





The phrasing of single source contract with Sharp for anything mental health related does not sit well with me. I went to a sharp hospital in crisis in April and paid \$2k for blood work and a virtual therapy appointment. I would've been better off calling the suicide hotline for free. I went back a few months later following a domestic incident and told 3-4 staff members what happened and they wrote completely incorrect statements in my medical records saying that I broke my finger walking my dog. They said I couldn't have water. They clearly didn't even look to see that my prior record from April referenced domestic issues. Being "treated" at Sharp left me feeling worthless. So I hope you are doing your research and looking for more resources who can support San Diegans in crisis other than Sharp. Thank you.
