Re-22. COMMUNITY RESPONSE AND RECOVERY: STRENGTHENING OUR REGIONAL CAPABILITIES IN THE FOUR PHASES OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

I think you are putting the cart before the horse on this one. Recommendation 1 is to solicit community input, but then recommendations 2 to 6 ask for various actions, shoring up funding, central fiduciary to co-ordinate the distribution of relief funds, and so on.

Then, Recommendations 7 and 8 call for setting up two new bureaucracies which might not even be wanted or needed.

The Board Letter says the Board received a list of 70 recommendations on June 13, of which 30 have been implemented and 40 remain outstanding. This letter has 8 recommendations. Are there 32 others, or were they combined in some way?

A copy of the June recommendations should have been attached with the completed recommendations checked off.

This proposal needs to be rejected.
