# Transparency & Accountability

- Grand Jury Duties
- The San Diego County Grand Jury investigates citizen complaints and performs a traditional function as a watchdog over government agencies. *(This is different than a "Criminal Grand Jury" which is a group of people summoned together by a prosecutor to decide whether there is enough evidence to press criminal charges.)* The California Constitution provides for a group of 19 citizens of San Diego County to be brought together and dedicate a year of full-time "watchdog" service looking into the workings of government.

- Fair Political Practices Commission
- The Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC or Commission) was created by the Political Reform Act of 1974 (Act), a ballot initiative passed by California voters.

### Items the grand jury may investigate

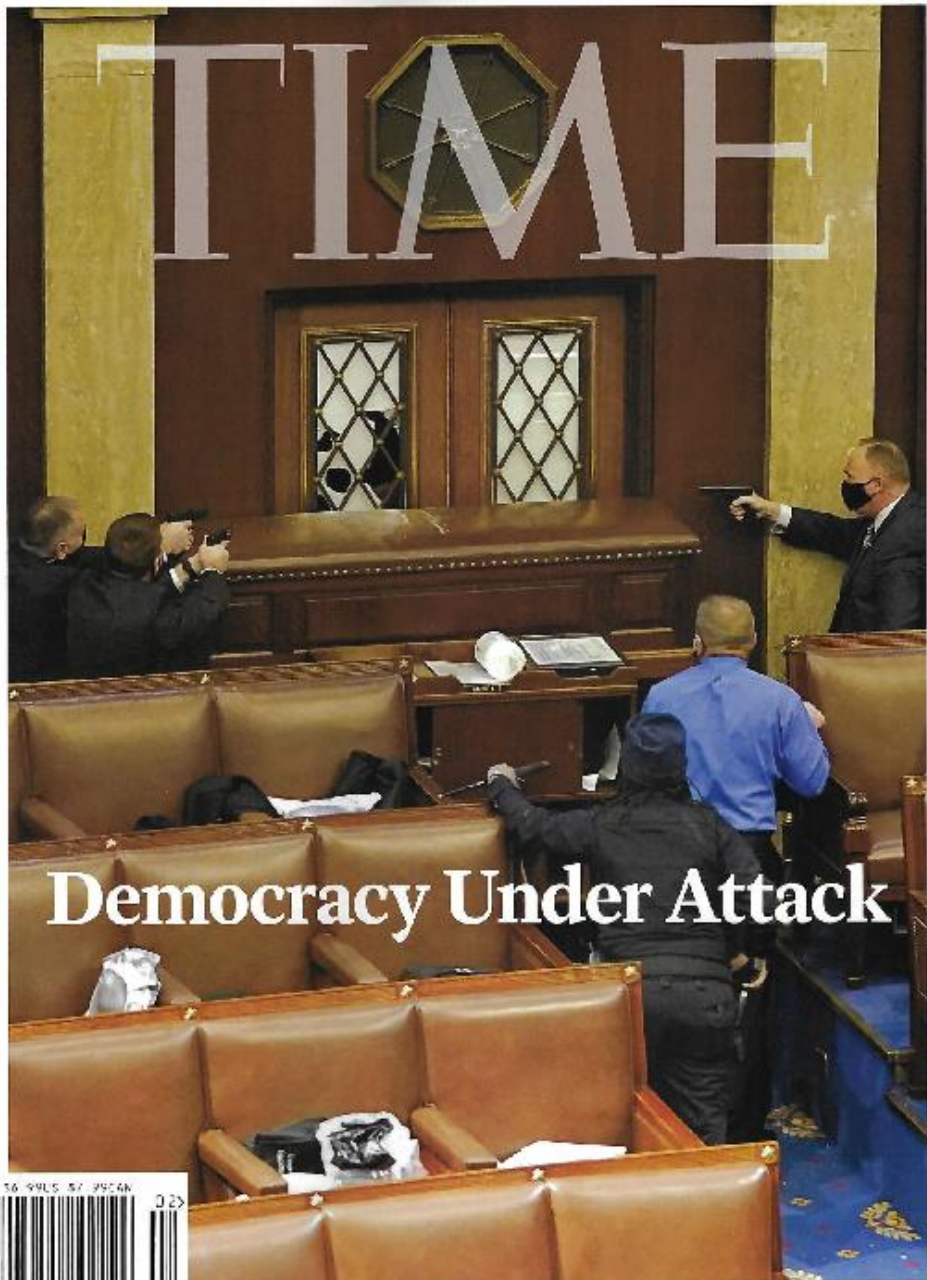
- Mistreatment by officials or employees of the County of San Diego, cities and special district (school districts, water districts, etc.) within San Diego County.
  - Cities: Carlsbad, Chula Vista, Coronado, Del Mar, El Cajon, Encinitas, Escondido, Imperial Beach, La Mesa, Lemon Grove, National City, Oceanside, Poway, San Diego, San Marcos, Santee, Solana Beach, Vista
- Misconduct or wrongdoing in their official capacities by officials or employees of the County of San Diego, cities, school districts, or special districts, such as water, sewer, etc. within San Diego County.
- Government waste or inefficiencies by the County of San Diego or a city or special district within the County of San Diego.
- Failure of the County of San Diego or a city or special district to provide essential public services.

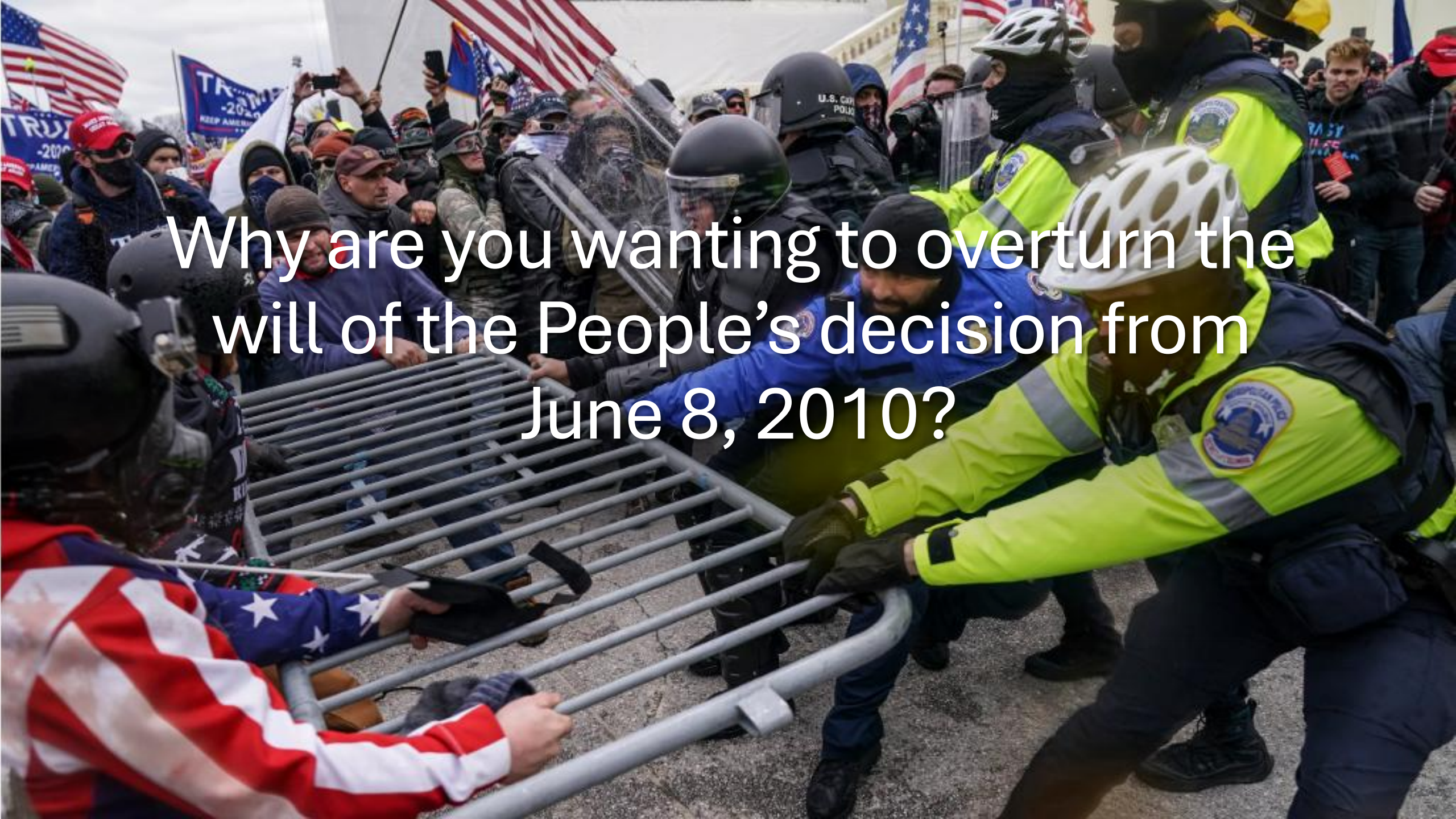

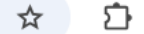

## Summary: H.J.Res.29 — 119th Congress (2025-2026)

### Shown Here: Introduced in House (01/23/2025)

This joint resolution proposes a constitutional amendment to increase the number of times a person may be elected President.

The proposed amendment specifies that no person shall be elected to the office of the President (1) more than three times, (2) for any additional term after being elected to two consecutive terms, or (3) more than twice after having served as President for more than two years of a term to which some other person was elected President (for example, if a President died after serving for one year and the Vice President became President for the remaining three years of the term, that person may subsequently be elected President no more than two times).

Currently, under the Twenty-Second Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, a person may not be elected President more than twice. Additionally, no person who has been President, or acted as President, for more than two years of a term to which some other person was elected President may be elected President more than once.
