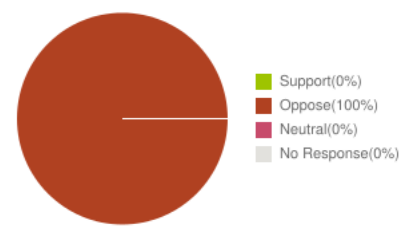

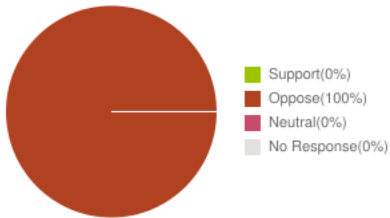

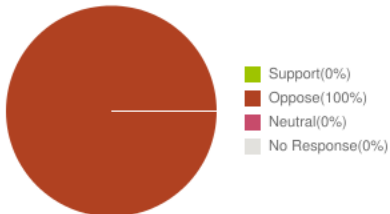
#### Overall Sentiment
