

Overall Sentiment






Overall Sentiment

program, for development of deed-restricted affordable and permanent supportive housing. According to the 2021 Housing Needs Report published by the California Housing Partnership, there is a shortfall of over 132,000 units for low-income households. As a result, 81 percent of very low income households are severely rent burdened. These funds can be used to help address the shortfall.
