

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ORDERING DISSOLUTION OF SAN DIEGO COUNTYWIDE PERMANENT ROAD DIVISION NO. 1000, ZONE NO. 13A – PALA MESA ZONE A WITHOUT AN ELECTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the County of San Diego (the "County"), on October 28, 1968 (80), Approved the Formation of CSA 13 – Pala Mesa pursuant to the provisions of the County Service Area Law, Chapter 2.2 (commencing with Section 25210.1) of Part 2, Division 2 of Title 3 of the Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the Board, on October 6, 1970 (81), Approved the Formation of CSA 13A – Pala Mesa Zone A pursuant to the provisions of the County Service Area Law, Chapter 2.2 (commencing with Section 25210.1) of Part 2, Division 2 of Title 3 of the Government Code; and

WHEREAS, on June 1, 1982 (110), the Board approved formation of County Service Area 13A – Pala Mesa Zone A for road maintenance services.

WHEREAS, on February 17, 1998 (20) the use of PRD Zones was authorized by the Board of Supervisors as a mechanism for landowners to maintain their private roads; and

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2000 (18), the Board adopted a resolution ordering the dissolution of County Service Areas and Established Permanent Road Division Zones of Benefit and transferred responsibilities of the Community Services Areas and their zones to Countywide Permanent Road Division No. 1000 so that Pala Mesa Zone A is currently formed and operated pursuant to the Permanent Road Division Law, Streets & Highways Code Section 1160 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, Pala Mesa Zone A was formed to provide for the maintenance of streets in the Fallbrook Community by the County using assessment collected from area property owners and those assessments are now inadequate to fully fund continued maintenance by the County; and


WHEREAS, On November 3, 2026, a election was held to impose a special tax to pay for road maintenance, but that special tax failed to pass as it did not received the two-thirds voter approval required by Article XIIC, Section 4, of the California Constitution and Streets and Highways Code Section 1178; and

WHEREAS, without an increased assessment or special tax, the County lacks sufficient funds to provide for ongoing maintenance of the roads in Pala Mesa Zone A.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED, ORDERED AND DETERMINED as follows:

1. The dissolution of San Diego Countywide Permanent Road Division No. 1000, Zone No. 13A – Pala Mesa Zone A is hereby ordered without an election.
2. The Clerk of the Board shall file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Office of the County Assessor-Recorder.
3. The dissolution of San Diego Countywide Permanent Road Division No. 1000, Zone No. 13A – Pala Mesa Zone A shall become effective beginning Fiscal Year 2027–28, July 1, 2027. The existing assessment structure shall remain in place until June 30, 2027, at which point it shall cease and no further annual assessments shall be levied.
