

WHAT IS ASSEMBLY BILL 481

- Requires law enforcement agencies to identify military equipment, its funding, acquisition, and use.
- Requires approval from the local governing body by way of ordinance for the continued use of military equipment acquired prior to May 1, 2022.
- Law enforcement must submit an equipment use policy and make it available on the agency's website at least 30 days before a public hearing.

WHAT'S NEXT

- If the policy is approved, the law enforcement agency must submit an annual report which needs to include:
 - o A summary of how the equipment was used and the purpose of its use
 - o A summary of any complaints or concerns received about the equipment
 - o The results of any internal audits, violations of the military equipment use policy, and any actions taken in response
 - o Any additional acquisitions of equipment
- Within 30 days of submitting the annual military equipment use report in 2023, a law enforcement agency must hold at least one "well-publicized and conveniently located community engagement meeting" to allow for public discussion of the report.
