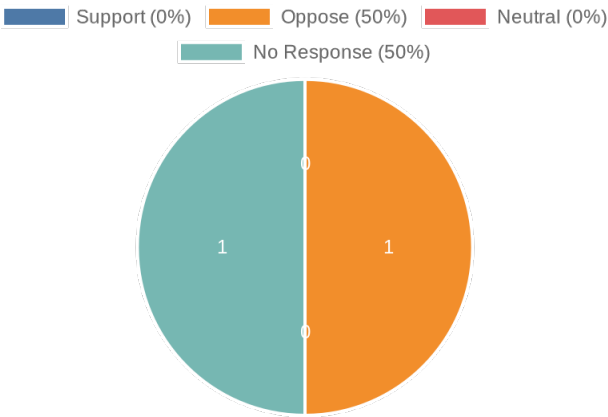

Overall Sentiment

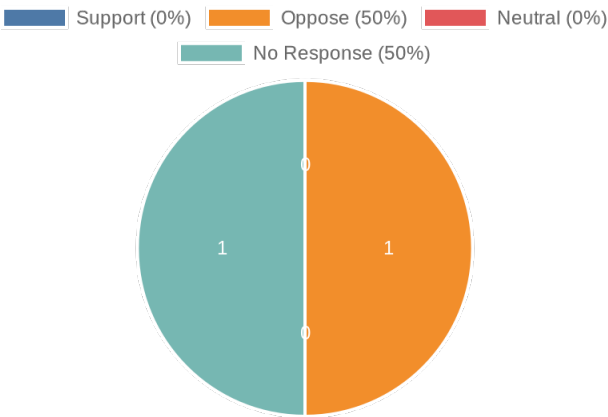

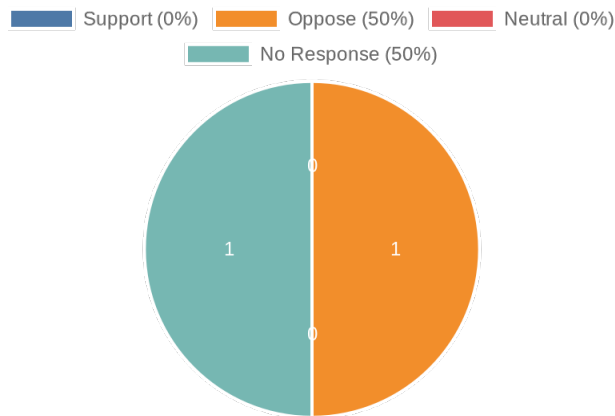

The Sheriff's Board letter is a mockery, dressing up the warehousing of human beings in the language of caring for our community. True community care means housing for the houseless, hospitals for the sick, mental health centers, schools and food banks for those in need. It doesn't matter how "safe, efficient and humane" the Sheriff wants detention facilities to be because jails are not where people should be receiving these services.

We know from decades of evidence that the Sheriff's \$3 billion plan won't work, because costly new infrastructure won't stop deputies from turning down an intercom to ignore cries for help or from deleting video of a person's last hours to hide culpability. Nothing in this proposal changes the culture of abuse and neglect in our jails, it only throws more money into a carceral black hole that already costs SD taxpayers \$3.5 million EVERY DAY.

You have other options besides concentrating more County resources in the hands of the Sheriff. Use them.
