





What we know now




- 1/20: EO withdrawing from WHO
- 1/27: EO issued temporary grant funding freezes across education, small businesses, infrastructure, and public health projects (NSF & NIH) (BLOCKED 1/28, 2/3)
 - 2/7: But Trump administration then froze NIH submissions to the Federal Register effectively pausing funding for new grants (resumed 2/26).
- 2/7: EO proposed 15% NIH indirect cost cap could lead to a \$448M+ annual loss in San Diego region (temporary blocks: 2/10, 2/21; permanent BLOCK 4/7, appeal likely)
- 2/13: EO establishing President's Make America Healthy Again (MAHA) Commission.
- 3/24: NIH ends funding for climate, gender, DEI research (internal memo)
- 4/1: Layoffs across HHS agencies 10,000 across CDC, NIH, and FDA
- 4/18: NSF terminates hundreds of active research grants San Diego sees nearly \$6M in NSF grants cancelled
- 4/21: Proposed 44% cut to NIH budget; and 66% cut to NSF budget (FY2026)
- 5/30: HHS releases budget summary consolidating NIH's 27 agencies into 8, maintaining 15% cap, and reducing funding by 40%

Uncertainty's long reach

What to watch

- University research model under threat
 - Reduction in startups and university spin offs will lead to gap in 5-10 years
 - STEM talent brain drain
 - Cashflow/targeting
- REprioritization versus DEprioritization
 - Federal staffing and agency reorg
 - State science bans
 - Regulatory changes
 - VC and industry impacts


