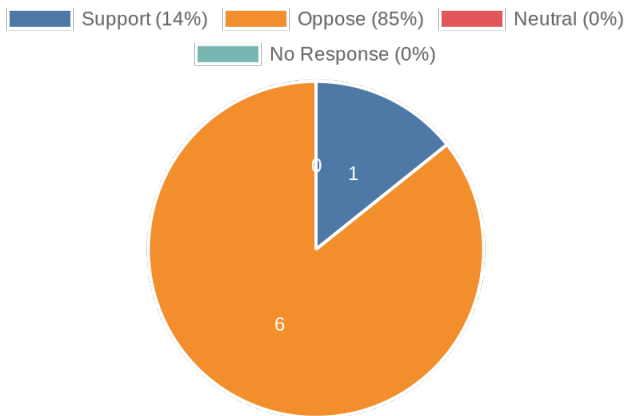
Overall Sentiment
